Palacios-Sanchez bound over in deaths of 2 women in Sumpter

David Armando Palacios-Sanchez, 44, of Detroit waived his preliminary exam in 34th District Court on Aug. 9 so Chief Judge Brian A. Oakley bound him over for trial in Wayne County Circuit Court. His arraignment on the information was set for Aug. 16 at the Frank Murphy Hall of Justice in Detroit. A calendar conference was set for Aug. 23.

Palacios-Sanchez has been held in the Wayne County Jail on \$500,000 cash bond since he was captured and arraigned shortly after the incident.

He was charged with five counts concerning the death of one woman and serious injury of another in a hit and run on May 28 in Sumpter Township. On May 31 two more charges were added: a second count of failure to stop at a personal injury accident and possession of narcotic.

The preliminary exam scheduled for Aug. 9 was changed to a probable cause conference. Two of the charges were amended from "operating while intoxicated causing serious harm" and reckless driving causing serious injuries" to "causing

death" on those two charges after the second woman died of her injuries.

At a June 14 hearing, at which a Spanish interpreter was required, defense attorney Raed Walid Mourad said the defendant has lived in Michigan for 15 years, been married to his wife for 23 years and has four children: a set of 3-year-old twins, a 14-year-old and one who is 19. He has worked in the construction business for the last 23 years, 20 years in one place and for the last three years for Brinker Construction in downtown Detroit. He sought reduction of bond.

The Wayne County Assistant Prosecutor on the case, Sara Bonomo, objected to any reduction in bond, since there were multiple eye witnesses to him revving his engine right before pulling out and hitting the victims and both have died. He admitted to drinking and using cocaine on the day of the incident and fled from the area, she said. Multiple police departments worked to find him, including a K-9 unit and a drone. She said he was a danger to the community and flight risk is high. Bond was not changed.

Belleville City Council approves Fleet Management proposal

Acting City Manager Steve Jones proposed Fleet Management units for five Department of Public Works vehicles at Monday's city council meeting, and DPW Director Rick Rutherford said this was the first he had heard of it.

City Manager Jones said cost is \$50 for installation of each tracking device, for a


total of \$250, plus \$19.95 monitoring the tracking per vehicle, per month. This is from Safety Track.

He said they could put it on the DPW's new pickup and dump trucks and it keeps track of maintenance and tracks the location of each vehicle. He said there's a dashboard to keep track of it all.





Belleville DDA considers paid parking for city's N. Liberty lot

At its regular meeting on Aug. 15, the Belleville Downtown Development Authority discussed putting arms on the North Liberty Street public parking lot to change it into paid parking during festivals and other big events.

DDA chairwoman Alicia McGovern said the idea was discussed at the Economic Development subcommittee meeting recently.

Acting city manager Steve Jones said other communities who have big events use their parking lots to make money. He said the city lot could be turned into a payto-park lot during events and it could raise general revenue for the city or the DDA.

McGovern asked how much it would cost to install two arms, one for the entrance and one for the exit. Jones said he would look into it.

Others pointed out there is an alley with access to the parking lot and that would have to be blocked off from the lot.

Being able to scan cards or pay for an ap was discussed and whether they can run the paid parking or contract it out.

McGovern said they could do this for Winter Fest, Lake Fest, and Booville events in October.

"Perhaps we could start with the larger festival events on certain days," Jones said. DDA member Denise Baker asked about enforcement.

DDA member Valerie Kelley-Bonner said at Chene Park in Detroit, you can put your information on a card and swipe it and it takes your money right off your card. She said it seems to be an honor system, since she's never seen a tow truck.

Jones said he will look at options and report back to the DDA.

DDA member Jennifer Winter said if they put an arm at the exit it would cut the view for pulling out onto North Liberty Street. She said a tree already blocks off the parking area drive.

Jones said the money the parking lot raises could be put towards building a parking structure since more parking is needed downtown.

Vice-chairperson Kelly McWilliams, a member of the subcommittee that suggested the paid parking, said the city parking lot next to Johnny's on the Lake needs maintenance. She asked if the empty lot on the corner of Third and Main, next to Milton's Pharmacy, could be turned into another parking lot.

There was a comment that the empty lot on the east side of Third Street is believed to have a pollution problem, so a parking lot would be a good decision there.

In other business at the 55-minute meeting, the DDA:

- Voted to approve an updated Event Sponsorship form and an updated Façade Grant Application form, with an addition stating that the new maximum amount of \$20,000 of grant/loan would be for eligible expenses only:
- Heard an update on the grant funding request for \$110,000 for park improvements that is still pending. Jones said there was one more step for official approval. Improvements are proposed for Victory and Village parks and include a Pickleball Court;
- Heard Jones say the city is almost ready to go out for bids for the grant-funded upgrading of Victory Station and Victory Park and he is working with the engineers;
- Heard there has still not been a written resignation from DDA member Ivan Ankwatsa, who verbally informed the chairperson in July that he would no longer be coming to meetings because his business was expanding;
- Approved accounts payable expenditures of \$34,984.94, including a check to the Central Business Community to make it whole. The CBC had received just a portion of the money it was promised by the DDA for this year of activities;
- Discussed Jones' statement that the almost \$6,000 paid for light pole repairs reflects the third of fourth time this year that someone has hit the light pole in front of Hayward's. He said they have a plastic globe on that pole now, so it just bounces when it hits the cement. Mayor Kerreen Conley asked Jones to look into moving the pole so it wouldn't be hit so often. Jones said he would look into the cost of moving the pole;
- Learned a dead tree in Victory Park has been removed and the city is working on getting another tree removed in Village Park:
- Heard Mayor Pro-Tem Ken Voigt announce from the audience that on Saturday, Sept. 16, an artwork tour will take place in the city and Van Buren Township. There will be a docent from the Detroit Institute of Arts to discuss the Inside/Out paintings that have been erected around town. He said there will be a cartoon map of the sculptures, fish, and paintings for a self-guided tour. Voigt said it was a project of the Belleville Area Council for the Arts and Van Buren Township.

The next regular meeting of the DDA will be at 6 p.m., Wednesday, Sept. 20.

Michele Mueller of the Michigan Department of Transportation was among those taking part in a public open house at the Belleville High School cafeteria on Aug. 15 to discuss the ongoing environmental study on a proposed connected and automotive vehicle (CAV) corridor project in Wayne and Washtenaw counties. At the forefront of the open house was information on the left (fast) westbound lane of I-94 between Belleville and Rawsonville roads that is being set up as a pilot. Mueller said the lane is marked off with a plastic divider that will push over and pop back up if a driver hits it. Cameras are to be installed soon. That lane can be used by regular traffic when it is not blocked off by barrels and testing is taking place. It was announced later that two lanes westbound will be closed from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. this week to install a safety barrier wall for the shoulder. The goal is to have an express lane in both directions of I-94 between M-10 in downtown Detroit and Ann Arbor/Saline Road in Ann Arbor. The proposal to accommodate driverless vehicles and create the world's most sophisticated roadway is a joint project between Cavnue and MDOT. MDOT hopes to have it in full operation both ways in 2024 or 2025. For more information see michigan.gov/mdot and click on "Initiatives."

Sumpter Township celebrates Rob Young's 35 years as twp. attorney

The Sumpter Township Board of Trustees celebrated Rob Young's 35 years of sitting at the township board table as its township attorney.

This was at the regular meeting on Aug. 8 when board members surprised him with a plaque, a crystal award, a cake with his likeness from 1988 on it, and many accolades. The first 25 minutes of the one-hour-18-minute combined workshop and regular meeting was spent praising Young.

Speakers were township manager Anthony Burdick, Treasurer Bart Patterson, Public Safety Director/Police Chief Eric Luke, Trustees Matthew Oddy and Tim Rush, Supervisor Tim Bowman, and Deputy Clerk Karen Armatis who said he exemplified a long list of positive character traits, which she listed.

Attorney Young said his wife Audrey was present in the front row with their daughter Hillary, who lives in California and was visiting for two weeks. He said they have encouraged him it's time to move on, but he stopped short of saying he would retire.

"I understand why Peggy's not here tonight," he said, referring to Trustee Peggy Morgan who has had differences with Young. Trustee Morgan was absent and excused from that night's meeting.

The workshop stopped long enough for everyone to get a piece of cake to eat and then moved on.

In other business at the meeting the board:

· Heard Burdick report the plan for mowing and grading in the township by Wayne County, that the AFSCME union employee issue was moving into arbitration. a water main emergency at Rawsonville Road having to do with the Rawsonville Road project now under way where 600 to 700 feet is now covered only by 12 inches. that policy manual updates have been given to the Human Resource Committee for review, a proposal to select a company to handle utility billing for the township at a cost of \$8,000 (3,200 bills each quarter), and a proposal to select another real estate firm to list 18 parcels of property owned by the township. Several of these issues are proposed for the Aug. 22 meeting agenda.

Bob Mytych was our special person

He was here at the *Independent* for more than 20 years – and then last weekend we got word he was suddenly gone. We are truly going to miss this special person.

It all started when we saw him at a Sumpter Township meeting where he was being awarded top place in Sumpter's contest to design a special T-shirt for the Country Fest. We asked him if he could draw editorial cartoons for us and he's been doing so for decades.

Bob Mytych also was the Independent's advertising manager. He wrote a business column. He took our newspapers to the post office each Thursday for mail delivery and he delivered newspapers throughout our north coverage area.

He also loved to take pictures and voiced disappointment that the Belleville Bridgewalk was cancelled by a rainstorm for the second year in a row last week. He especially liked to take pictures of those who walked the bridge each year.

He did much more as a kind, honest, decent, giving human being. Bob was there to help whoever needed help. He reached out and offered and carried through with a

He shoveled the walk in front of the office building we share with others although it's not our building. He made sure the coffee maker in the office was full of water and the coffee pods were in their holder. He cleaned the editor's coffee mug each morning. He helped the office manager with lifting and computer woes. He was our friend and we miss him greatly.

EXTRA THINGS I KNOW

We've had more eye-witness accounts of who pulled the pilot and RSO (range safety officer) from Belleville Lake after the MiG-23 crash on Aug. 13. It turns out it wasn't the Van Buren Township lake officer after all because that boat wasn't on the lake at the time. The sheriff's boat was on the lake, but that deputy saw others were pulling the two from the lake after they ejected and so he went to shore to help other first responders.

We've seen interviews with two private citizens who were on the lake watching the Thunder Over Michigan Air Show. Apparently, they were the ones who rescued the two. Although the pilot, who is the owner of the plane, was injured by the ejection, he was back at the scene the next day, wearing a brace, to help those picking up the pieces by identifying the parts they were handling. The parts were taken to Willow Run Airport where the National Transportation Safety Board investigators will comb through everything to find out what caused the crash, so other crashes can be prevented.

According to John Brannen, NTSB senior air safety investigator, the pilot told the FAA that his plane lost power and that's why they ejected. He said it was circling for the second time of three over the air show (with landing after the third time) and then went down and slid 500 feet on the ground. We saw an aerial shot of the path it took on the

The NTSB will comb through everything and issue a preliminary report on its findings within ten days, Brannen said. The full investigation will take about two years. We certainly hope their investigation is recorded and shown in a future television report. It is fascinating to hear what investigators find

after crashes. The whole point is they want

to prevent other like crashes in the future.

Daniel and Michael Newkirk of Split Second Tactical custom leather shop at 436 Main St. in Belleville spent many hours hand-crafting four leather collars for four K-9 officers in Arkansas. They said they really enjoyed crafting the collars and inserting the small badges with the dogs' names on them into the collars.

Daniel said the K-9 handlers across the country must talk to each other at meetings and training sessions because their Belleville shop has had orders for special K-9 collars from about a dozen departments across the country. A police department in New York state is in a hilly area and its collars included trackers, the first they've put on collars, he said.

In Michigan, they've done K-9 collars for the Canton Township PD and Clinton Township PD, among others. Every dog's badge is different in design and size, which makes it interesting, they say. Daniel took the latest batch to the post office to mail to Arkansas on Aug. 10.

For the second year in a row the Belleville Bridgewalk was cancelled due to the heavy rain that blew in and out on Aug. 17. The Taste of Belleville was cancelled this year, as well. Last year, the Taste got to start up again when the rain went away. The Bridgewalk, however, was completely

washed out last year.

Some wanted to try the whole thing again the following Thursday (today), but they decided to just focus on the next community event instead, Harvest Fest.

Leonard and Doreitha Armstrong announce that Labor Day is the last day that Armstrong Funland will be open this season. The miniature golf course is just north of the Belleville Road/Tyler Road intersection.

They hope to open again next year. Doreitha is recovering from several mini-strokes.



police and fire vehicles as well, Acting Police Chief Kris Faull said their cars have GPS. Fire Chief 2 Chris Zweng said their vehicles have reporting software for maintenance, but it's still being made.

Councilman Jeremiah Beebe said all the city assets should be on the same portal and each piece should have someone from that piece overseeing it – a fire department piece, police department piece, and DPW piece.

He suggested starting with the DPW and roll it out from there.

Jones said this would tell them when the vehicles are due for service.

Resident Allen Foulkes, Sr., asked if oil

changes on the few vehicles are something they have to be reminded of. He suggested spending \$3,000 a year might not be something the city needs to do.

Mayor Kerreen Conley said the units also tell where the vehicles are, and Foulkes asked if that had been an issue.

Jones said you can see where the whole fleet is at once.

"A cell phone in a glove box would be cheaper," Foulkes said.

Councilman Tom Fielder made the motion, seconded by Councilwoman Kelly Bates, to authorize the units for the DPW and police fleets and possibly the fire department in the future. This was passed unanimously by those present, with Mayor Pro Tem Ken Voigt absent.

At the end of the meeting, Mayor Conley said she didn't want to hear that "this is the first I've heard of it" comment from any other department director and all proposals affecting departments should be discussed with the director before bringing it to council. There shouldn't be any surprises,

Community with one motion: Monster Mutt Walk on Oct. 21, Harvest Fest with Tractor Parade on Oct. 14, Halloween Downtown on Oct. 31, and Photos with Santa on Dec. 9 and 16, with Santa hopefully in the museum;

- Approved the Belleville Area Council for the Arts' extension of Music Lakeside for two more concerts. The Clockwork Band will be on Aug. 24 and Larry Lee & The Back in the Day Band will be on Aug. 31;
- · Discussed purchase of new police department radios, which was budgeted at \$60,000, but with the addition of a \$2,500 channel encryption key for each radio which will soon be required by the state. Acting Police Chief Kris Faull said the Motorola cost was higher at \$84,247.36 than the Kenwood Radio price, at \$51,931.52, for ten portable prep radios with encryption and four in-car mobile radios with encryption and five-year warranties. She said they are working on grants for assistance with the cost. The police reserves cannot use the old radios because when encryption comes the old radios will be only good as paperweights, Chief Faull said;
 - Approved a letter of understanding

- between the police union and the city on lateral pay to allow the police department to hire experienced officers and pay them according to their experience. Chief Faull said several experienced candidates for the police officer positions open have said they are waiting for this letter of understanding to pass before submitting their applications;
- · Learned the Michigan Municipal Risk Management Authority distributed a total of \$54,062 to the city in excess net assets from the State Pool Retention Fund;
- · Approved Accounts Payable of \$152,189.02 and the following departmental purchases in excess of \$500: to Atchinson Ford, \$47,557.88 for a new pickup truck for the DPW; to Cadillac Asphalt, \$905.85 for road patch; to Mueller Company, \$2,584.06 for remote water meter readers and \$3,826.40 for water meters; and
- Heard Jones say Bob Mytych will be missed because he was so active in the community. Councilman Fielder said Bob was someone who was always there to help. Councilwoman Bates said she didn't know Mytych, but she enjoyed his cartoons, which gave the Independent a light-heartedness. Mayor Conley agreed that Mytych's creativity was always a lot to appreciate.
