61-year-old Willis man arraigned in hit & run death on service drive

On Friday, 34th District Court Judge Lisa Martin arraigned Kenneth Ray Barrett, 61, a white male of Willis on charges relating to the hit and run death of a 26-year-old black woman whose body was found on the I-94 North Service Drive in Van Buren Township early Wednesday morning, July 27.



VBT Police Chief Hardy Jason Wright said police received a report of a body on the roadway at 12:38 a.m. Wednesday, July 27, about halfway between Rawsonville and Beck roads on the I-94 North Service Drive. It appeared the female had been struck by a vehicle while walking, he said. She was pronounced dead at the scene.

Chief Wright identified the woman as Natia Hardy, but he was not sure of where she was living, possibly Ypsilanti or Sumpter Township. He said they were able to contact her family.

He said police were able to identify the suspected vehicle involved and at 8:47 a.m. that same morning made a traffic stop and took the suspect into custody.

Barrett was charged with two felonies: driving while license suspended / revoked / denied resulting in death and failure to stop at an accident when at fault resulting in death.

He was in custody at Van Buren Township police lockup and arraigned by video. His bond was set at \$50,000/10% as recommended by police and Judge Martin ordered him not to be released without an alcohol tether, also as recommended by police.

It was speculated at the arraignment that it might take Wayne County Sheriff's Department until Monday to be able to

install the alcohol tether on Barrett.

His probable cause conference was set for 8:30 a.m., Aug. 10, by zoom before Judge Tina Brooks Green.

If found guilty he faces up to 15 years in prison for each charge and/or up to \$10,000 fine on each charge.

When the Independent asked if its roadside license plate reader played a part in the apprehension, VBT Deputy Chief Josh Monte replied: "The license plate readers did play a role in pointing us in the right direction, but this case was also the culmination of good detective work by our Detective Bureau, a good crime scene investigation and an experienced patrol officer being at the right place at the right time."

Canton Twp. suspect charged in shooting death of Belleville man

A 21-year-old man has been charged with the murder of a Belleville resident who was fatally shot during a Canton Township road rage dispute, officials said.

Jacor Burch, 21, was arraigned Monday, July 25, on charges of first-degree homicide and felony firearm. If convicted, he faces a maximum penalty of life in prison.

Burch is accused of killing Michael Paul, 37, of Belleville, around 5:18 p.m. June 10 during a road rage dispute along Haggerty Road between Palmer Road and Michigan Avenue, according to authorities.

Officials said they were called to the area

VBT board approves agreement with Wayne Co. for \$4.5 million

At a special, 19-minute meeting Monday, the Van Buren Township Board of Trustees approved the Subrecipient Agreement with Wayne County for \$4.5 million in ARPA funds for the Community Center project.

These are the federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 – State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds being dispersed by the county. The township is seeking Wayne County Commission approval through Oct. 31, 2025.

Wayne County Commissioner Al Haidous was present at the meeting and he praised the successful relationship of the county with Van Buren Township and Supervisor McNamara.

He said now the grant will be voted on in a committee and recommended to the full county commission. He said when McNamara was commissioner he wouldn't settle for less than a 15-0 vote.

"More than eight," McNamara agreed, smiling.

Commissioner Haidous said he estimated it would take about three to four weeks to complete the process because the committee meets every other week. Then it would go to the full commission.

McNamara pointed out that Haidous chairs the committee. McNamara said he was thankful to County Executive Warren Evans and his staff.

McNamara indicated he would attend the committee meeting and Haidous said that wouldn't be necessary but it would be a good thing to thank the commission, to get ready for the next project.

McNamara said they can prepare a Welcome Basket for commissioners with corn from Treasurer Sharry Budd's farm.

He said the township already got a \$3 million grant, but this new grant through Wayne County has a lot more stipulations. He said of the \$350 million total of the ARPA money, there was only \$53 million for community improvement.

"The worst thing you can have is to have the federal government come back and tell you you need to pay the money back," McNamara said.

Haidous related an incident when he was mayor of Wayne when they got \$14 million for the sewage system. He said when they audited it, they said it wasn't used right, technically. Haidous said the city changed

its sewage system and there was no more flooding.

Haidous said the federal representative said he could go to jail. He recalls telling them, "If you put me in jail for fixing my community ... I'll become a hero." He said the request for repayment was finally dropped.

McNamara said with a good attorney a lot of such problems are dismissed.

But, he said, he is warning them that there are catches involved.

He said the money needs to be spent by the end of 2023 and he was corrected that it needs to be spent by the end of 2024.

After the board voted unanimously to approve the agreement with the county, McNamara said to Haidous, "Go get us that grant."

McNamara said he was a little worried a week ago when all they had was a verbal commitment.

At the end of the meeting, Clerk Leon Wright said he had been concerned that people weren't returning their absentee ballots, but they received 700 that day, so he feels they may get close to the usual 90% return for absentee ballots.

He said some wanted to get ballots for shut-ins, earlier that day, and they can't do it that way the day before the election, so he and others had to go out to see them in person. He said one person who was supposedly unable to come into the township hall to vote, jumped off the porch and ran to them when they brought the ballot.

Trustee Reggie Miller was absent from the special meeting.

City Council approves contract with Wayne Co. for \$176,800 from ARPA

On Monday, the Belleville City Council approved a subrecipient agreement with Wayne County for \$176,800 in American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 – State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds for the proposed Victory Station/Victory Park upgrades.

The Victory Station project is expected to cost \$272,000 total, with the city paying 25% and the Downtown Development Authority paying 10%, in addition to the ARPA grant through the county.

The council is asking the Wayne County Commission to approve the Subrecipient Agreement for the funds through Oct. 31, 2025.

City Manager/Police Chief Dave Robinson said the contract was sent to the city's legal counsel and there were no significant problems.

Robinson said the city will have to set a groundbreaking for the "bigwigs" to show

up before work can begin.

After the council, which had a bare quorum, passed the motion to accept the grant, council members thanked Chief Robinson for his work, along with the DDA and Wayne County Commissioner Al Haidous.

Absent from the meeting were Mayor Pro Tem Ken Voigt and Councilwoman Kelly Bates. The two members present -- of the five-member council -- had to wait nine minutes past the council's usual starting time for the meeting to begin because Councilman Steve Jones was working at the car show on Main Street and had to be summoned to the meeting so it could begin. Jones arrived and the meeting began at 7:39 p.m. Voigt arrived at 7:49 p.m., just before the meeting was set to adjourn.

The ARPA grant was the only business item on the agenda.

Goat Day

Voigt however added an item to the

agenda proposing the council sponsor a Goat Day from 2-5 p.m. Sunday, Aug. 21, at Horizon Park. The council voted to sponsor the event.

He said this was planned while the leased goats are there trimming the lake banks. He said 4-H youth would do an education component and bring their goats on leads. People could pet their goats and have pictures taken with them and the youth would answer questions.

Voigt said they will have a band and one or two food trucks. He said he talked to Pastor Robert White at Grace Baptist across the street from the park and Pastor White was fine with the idea since this would be after church services.

Voigt said they will sell Belleville Goat t-shirts to benefit the food closet at no cost to the city. He asked that High Street be closed from 1-6 p.m. that day.

The leased goats are now scheduled to start their shore munching on Aug. 15 and

stay two weeks.

Mayor Kerreen Conley said there is no alcohol in the park on Sunday and those who are expecting the DORA [Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area] rules for this event may be disappointed. She said the no-alcohol rule on Sundays was instituted out of respect for Pastor White.

It was asked if the no-alcohol rule will be enforced and Chief Robinson said he would bring the Reserve Police Officers out. Fire fighter Chris Zweng said they will bring a fire truck out, as well.

Voigt explained he was late for the meeting because of a pet emergency.

Also, at Monday's meeting, the council:

- Heard Chief Robinson announce that the city received petitions last Friday for a ballot question for the November election concerning approval of selling medical marijuana in a dispensary, such as the one being prepared on Savage Road. He

Van Buren Twp., City of Belleville get ARPA contracts

On Monday, both Van Buren Township and the City of Belleville approved signing individual agreements with Wayne County as a step to getting federal funds available to them. These are the ARPA funds: American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 – State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds.

Van Buren Township previously was alerted by Supervisor McNamara that \$4.5 million was coming. He quoted a verbal commitment by county officials and said as soon as the agreement was available he would set a special meeting to sign it.

He got the agreement and on Monday the special meeting was held to sign it, with that the only business item on the agenda. The regular VBT meeting Aug. 2 had been cancelled due to the election.

These funds will be used for the Community Center construction and upgrade of the Senior Center, a project that grew from \$7 million to almost \$17 million. ARPA will help a lot.

Belleville, too, had been alerted that its ARPA funds were coming and the council approved signing the agreement with the county on Monday. This is for \$176,800 to upgrade Victory Station and exterior landscape items in the park. That total project is \$272,000, so ARPA is needed.

The final step for the grants is for the county commission's subcommittee to recommend the grants to the commission and for the commission to approve them.

EXTRA THINGS I KNOW

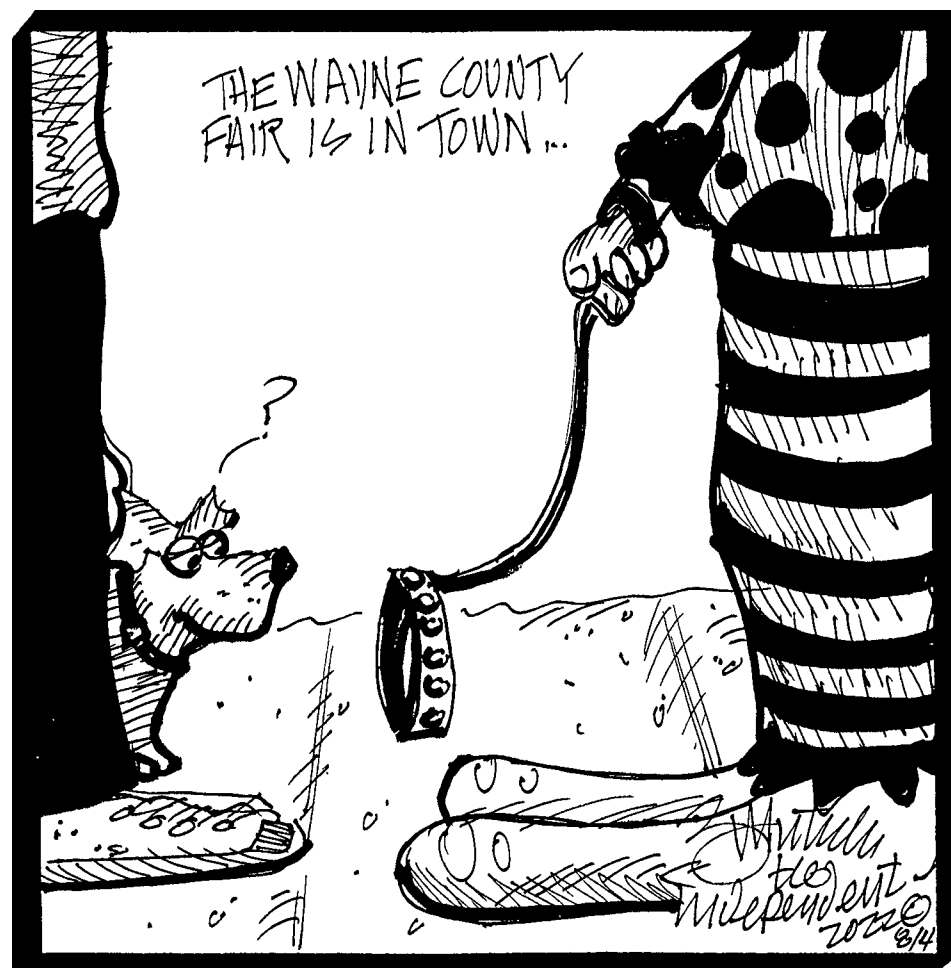

Everyone wisely advises us to *never* open an incoming e-mail if you do not *positively* know the sender! This advice is a must! Note, especially to we-Senior Citizens: We are notably *more* trusting and far *less* familiar with today's current devious methods. Just sign me as HOOKED."

A Van Buren Township reader brought in the recording of a call he got on his cell phone from "Roberta" at Capital One. She said she works in the underwriting department and could authorize reduction of interest on his credit card. He was directed to call 1-800-611-0051 so she could get more information for the discount. He had to do it within three business days.

He tells me he's never had a Capital One card. He said he is concerned that some people might get calls like this and answer them to get lower interest rates and then be scammed. He said he may report it to the Van Buren Police. They won't be able to stop such calls, but at least they know what residents are getting on their phones.

We Googled the number and found a lot of other people had received scam calls from "Roberta."



Another reader from Van Buren Township said he was amused to see that Congresswoman Debbie Dingell was the only person to be wearing a mask in last week's front-page picture. It was an outdoor event. Maybe in Washington, D.C. there is more mask-wearing than here.

10,000th truck brings contaminated materials

Hello from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Buffalo District:

Today [July 20] the 10,000th truck left the Luckey Formerly Utilized Sites Remedial Action Program (FUSRAP) Site loaded with material contaminated with beryllium, radium-226, thorium-230, uranium-234, uranium-238, and lead, making the site cleanup very near 60% complete.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Buffalo District began shipping FUSRAP-related material from the Luckey Site in June 2018. Over 1,450,000 truck miles have been travelled, safely transporting 149,758 tons of contaminated material off-site for disposal in Belleville, MI. This distance is the equivalent of 58 trips around the Earth at the equator.

Each truckload averages approximately 17 tons of material and typically 70 truckloads leave the site each week. Since the cleanup contract was awarded in 2015, the Corps of Engineers' contractors have worked over 533,771 hours without a lost-time accident.

Our top priorities during the cleanup continue to be the protection of human health and the environment and the safety of both the community and the workforce. This is a major milestone for the team's safe execution of the FUSRAP mission at Luckey Site.

Library staff members get active shooter response training

Although it is not something it wants to contemplate, three members the Belleville Area District Library staff recently took two full days of active shooter response training.

Mary Jo Suchy, library director, reported to the library board at its regular July 12 meeting that the training was very informative.

Later, Director Suchy told the *Independent* that the ALICE training was provided by Navigate360, a company who provides this training for schools, law enforcement agencies, and businesses.

She said Belleville Police Chief Dave Robinson spoke to the library staff at an in-service training day held in April, and he recommended the ALICE program to the library. ALICE stands for Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate.

"The focus is on how to be aware, act, and communicate as quickly and clearly as possible during an active shooter situation," she said. "Hands-on training was provided on best practices for responding to a shooter including when and how to evacuate, lock down, and/or to counter a shooter. I and two of my staff are now certified to teach this to our other staff members."

The Van Buren Public Schools hosted the in-person sessions and the ALICE staff took care of everything, said Debbie McWilliams, administrative assistant to the superintendent.

In other business at the 35-minute July 12 meeting the library board:

- Unanimously approved paying invoice #48 to O'Neal Construction with the architect, library director, and building

committee to review and make the final decision for payment at its next meeting;

- Was informed the library is now the owner of a new shop vac after the new humification system sprung a leak on the second floor and made a big mess. Suchy said water seemed to be flowing uphill and they are trying to get that solved. She said everything is turned off now;

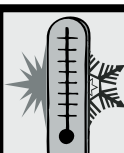
- Heard Suchy report that the architect and builder have come up with a new plan to solve the problem of the meeting room door entry. The electrician is still trying to find a lens for the flagpole light. A computer chip was replaced to solve the problem of the children's portal lighting and a wet seal was applied to the upper portion of the curtain wall and so far there have been no leaks;

- Learned for the fiscal year (July-June)

1,806 items have been checked out at the library branch in Sumpter Township, 617 people have visited, 136 reference questions have been answered and 250 people used the computers. During the fiscal year for the main library in downtown Belleville, 239,379 items have

been checked out, 97,607 people have visited, 16,629 reference questions have been answered, 10,237 adults have used the internet, and 1,300 youth/teens have used the internet. There were 1,236 adult programs and 4,408 children programs;

Haidous asks Sumpter to cut down on \$6.2 million ‘sidewalk’ project

Wayne County Commissioner Al Haidous asked the Sumpter Township Board of Trustees to cut back its request for \$6.2 million in federal money through the county for “sidewalks.”

He referred to the proposed walking/biking trail along Sumpter Road from the city of Belleville to Crosswinds Marsh and east and west along Bemis Road.

At the Sumpter board’s workshop on

July 12, Commissioner Haidous said if the township could reduce the project to \$2.3 million with a township contribution of \$500,000, up from the previous contribution of \$250,000, the county would be more amenable.

Haidous also said the county didn’t have enough people to cut grass along the township ditches so it signed two or three companies to help the county cut three townships in his district.

“In a month or two we can do catchup,” he said. He said people have called and some said they can’t get out of their driveways.

Haidous said he wants to see more projects and, “We have lots of money and hate to see it go back to the federal government if

not used.”

Trustee Matt Oddy asked if the township could submit an amended plan for \$2.3 million and Haidous said the township could amend the project or change the project.

“I could discuss it with the administration ... make it more reachable than before,” Haidous said, referring to the Wayne County administration.

Trustee Oddy said they didn’t vet the original project through public hearings and maybe they could change the project to what can be done with available funds.

Resident Mary Ban questioned Haidous about fixing traffic problems on Rawsonville Road and at the Martz and

E. Huron River Drive crossings and he said he would discuss it with Washtenaw County and Van Buren Township.

Trustee Peggy Morgan asked him if he could slow down the speed on Rawsonville Road where it is 50 or 55 mph. She said if you go any slower, “They’ll mow you down.”

Ban said growth is great in Sumpter Township, agreeing with Trustee Morgan that the speed is too high.

Haidous said slowing down traffic creates jams and jams create accidents, according to the state.

after a traffic altercation led to gunfire. Paul had been shot multiple times, and later died from his injuries, police said.

Burch fled north on Haggerty Road in a gray 2013-2017 Chevrolet Equinox, authorities said. A second vehicle linked to the incident was described as a newer-model white Dodge Ram pickup truck.

Maria Phillips, 33, was arrested June 16 and arraigned on a charge of accessory after the fact to a felony. She is being held at the Wayne County Jail on a \$500,000 cash bond.

Officials arrested Burch on July 7 in Illinois, and he was extradited back to Michigan.

He is being held at the Wayne County Jail without bond. The next court appearance is scheduled for Aug. 5 at 35th District Court.

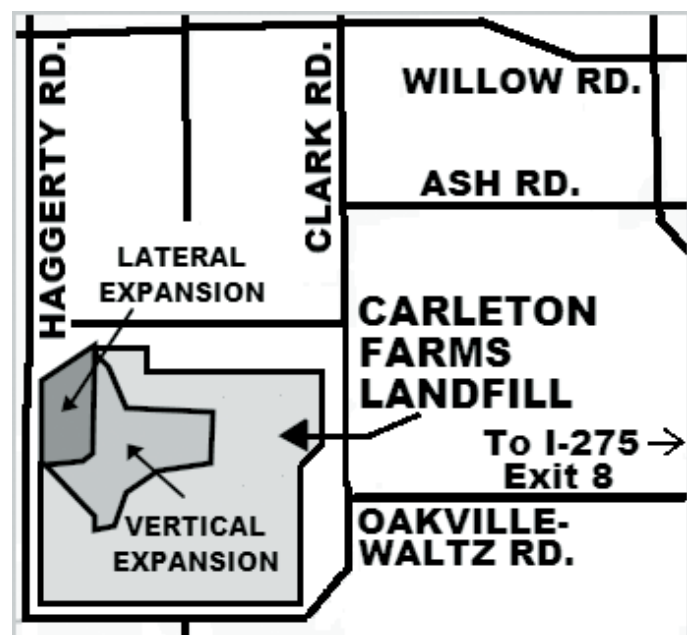

The Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE) has received a construction permit application from Republic Services, Inc. for a lateral and vertical expansion to the existing Carleton Farms Landfill located at 28800 Clark Road, Sumpter Township, Wayne County, Michigan. This notice is being issued pursuant to MCL 324.11510(2)(b) to provide for a public review and comment period for the application.

The applicant is proposing a lateral and vertical expansion to the northwestern corner of the currently permitted area. The proposed lateral expansions would encompass an area of 44.48 acres in the northwest portion of the property. The proposed vertical expansion would cover an area of 128.25 acres overlying previously permitted areas in the northwestern quadrant of the landfill. The proposal, if approved, would extend the projected life of the landfill by approximately 10 years. The location of Carleton Farms Landfill is shown on the map below.



EGLE may hold a public hearing in the vicinity of the proposed disposal area if a request for a hearing is submitted in writing by the applicant or a municipality or if a petition containing a number of signatures equaling at least 10 percent of the registered voters of the municipality where the landfill is located who voted in the last gubernatorial election is submitted to EGLE. Such a petition shall be validated by the Clerk of Sumpter Township. Requests for public hearings must be submitted to EGLE by September 6, 2022.

The application package may be reviewed at EGLE's Warren District Office (address below) by scheduling an appointment with the secretary (call 586-606-2344). Copies of the application documents may be ordered for the cost of reproduction and mailing.
