# Sumpter man at Burn Center after home explosion

A Sumpter Township man is in the University of Michigan Burn Center after his home at 29170 Martinsville Rd. blew up at about 4:30 p.m. Saturday. The home is completely destroyed.

Fire Chief Rick Brown said the homeowner has burns over 40% of his body including his arms, face, and chest.

He said he was informed by police that the man said he went into the house and it exploded. One television report said he had been thrown into the crawl space by the blast. Fire fighters were unable to interview the man because he was being loaded into the ambulance just as the fire department arrived to fight the fire.

He said the windows were blown out to the road, so the fire definitely started inside the house, but there is nothing to go by as far as what started it.

Chief Brown said the foundation had been blown away from the home. He said no natural gas is available in the area and firefighters found the propane turned off. Later, Chief Brown said he learned that the homeowner told a fire fighter in the ambulance that he got up and turned off the propane tank after the explosion.

A neighbor told Channel 2 that the man had lit a cigarette before going into his house.

Michigan Consolidated and DTE came out and couldn't see anything, Chief Brown said.

Chief Brown said it was an LP [propane gas] explosion, but the source is unknown. It probably started in the kitchen, he said citing evidence at the scene. He said he didn't know if there is insurance on the home, but if there is they will be sure to investigate and that will take some digging in the remains of the building.

# Goat Day moved to Saturday because of threatening storms

Goat Day in Belleville had been scheduled for last Sunday, but because of threatening storms, it was rescheduled for Saturday, Aug. 27, from 2 to 5 p.m. at Horizon Park.

Belleville Mayor Pro Tem Ken Voigt, who put the free event together, said they still plan to have a band and food trucks, and to sell t-shirts with a new goat image, which will raise money for the Belleville Food Closet.

Mayor Pro Tem Voigt said the goat that was found dead in a foot of lake water

on Monday morning died of old age and did not drown, as initially believed by the women who found it.

Voigt said the owner of the goats said this one was one of the older goats and he never had a goat die on the job.

Voigt suggested the goat had been dead for several days because it was bloated. He said it probably died on land and rolled down the hill. He said goats can swim and it could easily have gotten out of the water and up the hill.

### Sheriff's Deputy spots smoke at cemetery

Wayne County Sheriff's Deputy Brent Mytych was on patrol on Belleville Lake during Friday's boat parade. He reported that at 7:50 p.m., he observed thick, black smoke coming from Hillside Cemetery on Denton Road and called it in to Van Buren dispatch.

He reported he was unable to determine what was causing the smoke without making landfall. He secured his boat and climbed up the south side of the seawall and observed a golf cart fully engulfed in flames.

He said a 77-year-old male and a 60-year-old female from Van Buren Township were

standing near the golf cart with two small dogs. He cautioned them to move back from the golf cart and they complied.

He said the Belleville Fire Department arrived and extinguished the fire.

Belleville Police Chief Dave Robinson said no one was injured and the fire was due to an electrical issue.

A Belleville Police report stated the golf cart, which was completely destroyed, was a 1993 Yamaha and the couple said they were driving around the cemetery for a sunset cruise, when the golf cart started to smoke from under the seat.

# VBT Environmental Commission meets for first time in 11 months

Norm DeBuck was reelected as chairman and Benjamin Ross as vice chairman at the Aug. 17 meeting of the Van Buren Township Environmental Commission. This was the first meeting of the commission since Sept. 15, 2021.

DeBuck informed the commission, which had full attendance that he usually is gone for the winter and travels in an RV to conventions throughout the country so he won't be able to have the best attendance record

He said there were a lot of things overlooked, he said of the commission's lack of monthly meetings.

The commission decided to have a vice chairman and elected Ross.

Board members didn't know Director of Public Service Larry Luckett, so he introduced himself, saying he holds the position on the commission of staff liaison held by Matt Best at their last meeting.

Director Luckett said he has lived in the township for 12 years, has been married for 33 years and his wife works for Fish & Wildlife, so they have an environmental family. He retired from the City of Detroit where he worked to help get it through bankruptcy.

Others went around the table introducing themselves, as well.

Trustee Donald Boynton said he has lived in the township for 17 years and been involved in township politics for 15 years. He is liaison to the township board.

Director of Planning and Economic Development Dan Power introduced himself briefly.

Chairman DeBuck said he is a sod farmer and longtime member of the commission.

Commissioner Ronald Merritt said he has lived in Country Pond subdivision for 17 years and retired from Ford and then renegotiated his job and went back. He said the late Dave Wilson's work on the commission influenced him to join the Huron River Watershed Council and get involved with the commission.

Commissioner Peter Creal said he was involved with the State of Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE) meeting at the Belleville Yacht Club (BYC) concerning the phosphorus in Belleville Lake from the Huron River and then joined the commission. He has been in VBT for 15 years.

Vice Chairman Ross said he is a retired special education teacher and he and his wife have lived in VBT for ten years.

Commissioner Anthony Gibson is retired from General Motors and has lived in the township since 1970. He said he has been on the commission longer than he can

determine.

In other business at the one-hour-and-12-minute meeting, the commission:

- Noted there is one vacancy on the commission that needs to be filled. Members asked each other to find friends or neighbors interested in the environment and ask them to go to township hall to apply for an appointment, which is made by the township supervisor with the support of the township board;
- Heard Director Power give an update on Wayne Disposal toxic landfill. Power presented an email he had requested from Alex Hurley of US Ecology with updates. Hurley said they are working on the modifications to the liner, as discussed by the commission a year ago, and US Ecology, which owned Wayne Disposal, presented a request to EGLE last November to increase the height of a portion of the existing landfill footprint. That request was presented with its WDI license-renewal application to EGLE and EGLE is reviewing it all. Director Luckett said he plans to take a tour of the landfill to see what it's all about, but there have been no complaints lately. The commission had toured the landfill a year ago. Power said, "This landfill flies under the radar";
- Learned Republic Services became the parent company of US Ecology, including Wayne Disposal as of May 2;
- Heard Commissioner Gibson ask about landfill cells near the asphalt plant had dumpsters sealed with tarp on their property in April-May. Power said he will ask them about it;
- Discussed the situation at Woodland Meadows landfill, owned by Waste Management, where there is EGLEapproved expansion taking place, but

the Wayne County Conservation District has taken legal action because of a rare wetland on the northwest corner of the site that it wants to preserve. Power said there was a six-month pause, but that has expired and there has been no update. Trustee Boynton was asked about the township board approving legal action in partnership with Waste Management on the matter. Boynton said he will be having a meeting on this soon and he will let the Environmental Commission know about it as soon as he can, possibly at the November meeting. Power said he was told it would be the beginning of the year. Boynton said progressions have been made by Waste Management and another company with Waste Management on the wetlands issue;

- Discussed the loss of free trash and recycling pickup in the township in 2025, which was part of a township deal with Waste Management. Gibson said township residents have been spoiled by the curbside pickup of recycling and it will be an issue down the road. Luckett said there should be discussions on how this will be handled. He said there will be a cost associated with it and the township has to try to get the best possible deal because it will be a culture shock. He said VBT Supervisor Kevin McNamara is working on this;
- Discussed the French Landing Park upgrades for Phase II which have just been contracted to Davenport Brothers for repaying, landscaping, and docks. The boardwalk will be in Phase III;
- Heard Power explain that the BYC dock expansion is still an open issue. He said the BYC removed some of the piers that were beyond the setback for the neighbors. He said an application is in process for design of the docks with a possible change to the

zoning ordinance on the size. Power said the township has a 40' limit on the length of docks for nonresidential. "Docks are still an open issue," Power said;

- Learned the Iron Belle Trail is progressing, the Lakewood Shopping Center has no plans for that site yet, there is nothing planned to stop the milfoil growth on the west side of Belleville Lake, and VBT has no plans for a lawsuit on the Wixom plant that polluted the Huron River upstream:
- Heard Chairman DeBuck say there was an offer to buy or lease his family's sod farm to put in a solar farm. He said he was concerned about the contents of solar panels and didn't want to pollute the land for his neighbors. He said the offer wasn't enough money, anyway. Power said the VBT zoning only allows utility grade solar farms in airport and industrial zoning, not places owned by residents;
- Heard the *Independent* report that John Enos, principal of Giffels Webster planning consultants, had told the Sumpter Township Planning Commission at a recent meeting that investors wishing to set up large solar farms target valuable farmland that is already cleared, thus removing farms from production. He said when they pull out, they leave cement and metal rods in the property making the site good for nothing but sheep, not even goats. He suggested the township revisit its ordinance on the subject, the *Independent* reported; and
- Heard Barbara Miller introduce herself as representing the League of Women Voters to sit in on the meeting and then report to the group on its activities. She complimented DeBuck in how he operated the meeting.

# Owen School is behind schedule

At Monday's school board meeting, School Supt. Pete Kudlak announced that the construction work at Owen Intermediate School is behind by three days because DTE had a delay in the electrical hook up. The school was due to get increased electrical power it needed for new technology installed.

He said as of now, this is not affecting teachers. If there is any change in when the students begin, he will communicate it immediately to the families. He said families need to make sure the school district has their proper contact information.

Board vice president Susan Featheringill, who was chairing the meeting in the absence of the president, reminded families that anyone who needs to ride a bus should register for buses. The district will provide transporation, but you have to let it know who you are.

Before the Aug. 8 school board meeting, the board members and the press toured the Owen work site and were assured that with the 70 or so workers present there the building would be ready for classes to start three weeks later.

But, then there was the DTE hold up.

Belleville Mayor Pro-Tem Ken Voigt, a retired Belleville police officer, said although Hillside Cemetery is owned by the city, it is actually located in Van Buren Township.

He said he remembers, years ago, when Belleville police officers were sworn in by Van Buren Township as cemetery police officers

The skies opened up and poured and continued to pour last Thursday, so the annual Belleville Bridge Walk was cancelled. Belleville Councilman Steve Jones was with those waiting at Hayward's under umbrellas for the bridge walk to start. He had the microphone ready for city representatives to invite people onto the bridge.

That didn't happen, but when he got back to Horizon Park to run the public address system for the Taste of Belleville, Rotary Duck Race, and Music Lakeside, he found his laptop and other equipment, which had been left out without cover, full of water and ruined. Lots of water that day and strong winds.

But the heavy rain stopped around 7 p.m. and the crowd at the Taste was the biggest ever and some of the vendors ran out of food to sell. Applebee's, however, had to leave when its food was ruined by the rain.

The Rotary Club decided to have a raffle instead of a duck race in the lake because of

the storm and the winners were announced, but without the PA system it was hard to

All of Jones' sound equipment was ruined and the other equipment for the Music Lakeside concert got too wet and it would have been 8 p.m. before they could dry everything out and get set up at the church. Ken Voigt said this is the only time in 13 years of Music Lakeside that they canceled a concert. He said they ended up paying the band and sending them home.

This was the last Music Lakeside concert of the season.

City Manager/Police Chief Dave Robinson said he would discuss with city council members whether they wanted to reschedule the Belleville Bridge Walk this year

He reported there were no issues over the busy weekend, except the weather.

At the Aug. 16 meeting of the Van Buren Township Board of Trustees, resident Reg Ion told the story of a set of twin fawns that those at township hall were familiar with since they often could be seen in the Tyler Road/Beck Road area.

Ion said on primary election day he was driving his wife's car on Beck Road where he saw on the roadside a dead fawn, young enough to still have the spots on it. He also saw the dead fawn's sister looking on from a distance, obviously wanting to join his

location. They were always together.

He said when a dead fawn's sibling is looking to join him, she is in danger of also being killed by a car, and the mother is not far away, so she too would be in danger. Ion said he picked up the 50-pound fawn, put it in his wife's car, and took it to the VBT police department. He said they came out and looked at it, but nobody would

touch it. Ion said they told him it wasn't in their duties and he had to get rid of it himself.

He said he had been thinking of carrying it inside the police department and dumping it on their floor, but he didn't.

Ion said they finally allowed him to put the fawn into the dumpster behind the police station. He said he had to struggle to get it in there, but he did it alone.

Ion suffered from polio as a child and he has mobility issues, but he didn't back down from what he thought was the right thing to do for the deer.

He suggested the police should reach out and do things beyond their guidelines when something needs to be done.

It was suggested at the township meeting that maybe they should put deer-crossing signs up, since there are so many deer in that area.

Peter Gregory, go shut her down now! This didn't surprise me that this would happen when I wrote the letters. You see, I know I am a servant for the people and I am not afraid to speak out! I am only afraid of not pleasing GOD. So! Here we go again in 2022 after 20 years. Sumpter residents, we can do better than this.

I am the owner of Sheena Barnes BBQ Bones, an operator of this small business in Sumpter Township for over 35 years. Licensed by the State of Michigan with a STFU Special Transit Food Unit for over 20 years in Sumpter Township.

In the year of 2002, Sumpter Township Supervisor Elmer Parraghi had a problem with my food concession business after he used my popularity to get elected for supervisor in 2000. In 2002, my business was shut down and was never issued a ticket or an ordinance violation instead.

The township's attorney Robert Young took my roadside business straight to Circuit Court in front of Wayne County Honorable Judge James J. Rashid, who asked why was she in my court and not the 34th District Court? However, the Honorable Judge later dismissed the case because there are many types of roadsides businesses in Sumpter Township.

Dismissed without prejudice 02-227361 CZ 8/07/2002.

Later on, in the months later it sparked a recall and successfully eliminated Supervisor Elmer Parraghi from his 2002 office. And, my business made the newspapers all over Michigan and Channel 7 and *The Detroit News*, etc. I received a letter from the office of the Wayne County



Clerk on the recall Oct. 31, 2002, since I was the petitioner for the people of Sumpter Township, that a meeting would be held to determine the clarity of the language against the Sumpter Township Supervisor ... MCL 168.952 as amended.

Sheena Barnes BBQ Bones still serves the residents and surrounding communities today in 2022, location 28321 Sumpter Rd. Inspections site inspection by Peter Gregory, Sumpter Township Ordinance Enforcement Officer, and State of Michigan Environmental Health Department, DNR Department of Natural Resources in 2018, and was approved by Sumpter Township.

Later in the same year a board member passed, Clarence Hoffman, township clerk. At that time, I was asked by the board of Sumpter Township would I accept being appointed to a trustee position and I, of course, said yes and served one year. I of course, ran the following year to keep my position. I won the primary but lost the general election. I was still doing my concession business at my property at 28321 Sumpter Rd., while serving on the township board.

My roadside business has been in the same location for nine years and has had yearly State Health Inspections and Current Licensing up until pandemic delays. Now, I've won the primary election for treasurer, beating out the board-appointed Vincent Warren who also had to run to keep his seat.

During my campaign on July 14, 2022. I wrote a heated campaign letter to the community paper, the *Belleville-Area Independent*, speaking about the Sumpter Township administration and their unhinged tactics and nepotism, and spending money and giving big raises, etc. It's sparking anger. I felt that I had been used again for my popularity. I supported candidate Tim Bowman at my Democratic campaign party and endorsed him as a Republican at my place of business with the residents and my customers on Oct. 24, 2020.

The supervisor, on Friday, July 29, 2022, sent Ordinance Enforcement Officer Peter Gregory, to shut down my business without a cause, just verbal shut down. And the officer told him we could not, that he needed to find a reason and he went through the clerk's office. Peter Gregory handed me a letter at 3:40 p.m. Letter stated to whom it may concern: Sheena Barnes BBQ is not in compliance with Sumpter Township because of Section 7-3. License Required. (No person may commence or continue a business within the township without having first obtained a township license therefore as hereafter provided and without

Chief Brown said the man's wife came home an hour after the explosion. She was informed that her husband had been taken to the hospital and left at once. Their two sons were not home.

Chief Brown said there was cosmetic damage on the house next door. The man's mother had told Channel 7 News that her son had hooked up the newly filled propane tanks at both her house next door and his house to get ready for winter. That reportedly was a couple of days before the explosion.

His cousin Jamie Craig told Channel 2 News, "We are very, very fortunate. The only way we can explain it is he truly had an angel. God was walking with him because there's no way he could have made it out of this house."

The man's mother, Vanessa Barrett, told Channel 7 News, "He said that it blew his shoes off him and the only reason the rest of his body wasn't burned was because his clothes were fire retardant. He had just come home from work and he still had his uniform on"

Barrett told Channel 7 the home is insured and they have amazing family support.






