McLean resigns as Belleville Deputy Administrator

On Thursday, Sept. 1, Tim McLean resigned from his position as the Deputy Administrator of the City of Belleville.

City Manager/Police Chief Dave Robinson accepted his resignation and the position was immediately vacated.

City Manager Robinson said he is in the process of restructuring this position to best fit the needs of both the city and the Downtown Development Authority. A job posting will be coming soon, he said.

Belleville Chamber of Commerce hires Martha Hanoian

Martha Hanoian of Brownstown Township has been named the new director of the Belleville Area Chamber of Commerce, replacing Michael Kole as head of the chamber.

Her first day on the job was Aug. 29.

Hanoian is known in the community for her work with the Trinity Episcopal Church's Friday Fill Up to provide weekly food for food-insecure households and, along with Gabby Burton, received Rotary District 6400's Peace Chain Award in 2021.

She ran unsuccessfully for the Van Buren Public Schools Board of Education when her family lived in Van Buren Township. She holds a bachelor's degree from Adrian College.

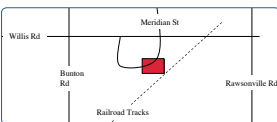

Court Watching:

Parchman now in hospital room at the jail healing from 7 wounds

On Aug. 17 the Wayne County Sheriff's Department alerted 34th District Court that Dekenta Reshard Parchman, 30, of Westland was in custody and will be unable to appear on Aug. 18 because he currently had COVID.

Parchman was due to appear virtually for arraignment/pretrial on a charge of threats from a July 6, 2020 incident in Romulus. This was in addition to the five felonies he was charged with in Van Buren Township for the torture of a woman in Parkwood Apartments on July 23.

Earlier on Aug. 17, Parchman was brought to 34th District Court from a hospital where he was waiting for surgery for his gunshot wounds incurred in a shootout in Inkster before he was arrested on the Van Buren Township charges.

He was due for his probable cause conference before Judge Green for five felonies involving the assault on the woman in Parkwood Apartments, stealing her car, and assault with a dangerous weapon.

His attorney Lauren Anderson said she needed discovery and Judge Green adjourned the probable cause conference to Aug. 24.

On Aug. 24, the court was advised that Parchman now was in a nursing home receiving medical care. His attorney said it has been very hard to find him in the jail system right now. The jail told the court they don't have him, but he still is in county custody.

Judge Martin adjourned his probable cause conference until Aug. 31 to see if they can find him and get him to court virtually.

The court said they will send an order to the county for his presence on that day and

the county jail will send it on to wherever he is.

But, on Aug. 31, the court was advised that he was in a hospital room at the jail and his appearance was waived.

Prosecutor Sona Movsisyan said she had three witnesses and was a nurse who conducted the scene but needs two weeks' notice to be present at court. She would need a "medical exception" for the nurse's testimony, she said. The live preliminary exam was set for Monday, Sept. 19.

Carlos Stephan Wells-Caddell

Carlos Stephan Wells-Caddell, 37, of Van Buren Township was arraigned by Judge Green on April 6. His probable cause conference was held April 27 on charges of controlled substance-second (double penalty), possession of firearms by felon, felony firearm, possession of ammunition by a felon on July 22, 2021. Charges were brought by Western Wayne Narcotics. His live, preliminary exam was set for July 20, but on that date the court was advised that a necessary witness was unavailable because of medical issues. The live exam was adjourned to Aug. 17. Wells-Caddell is free on \$10,000 personal bond.

On Aug. 17, the defendant waived his preliminary exam and he was bound over to circuit court for an Aug. 31 arraignment on the information.

Andrew Enrique Tuomi-Galindez

Andrew Enrique Tuomi-Galindez, 24, of Canton Township, is charged with four counts of uttering and publishing in Sumpter Township on Nov. 18, 2020. His probable cause conference was June 29 and his live preliminary exam was set for July 6. Through a mistake in the prosecutor's office, the witnesses were subpoenaed to come by zoom to the live examination, so

the exam was adjourned to Aug. 17. He is free on \$5,000 personal bond.

On Aug. 17, his defense attorney John Goldpaugh called at noon to say he was still in another court and wouldn't be on time 34th for the 11:30 a.m. exam. He told the court he'd be there in 25 minutes, then he said it would be 1 p.m.

Judge Green said she was outraged that he would treat the court this way since there were other cases on the docket. She required him to come into court, while she adjourned the exam until 11:30 a.m., Sept. 21. There were three witnesses that had been waiting to testify and they were finally released. Also, the defendant left before Goldpaugh could arrive.

"This is not acceptable," Judge Green said, noting the date was set in July.

Danielle Cooper Spry

Danielle Cooper Spry of North Port, FL, was charged with receiving and concealing a stolen vehicle on June 4 in Van Buren Township. Her probable cause conference was set for June 15 and then reset for June 29. Then for July 6. On July 6 a live exam was set for Aug. 17. She is free on \$5,000 personal bond.

On Aug. 17, she waived her preliminary exam and was bound over to circuit court for an Aug. 31 arraignment on the information. A calendar conference was set for Sept. 30.

Carl Emerson Travis

Carl Emerson Travis, 51, of Grosse Pointe, was due before Judge Green on Aug. 17 by zoom from the Wayne County Jail for a probable cause conference on six felony charges surrounding the attempted kidnapping of his ex-wife from Waverly Apartments on Aug. 5 and the subsequent 26-mile chase into Detroit by VBT police officers, Romulus police, and Michigan

State Police. After crashing and fleeing, Travis was arrested.

His defense attorney Kendrick Riggins said he needed discovery so the probable cause conference was adjourned until Aug. 24. Riggins also asked for a reduction in bond for his client, which was \$500,000/10%, but the prosecutor objected, saying Travis has a history of fleeing police -- four times. Riggins said Travis cares for two children who now are in the care of his sister, owns a construction firm, and is active in his church. Judge Green referred the bond recommendation to pretrial services.

On Aug. 24 he was present by zoom from the Wayne County Jail and his in-person preliminary exam was set for 9 a.m., Sept. 12, before Judge Martin. The recommendation from pretrial services had not arrived and Riggins asked about it. Judge Martin said if it came in before the exam date, they could come back to court to review it.

Justin Cleeve Johnson

The preliminary exam for Justin Cleeve Johnson, 20, of Ypsilanti was held before Judge Green on Aug. 10 to face 11 charges surrounding the break-in of the Meijer store in Van Buren Township on June 11.

After the exam, Judge Green dismissed three charges: escape awaiting trial and two safe break-ins and bound him over to circuit court on seven others: two counts of possessing burglary tools, two counts of breaking and entering a building with intent, a count of receiving and concealing stolen property worth between \$1,000 and \$20,000, two counts of larceny in a building, and one false report of a medical or other emergency.

He was scheduled for his arraignment on the information at circuit court on Aug. 24, but that was reset by the court to Sept. 15.

The first responders ran toward the burning buildings while others ran to escape the office structures as smoke billowed and ash was strewn over everyone.

Let's not let Sept. 11 go by this year without remembering – and cherishing our local police, fire, EMTs and hospital staff who are trained for emergencies and standing by to help us when needed.

There was a tremendous surge of patriotism after the attack and our countrymen stood together as one, without division. People signed up for the military to help their country and flags waved in unity.

VFW member Pete Pitzen in Belleville took on the job of providing free American flags to anyone. EXTRA THINGS I KNOW

Many people report they were without power for three days last week following the storm that ripped through the area. A resident of Greenbriar subdivision said their power lines are underground, so she thought the outage wouldn't be long. She was wrong.

Greenbriar property owners are about to finalize the special assessment district that will cost them a lot of money to fix the roadways, but that won't fix the DTE problems.

My landline at home went out after the storm and people who called the number listed in the paper in our editorial box on page 4 said they got just a busy signal every time they called. I called AT&T and a worker came out and climbed up a pole and fixed the problem. That was Saturday. Now, I'm receiving calls at home again.

Vesta Losen, president of the Keystone Academy school board, told me she was featured in an article in the National Heritage Academies newsletter for being on the Keystone board for 20 years.

I remember when she was an elected member of the Van Buren Public Schools Board of Education and she and another board member tried to offer advice on how to improve the education. Sometimes the meetings ran after midnight and the students who were running the video cameras were sent home for the night and their supervisor Reg Ion had to run the camera. There were even arguments and pending fistfights in the audience.

The ideas of Vesta and her fellow board member Tom Bowles were pushed aside and when their terms were over they said



they would start their own school and they did. That's how Keystone got started.

Today, Sept. 8, is the first day of school for this year's classes at Van Buren Public Schools and June 21 is the last day of school. Keystone started Aug. 29 and will end June 9.

After all the fuss about COVID and all the mask-wearing and hand-bumping and three feet away protocols, our community now is being asked to "kiss a fish" and send a picture in for the Belleville Area Council for the Arts' Facebook page.

I saw the promotion for the fish kissing in the *Van Buren Today* magazine that gets mailed to everyone. Couldn't believe my eyes.

The Belleville Area Council for the Arts website explains: "Our Belleville Bass need KISSES. If you see a Bass give it a BIG KISS and send us a pic. We will post it here and exhibit them as one BIG BASS in October."

On Saturday, I was considering the

landscaping at the museum from my vantage point in the drive-through lane at the bank, across Roys Street, when I got to wondering about where the rose bushes were that got planted in honor of Rosie the Riveters.


I remember taking a picture of some real Rosies with the bushes after they were planted. The bushes were a variety of rose developed in honor of the Rosies.

I spotted a rose bush behind the portajohn still at the museum for the workmen. The bush's branches are long and untrimmed, but it looks like a rose bush to me.

I checked the *Independent* files and found our report of the first Rosie the Riveter Floribunda Rosebush Garden in Southeast Michigan that was planted there on June 28, 2018. Present for the occasion were 10 original Rosie the Riveters, Sumpter Township Deputy Supervisor Karen Armatis, Belleville Mayor Kerreen Conley, and Van Buren Township Trustee Sherry Frazier, along with officials from the national Rosies' group, a representative of the Michigan group, and the president of the Indiana group. It was a big deal. Four special bushes.

I went back and got out of my car and found three bushes, some with spent blooms – and lots of weeds. A pile of bricks was where the fourth bush would have been.

Final Double Match Day for food closet is Sat.

To the editor:

This Saturday, Sept. 10, will be the final Double Match Day in the Fall Simply Give Campaign at the Belleville Meijer located at 9701 Belleville Rd. Meijer is partnering with the Emergency Food Closet housed at Belleville First United Methodist Church at 417 Charles St.

If one purchases a \$10 card, Meijer will match with \$20, for a total donation of \$30. The first Double Match Day was Aug. 13. If \$5,000 can be raised locally from these two combined Double Match Days, Meijer will match with \$10,000 for a total of \$15,000.

Since Jan. 1 through Aug. 31, 137 families have been served and 1,402 bags of food have been distributed. Besides receiving a bag of food, each client also receives a choice of meat, dairy product, lunchmeat, a loaf of bread, and a four-roll pack of toilet paper. The month of August has been exceptionally busy with 221 bags distributed and 20 new clients.

The Emergency Food Closet is open on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and serves the residents of Van

Buren and Sumpter townships and the City of Belleville.

The abortion amendment and viability

To the editor:

It is likely that Michigan voters will see an Abortion Constitutional Amendment on the ballot this November. For the following reasons, Michigan voters should reject this measure.

The proposed language indicates that “the state may regulate the provision of abortion care after fetal viability.” “Fetal viability” is later defined as: “the point in pregnancy when... there is a significant likelihood of the fetus’s sustained survival outside the uterus without the application of extraordinary medical measures.” (emphasis added)

If approved, the legislature would be prohibited from regulating abortion in Michigan prior to fetal viability. To many this may sound reasonable. However, viability as defined is a problem.

If the date of viability is pushed to a later stage of gestation by the qualifications of “likelihood of survival” and “extraordinary measures”, then the legislature’s ability to regulate abortion will be nearly eliminated. Almost all preemies require extraordinary medical measures, and even then, their likelihood of survival is often low. According to the proposal, most preemies then would not be considered viable. In fact, viability would not be until much later in the pregnancy, which in turn would limit the legislature from regulating abortion until the end of pregnancy, or maybe not at all. Because there are many instances where the people of Michigan might be served by regulating the abortion industry, such a definition of viability should not be included in our constitution.

Furthermore, viability itself is a weak and arbitrary reason to decide when to protect a life. Even the SCOTUS agreed that viability is a poor date at which to place the state’s interest. For the following reasons we should not want viability to be used to regulate abortion.

The date of viability varies depending upon the availability of medical care making the status of the fetus dependent upon the woman’s location. And, viability has changed with the advance of medical procedures. Neither of these two conditions has anything

to do with the characteristics of the fetus. Many people in the general population are dependent upon extraordinary medical measures for survival. We don't base the protection of life for others on whether they need extraordinary measures. Why should we do so for a fetus?

"Viable without assistance" is another way of saying "dependent". But many people, including newborns, infants, the elderly, the anesthetized and the infirm are dependent. The protection of life should never be conditional on one's dependency on others.

What used to be "extraordinary medical measures" are becoming common. Prematurely delivered babies are surviving at earlier stages. That the age of survival keeps getting younger should suggest that our test of viability is incorrect.

What qualifies as "a significant likelihood" and why is the likelihood of survival pertinent to the discussion of who is human? What is meant by "sustained survival"? How long does a child have to live to qualify as sustained survival and why is it important to know how long a person is likely to live? Does one's projected date of death make one less human?

The purpose of mentioning viability is to establish a milestone in pregnancy before which the government could not restrict access to abortion. This amendment would place that milestone close to the time of birth, likely making abortion legal up to delivery.

For these reasons, I encourage my fellow Michiganders to oppose this proposal come November.

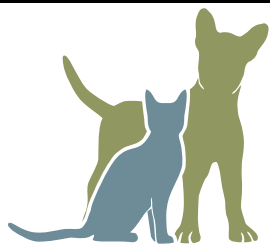

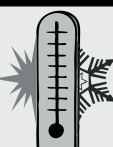
