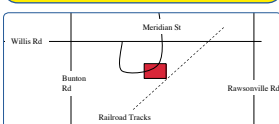

To the residents and property owners of the Charter Township of Van Buren, Wayne County, Michigan, the owners of land within the **HOMESTEAD CONDOMINIUM SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT** and any other interested persons:

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Supervisor, Assessing Officer, and Department of Public Services of the Township has reported to the Township Board and filed in the Office of the Township Clerk for public examination a special assessment roll covering all affected properties within the **HOMESTEAD CONDOMINIUM (MAP ATTACHED)** that are benefited by the proposed rehabilitation and improvement of **Sadie Lane, Anna Drive, Sophie Road, Maude Court, Rebecca Court, and Florence Lane** based upon the recommendation and cost estimates of the Allied Construction ("General Contractor") and supplemental calculations provided by the Homestead Condominiums which equate to a total estimated cost of \$1,686,710.00. Said assessment roll has been prepared for the purpose of assessing a portion of the costs of the rehabilitation and improvement of Sadie Lane, Anna Drive, Sophie Road, Maude Court, Rebecca Court, and Florence Lane per recommendation and cost estimates of the General Contractor and costs incidental thereto within the special assessment district as detailed on the plans of the General Contractor which are on file with the Township Clerk at the Township Hall, 46425 Tyler Road, Van Buren Township, Michigan. **The proposed total assessment for each tax parcel is \$6,701.31, which may be paid by property owners in up to five (5) annual installments of \$1,340.26 each, which includes 2.0% annual interest.** If at any time during the term of the special assessment district an actual incremental cost increase exceeds the estimate therefor by 10% or more, additional notice shall be given a hearing afforded to the record owners of property to be assessed.

## Court Watching

### Illegal alien kills two with vehicle, nabbed with help of drone

David Armando Palacios-Sanchez, 44, of Detroit was arraigned on seven charges at 34<sup>th</sup> District Court following the May 28 accident in Sumpter Township that killed one woman and seriously injured another.



He was video-arraigned May 31 by Magistrate Al Hindman while in custody at the Huron Township Police Department. A Spanish interpreter assisted at the arraignment.

The second victim died June 1, so the charges will be updated at the next court session, according to Sumpter police.

Sumpter Township Police Sgt. Bart Devos told the court that his department had just learned that U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) records indicate the defendant is in the U.S. illegally. He is considered a flight risk and police asked that he be remanded without bond.

The defendant was charged with:

- Operating while intoxicated causing death;
- Reckless driving causing death;
- Operating while intoxicated causing serious injury;
- Reckless driving causing serious impairment of body function;
- Failing to stop at the scene of an accident resulting in serious impairment/death;
- Failing to stop at the scene of an accident resulting in serious impairment/death; and
- Possession of controlled substance (narcotic or cocaine) less than 25 grams.

Magistrate Hindman set \$500,000 cash bond and Palacios-Sanchez is being held in the Wayne County Jail. His probable cause conference is June 14. If he manages to post his bond, he must not be released without a GPS tether, Hindman said.

A 49-year-old woman, identified as Reyna Martinez-Hernandez from Rockford, IL, was walking northbound on the east shoulder of Sumpter Road, south of Willow Road, after leaving a big party on May 28 with a 36-year-old woman from Plainfield, NJ.

According to police, Palacios-Sanchez recklessly pulled out of the same party, heading north while driving erratically and struck one woman. He then hit Martinez-Hernandez who was pinned beneath the vehicle and pronounced dead at the scene.

Gary Zimmer of Southgate called me to tell me a story that touched his heart and he wanted to share. Gary said he listens to his police scanner and he has a 12-foot antenna on his roof. He said can hear reports all the way to Lansing and Port Huron.

He said on Memorial Day he heard what he thought was a park ranger on horseback in a park almost to the Monroe County line. The ranger reported on the radio that he heard a little girl on horseback crying. She was under the age of 10, he said.

She was with two other girls on horseback and they were about 16 and 17 years old. The little one was crying because they didn't know how to get back home and it was dark.

The ranger said she was scared and he calmed them all down by promising to help them find the trail to take them home.

They told him they lived in Belleville and got on a trail in the Lower Huron Clinton Metropark there. They rode for three hours and then didn't know where they were, but they were at least on the other side of Michigan Memorial Cemetery.

The ranger found their trail, but because



it was about 9:45 p.m. by then, he decided to guide them all the way home. He communicated on the radio as he went along and talked with the girls to keep them calm.

He also kept in contact with another ranger who was waiting to find out where the girls lived so he could bring a trailer for the pickup of the first ranger and his horse. The second ranger said he was waiting outside the park gate with the trailer.

That call came at almost midnight. The ranger with the girls said they were putting the horses in the barn at their farm and they were safe at home.

Gary said he went to bed at midnight after listening to the conversation between the rangers on the scanner. He thought the rangers should be congratulated for watching over the safety of the lost girls.

He said he called Huron Township police the next day and they didn't know what he was talking about. I called the park offices at Oakwood and Willow Metroparks and they didn't know about it, either. They said they didn't think any of their park officers were on horseback that day.

They also said they weren't supposed to speak with the press and I should call the media relations person at the HCMA main office. I have yet to get a return call from her.

It's a nice story that Gary heard unfold on the scanner. But it seems to be a big secret, otherwise.

One of the bills to be paid at Tuesday's regular meeting of the Van Buren Township Board of Trustees was for \$790 to Geese Chasers of SE Michigan for work at French Landing Park.

# Belleville City Council approves more changes for Lake Fest activities

Scott Jones, representing the Belleville Yacht Club, asked the city council at its Monday meeting for use of Horizon Park on June 24 and 25.

The council approved the BYC's plan to put up two sets of bleachers facing the water plus a small tent for the judges, just past the gazebo. The council approved everything asked for, including closing Hillside Cemetery for the races.

Jones said the BYC got a Department of Natural Resources permit to shut down Belleville Lake for the two days of the BYC's "Thrill in the 'Ville" hydroplane races during Lakefest.

He said the course is a mile-long loop between Horizon Park and Hillside Cemetery and the fastest class of boats will go 125 mph.

Jones said the lake will be shut down from noon to 5 p.m. on those two days, with three pauses in the activities for local boaters to get through.

He said there will be seven law enforcement boats present and a dive team.

Jones said they will have another two sets of bleachers on the Denton Road Bridge causeway.

Acting City Manager Steve Jones said in order to keep people from walking on the graves or damaging headstones, they need Hillside Cemetery to be closed from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on those two days.

He said they would use the *Independent*, post it on the city website, and other means to alert the public. Mayor Kerreen Conley said it should also be posted at the

cemetery.

In other business at Monday's regular meeting, the council:

- Learned there were 18 applicants for the job of city manager and the council will whittle that down to their favorite five or six each and then those candidates will be asked to fill out questionnaires before they are interviewed in person publicly starting at 6 p.m., Tuesday, June 13. If some can't come in person from out of state, a zoom interview may be allowed, Mayor Conley said. She said she was in favor of choosing the city manager first of the two needing to be replaced because the city manager is the one who selects the police chief. "If we don't act quickly, we lose them," Councilwoman Kelly Bates said of the top candidates;

- Held a public hearing on the 2023-24 city budget and then approved it as presented, along with the amended 2022-23 budget. The amended budget included a contribution from the general fund of \$27,000 to the cemetery fund to prevent the cemetery fund from being in deficit. Also the budgeted expenditures were less than projected by \$121,500, mainly due to legal fees being less than budgeted;

- Approved the same millage rate as last year for the 2023-24 fiscal year: 15.9353 mills. There is no Headlee Rollback this year;

- Learned the city fee schedule is being updated and will be presented at a future meeting for approval;

- Approved Cadillac Asphalt for the repaving of the road in Hillside Cemetery, as recommended by Hennessey Engineers.

There were three bidders and Cadillac was the lowest at \$216,700.99. Best was at \$237,065 and Anglin at \$248,085. There are some private donations for the project and so final action on the city's cost will be presented at an upcoming meeting. Councilman Beebe asked about a contingency of 10% and Acting City Manager Jones said that will have to be added, which is the city's responsibility. The work includes pulverizing the existing ¾ mile roadway and using it as a base for the 3" depth paving of new asphalt;

- Approved Social District Permits for

Baan Phadthai, 528 Main St., and Gloria Jean Café, 519 Main St., as required by the state for businesses to take part in the local DORA program. DORA allows people to buy a special cup at a participating bar and walk while drinking alcohol over an area of the city from the bridge to the gazebo at Horizon Park and down Main Street to Third Street;

- Extended the goat trim area as recommended by Mayor Pro-Tem Ken Voigt to include the area behind the

- Approved accounts payable of \$81,201.06 and the following departmental purchases in excess of \$500: to Laclede Equipment Inc., \$527.80 for brooms for the street sweeper; to Mueller, \$2,901.24 for remote readers for water meters, \$2,915.89 for water meter reading system maintenance agreement, and \$3,635.52 for remote readers for water meters. Building Official Rick Rutherford explained there were supply chain issues that caused problems with the billings;

- Heard Acting City Manager Jones report that last Friday the city was notified by Van Buren Township that it will not be able to help transport the city's seniors and handicapped. Mayor Conley said they are not willing to expand their services and Jones is looking into options. Jones said data is needed from Jennifer Delano of Wheels for Independence on how many people need rides. Clerk Briana Hootman said they could look over the records from the last few years the SMART bus transported people under Wheels for Independence;

- Heard Planning Commissioner Randy Priest say, "Sidewalks is my middle name" and offer suggestions for improving the sidewalks in the city;

- Heard Therese Antoinelli, president of the chamber of commerce, say she knows the city doesn't have a strong parks and recreation committee, but she was for extending the kayak docks so more people could dock there. Scott Jones said he would give docks to the city that he has available. He said they are the same system, installed by the same company as the city's kayak dock. Jones said they are considered temporary docks so there shouldn't be a problem with getting approval to move them;

- Heard Mike Renaud say he was frustrated by not being able to get the budget on the city's website in order to

study it before the meeting and comment on it at the public hearing. Renaud retired from Ford Motor Co. as a financial officer and often comments on city proposals. Acting City Manager Jones said he would look into it; and

- Thanked Redemption Bible Church, which meets at the Methodist Church, for the 40 people who showed up and cleaned Horizon Park from the gazebo to the rest room. They also stained the wood on the rose arbor. Also thanked was the Rotary Club for their annual clean up of Victory Park.

# Parent tells school board how her daughter's phone was hacked

Racquel Bean, mother of an eighth grader at McBride Middle School, said she has called the FBI twice, the Department of Education and now she wanted to tell the Van Buren Public Schools Board of Education about what happened to her daughter. This was at the May 30 board meeting.

Bean said an individual accessed her daughter's account and School Supt. Pete Kudlak refused her access to talk to the school domain administrator.

On Jan. 9, after winter break, she found someone had her daughter's password.

The mother said the school wouldn't help her, but she worked on her own and found the IP and geographic address and she knows who hacked into her daughter's

information.

"I have undeniable proof," she said, asking the school board members if they wanted the address?

Board president Amy Pearce said it's not for this board to look at this.

"My daughter's privacy and safety were compromised," Bean said.

"I'm not giving you any more information," she said to the board, noting she will call every television channel.

President Pearce showed concern and Bean said she will email something to her.

Bean said her daughter had the same password from second grade and didn't know you should change it, but now the password is changed.

She said she will be sending more information to the FBI.

Also at its May 30 meeting, the school

board:

- Approved the Concrete Replacement project in the amount of \$1,147,009, which includes a contract amount of \$531,649 for Royal Cement Corp. and \$465,750 for Davenport Brothers Construction, along with a project contingency of \$149,610. The majority of the work is at Savage and Tyler schools where 90% of the concrete walkways will be replaced. Edgemont and Rawsonville are getting selective concrete replacement in areas of concern;

- Watched the Kiwanis Club give its Staff Member of the Year award and a check to Cyndi Davis, who is retiring from a 19-year career as special education teacher at Belleville High School;

- Witnessed the Van Buren Education Foundation present a check for \$21,000, which represents \$3,000 to each school, plus checks to brand-new teachers in the elementary schools and the Early Childhood Center. VBEF representative Alicia Pitt said the group usually gives \$500 each to individual teachers for specific projects, but this year it is giving the money to schools for projects; and

- Heard building presentations from the principals and teachers at Tyler Elementary, the Early Childhood Center, and McBride Middle School.

## Wayne County Medical Examiner reports death at library was a suicide

Belleville Acting Police Chief Kris Faull said Friday that the police department received a report from the Wayne County Medical Examiner that determined the death at the Belleville Area District Library on April 21 was a suicide.

Chief Faull said the report also said the cause of death was a stab wound to the neck and the fall from the building.

At about 5:50 p.m., Belleville police and fire were dispatched to the library at 167 Fourth St. on the report of a male down next to the library in a gated area below the second-floor balcony.

Upon arrival, a Belleville fire fighter and police officer found a 41-year-old male, unconscious, and bleeding. Huron Valley Ambulance responded. He was pronounced dead at the scene.

A library video showed the male was in the library several hours before this incident and preliminary evidence indicated he had injuries consistent with a fall or jumping from the second-story balcony of the library.

The male later was identified as Kyle Matthew Taylor, a 42-year-old man who was a resident of Van Buren Township.

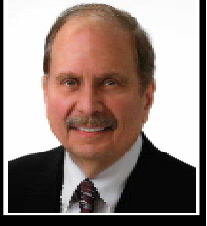

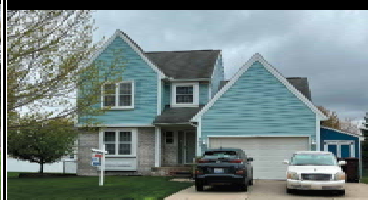

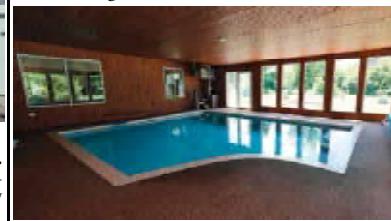
