Final conference in marijuana charge against Po adjourned

School Board names Keith Johnston president on 4-3 vote

In Monday's organizational meeting of the Van Buren Public Schools Board of Education there were four officers to elect and all votes were on secret, 4-3 votes.

School Supt. Peter Kudlak asked board members to nominate candidates for office and then he passed out pieces of paper for each to write down a choice. He then collected the ballots, tallied the votes, and announced the winners.

Trustee Sherry Frazier voiced opposition to the procedure, saying votes have always been open in the past, with board members voicing their preferences openly. But Supt. Kudlak continued.

For president, Bennett nominated Johnston and Pinter nominated Featheringill. Kudlak announced four votes for Johnston and three for Featheringill.

For vice president, Pinter nominated Featheringill and English nominated Bennett. The tally was 4-3 for Bennett.

For secretary, Frazier nominated Featheringill and Owen nominated English. The tally was 4-3 for English.

For treasurer, Bennett nominated Owen and Pinter again nominated Featheringill. The vote was 4-3 for Bennett.

The board then approved Kudlak's recommendation for two regular meetings a month on the second and fourth Mondays at 7 p.m., at the BHS Commons or Administration Building, with work/study sessions set on an as-needed basis. The May 3 meeting will be at 1:30 p.m. at the Administration Building for exit reviews from an accreditation team.

The board also approved the unchanged depository for school funds and authorized investments for school funds for the 2016-17 school year.

The regular meeting followed the organizational meeting and the board:

- · Approved hiring Joelle Laginess as a BHS Spanish teacher, starting Dec. 19, and Zachery Murray as a BHS chemistry teacher as of Jan. 9. Laginess was salutatorian of the BHS class of 2012;
- Approved terminations of two teachers with less than one year service: Nicole Karabouyas left her MMS position for other employment on Nov. 23 and Charles

Nabring, left BHS, as of Dec. 23 for relocation;

- Approved hiring Andrea Hayre as a custodian as of Dec. 12;
- · Volunteered for standing committees being appointed by Kudlak. On the Policy committee are Featheringill, Bennett, and English. On the Health Advisory committee are Frazier and Johnston. On the School Improvement committee are Owen and Pinter:
- · Heard Human Resources Director Abdul Madyun read in full a Family Rights to Privacy and Freedom of Information Act statement. Any parent/guardian wishing to deny the release of directory information concerning their child should contact the superintendent's office for the proper forms
- Heard new Trustee Featheringill say she had questions on check payments and had sent her questions to the superintendent, who got the answers for her. Trustee Frazier said in the spirit of transparency Featheringill should share the information. Featheringill then launched into a lengthy report on more than 15 checks, including two to individuals whose vehicles were hit by school buses.

City OKs building new single-story buildings downtown

The Belleville City Council approved new wording in an amendment to the zoning ordinance that will allow developers to build single-story buildings in the B-2 district downtown.

The vote to approve the wording and send it to the planning consultant to put it in final format was passed unanimously by the council at its Jan. 3 meeting.

The amended ordinance is expected to return to the council agenda on Jan. 17 for the final approval.

Rick Rutherford, director of the city's department of public services, presented a memo to the council that noted the planning commission held a public hearing on the proposed amendment on Dec. 8 and then voted unanimously to send it to the city council for action.

The changes will revise Section 3.1.7-D.2: Building Height along Primary/Secondary Roads by adding an additional category for one-story structures to include the following specifications: 18-foot minimum height, with a 14-foot clear interior ceiling height proceeding at least 15 feet back from the main entrance.

This means a 14-foot interior would have a parapet of at least 4 feet required in the front to make it look taller than it really is.

Planning Commission chairman Steve Jones explained how the ordinance change came to be, following the request of Davenport Brothers to build a one-story office/retail building on the vacant lot at 337 Main Street. Then, the council directed the commission to review the two-story height requirement. The commission set up a three-person subcommittee to look into the requirement and the subcommittee recommended the amendment.

Phil Miller asked from the audience about the retail component of the zoning ordinance that required 50% retail per block. This, too, was a problem for the Davenport building.

Mayor Kerreen Conley and Councilman Tom Fielder said the five-year review of the city's Master Plan is coming up and they decided to make review of the retail requirement a part of the Master Plan.

Miller said he is interested because of his mother's law office at 321 Main Street. He said that if a vacancy occurs there, she would be required to put in retail and it is not possible with the layout of her building.

He said since it would be noncompliant under the new ordinance, "A member of the planning commission said we should just knock it down. I can identify the person, if you want. I'm just telling you to be careful who you appoint [to the planning commission]."

Miller said the requirement of a 14' ceiling for 15' back into the building is not efficient and developers would have to build a lot of empty space to heat.

"You are mandating inefficiency in the building design," Miller said.

Mayor Conley said the amendment would "keep the look and feel you want in downtown ... We chose to do it now and it's not just for one person ... Multiple persons have asked."

Councilman Fielder then spoke about the person hired to appraise city hall who said the value to the building is as a one-story structure.

"It's not a single issue," Fielder said. "It's a 10-year evaluation and maybe we need to do something different."

He said earlier that if the amended zoning ordinance was approved it would enhance the sale-ability of this property and the city could find out if any business wants to build there.

"We've been putting money in a building not useable by anyone but us," Fielder said of city hall.

Jeff Vernon said from the audience that every December for the past three years, Fielder mentions selling this building.

"Do you have a place to move?" Vernon asked and Mayor Conley replied, "We own property," without further comment.

In other business at the Jan. 3 meeting, the council:

- Approved the Belleville Area Chamber of Commerce request to hold Winter Fest from 6 to 10 p.m. on Friday, Dec. 1, and from noon to 9 p.m. on Saturday, Dec. 2, 2017 in downtown Belleville. Requested street closings on Saturday were Main Street from Roys to Third from noon to 8 p.m. and the parade route beginning at 6 p.m. at the high school, opening up the road after the parade passes, to 9 p.m. downtown. They also approved a tent on or near the Fourth Street Square, performances of Animal Magic at 6 p.m. Friday and noon Saturday, and carriage rides at Main and Roys. Also planned is ice skating on the vacant lot at Third and Main and a yet-tobe-determined musical guest on Friday. In addition for Saturday there is a Kids Fun Zone with bouncy house at Third and Main and at the Chamber office, a Soup Crawl from 2 to 4 p.m., and fireworks at 8 p.m. When asked why the chamber was seeking approval almost a year in advance, Paul Henning said, "We want to get ahead of the ball instead of be behind it." Mayor Conley asked if there was a theme yet for the parade, so they could start planning the city float. Henning said there wasn't;
- Approved a pay increase of 2% effective January-December 2017 and a pay increase

of 1% effective January-December 2018 to city employees in the Governmental Employees Labor Council. This was a wage reopener in the 2015-18 GELC agreement. Fielder said they have been without raises for 8-10 years and this is long overdue;

- Heard Miller ask why yard sale permits are so high during Strawberry Festival and Mayor Conley replied, "We don't want them. We have free citywide garage sales." Miller said he worked in a city that had free yard sales every month and Mayor Conley replied, "Aargh!" Miller said the price of a permit is supposed to reflect the cost of the service and Conley said during Strawberry Festival officials are all busy and so the cost would be high for permits. She said the high-priced permits for Strawberry Festival came "long before I got here." Fielder said heavy traffic during festival makes yard sales difficult. Miller said, "But, people need the money";
- Heard Mayor Pro Tem Jack Loria say that during the holidays the offices of other municipalities were closed and, "When other places are closed, we're open." He said residents can always find someone to talk to at city hall;
- Heard Police Chief Hal Berriman announce that Mary Talaga, who was sitting next to him in the audience, was going in for heart surgery the next day and would be off her crossing guard job for a month. Also, Officer Tim Trombley's father was rushed to University of Michigan Hospital, the chief said:
- Heard Chief Berriman say that two police officers have left for other jobs and a Civil Service Commission meeting is set for Jan. 18 to interview candidates. He said police officers now are hard to find;

- Heard Miller complain about Van Buren Township police officers making traffic stops in the city of Belleville, with VBT getting the traffic fines instead of the city. Most of the tickets were written around Hayward's where drivers illegally cut over from the right lane to the left coming into the city. He said the township officers are writing tickets on their township ordinance for impeding traffic. Chief Berriman said when Columbia Avenue was being fixed he gave permission to VBT to help out with traffic because the city didn't have enough officers. "I thanked the chief for setting that up," said Fielder. "We do not have the manpower to enforce," the chief said. Mayor Conley said the council is leaving the decision up to the police chief "as long as tickets are legitimately written..."; and
- Approved accounts payable of \$185,961.87 and the following departmental purchases in excess of \$500: to Blue Ribbon Contractor, for sewer repair on Potter Drive, \$3,898, and for sewer repair on Second Street, \$3,754.50, both from the sewer budget; and to Morton Salt, \$1,697.75, salt for winter maintenance from the street budget.

Peggy Morgan is new treasurer of Sumpter Township

There were a lot of tears at Tuesday's meeting of the Sumpter Township Board of Trustees. Treasurer Alan Bates died suddenly on Christmas Eve and the board had just 45 days to replace him.

Supervisor John Morgan submitted the name of Trustee Peggy Morgan (no relative) to replace Bates and this was approved unanimously by the board.

She was immediately sworn in by Clerk Clarence Hoffman, Jr. and seated as treasurer.

New Treasurer Morgan asked Karen Armatis to remain as deputy treasurer and she agreed. Actually, Armatis is also deputy supervisor, as well.

Since the trustee position became vacant, Supervisor Morgan appointed former longtime deputy clerk Esther Hurst to the position. The vote was 5-1, with Clerk Hoffman voting no.

Hurst had been Hoffman's deputy for many years and then retired. After that, she ran against Hoffman for the clerk's position, which wounded Hoffman.

Deputy Clerk Janet Hoffman swore in Hurst to her new position and she took her seat at the board table.

Tim Rush, a previous Republican trustee and a candidate who received more than 2,000 votes in last November's election, said the board could have healed a lot of wounds in the township if it would have appointed him trustee. Other candidates showed their dismay at the appointments. The turmoil continues.

EXTRA THINGS I KNOW

I talked to Elaine at Wayne County and she confirmed the county crew will be back to finish its work on the E. Huron River Drive bridge over the Huron River. And, they will close the bridge again.

She said the project won't continue until the weather breaks in the spring. She said the county will alert Van Buren Township when it's time to close the bridge again.

And, we assume the township will alert us so we can alert you. Last time a date was set and then unset. Then they just closed the bridge for a couple of weeks, including the time of the 10" snowfall.

The cement sides of the bridge are still all broken up with the rebar showing and some of the cement on the roadway is crumbling already. Yes, there is still work to be done.

This bridge project was in mid December. It made everyone crazy because of the detours. Downtown Belleville became a big traffic jam, especially with the big semis trying to make turns at Five Points. And, people complained a lot about the Lower Huron Clinton Metropark charging cars without park permits a \$10 fee just to drive through from E. Huron River Drive / Haggerty to Bemis/Haggerty.

Can hardly wait until it's closed again.

On our Van Buren Township dispatch log last week there was an armed robbery listed at Wendy's at about 6:43 p.m. on Wednesday, Dec. 28.

VBT Police Lt. Charles Bazzy said Wendy's was not robbed. An individual walking down the North I-94 Service Drive claimed to have been robbed at gun point by four individuals in a car. The victim is a transient that was walking though Van

Buren Township on his way to Chicago. The victim was not injured, but he was transported to the hospital for evaluation and treatment at his request.

Another armed robbery listed on the log at 3:03 p.m. Thursday, Dec. 29, on Haggerty Road, was unfounded, Lt. Bazzy said.

On Tuesday morning just before 8 there was an accident on West Huron River Drive between Hoeft and Farm roads in Van Buren Township. Fire Chief Dan Besson was on the scene. I'm told part of the road was blocked off, so those hurrying to work in the city of Belleville had to turn around and take the South I-94 Service Drive in. I understand two vehicles were towed and no one was taken to the hospital.

We had snow overnight, so there were several vehicle accidents that morning.

After the snow on Tuesday, came the rain and the wind. At the regular meeting of the Belleville Area District Library Board that night, Library Director Mary Jo Suchy reported that it appears the mystery roof leak over the public computers has been solved. She and another person went on the roof a few weeks ago and filled some places they thought might be suspicious.

At Tuesday's meeting of the Sumpter Township Board of Trustees, Police Chief Eric Luke announced that Sumpter had one homicide during the month of December. He said that the 81-year-old male that allegedly was attacked by his grandson on Dec 2 fought for his life for three weeks and died Dec. 23. The grandson will have his aggravated assault charge changed to homicide.

Also at Sumpter's meeting, township attorney Rob Young said he was talking with the Huron Township attorney who told him at its meeting the Huron Township board took

a moment to remember Alan Bates, the Sumpter Treasurer who died on Christmas Eve. Bates had many friends in Huron and many business dealings with Huron residents.

At its meeting later Tuesday, the Belleville Area District Library Board also spoke of Bates and how he was a huge library supporter who fought for the best library they could afford – especially for Sumpter.

Library Board vice chairwoman Mary Jane Dawson said her husband came back from an early library committee meeting and said Bates wanted "more than a closet with a Commodore 64 in it for Sumpter." She said both Bates and late Trustee Bill Hamm were advocates for the library.

additional evidence.

The jury trial requested by Po is now set for Feb. 23 and 24.

Po is charged with one felony count of delivering / manufacturing 5-45 kilograms of marijuana on Aug. 16 at his home at 45025 Harris Road.

If found guilty of the charge, Po could be imprisoned for 7 years and/or pay a fine of \$500,000.

Defense attorney Scott Ruark drafted a motion that was to be presented Jan. 6 to dismiss the charge against Nelson Po based upon entrapment. He will now present and argue his motion to dismiss on Feb. 3.

Ruark will argue that the Deferred Prosecution Agreement, signed by Sumpter Township and Po on Nov. 3, 2015, is an illegal drug deal – 200 pounds of marijuana for \$40,000 – and that Sumpter Township used it to entrap Nelson Po into breaking

Sumpter Township Police already have confiscated about \$1 million worth of possessions owned by Po and his wife Clarita.

Vehicle pursuit on I-275 and I-94 ends in arrest of suspect by VBT PD

On Tuesday morning Van Buren Township Director of Public Safety Gregory Laurain sent the following news release.

At about 8:11 a.m. Saturday, Van Buren Township Police received information that a larceny of a utility trailer was in

Employees from a storage lot at Haggerty and Van Born roads alerted police that a white male subject was in the process of

stealing their work trailer and they were chasing the suspect in his vehicle as he was driving off in his red pickup truck with the

The employees followed the suspect's vehicle and trailer in tow down Haggerty to Ecorse Road eastbound, at which time the suspect crashed into a guardrail disconnecting the trailer from the truck at the entrance ramp onto southbound I-275.

The suspect's vehicle continued southbound on I-275 at a high rate of speed and then onto eastbound I-94 where a Van Buren Police cruiser attempted to effect a traffic stop.

The suspect vehicle which was reported as stolen, was failing to stop for police and continued at a high rate of speed traveling eastbound on I-94.

In the area of I-94 and Merriman, the

suspect vehicle left the eastbound lane of I-94, crossed the median and drove eastbound in the westbound lanes of I-94 in an attempt to elude police. The suspect then continued across all lanes of westbound I-94 and exited the vehicle while in motion, running on foot.

The suspect vehicle continued to roll several hundred feet before making impact with a cement freeway wall.

Officers observed the suspect running into a wooded area and there Van Buren Police apprehended him shortly thereafter.

The suspect, identified as Timothy Komendera, 50-year-old male from Detroit, has been arraigned by the presiding 34th District Court Judge on two counts of Larceny (over \$20,000) and one count of 3rd-Degree Flee & Eluding. His bond is set at \$50,000/10%. His probable cause hearing is set for Jan. 18 at 9 a.m. at 34th District Court and a preliminary exam is to be held on Jan. 25.



Prosecutor has the missing evidence, now suspect is a no-show

Bernardo Keith Frye, 54, did not show up for his preliminary exam on Jan. 4, so 34th District Court Judge Brian A. Oakley signed a bench warrant for his arrest.

Frye is charged with operating while intoxicated-3rd and failure to stop at a property damage accident with an attended vehicle on April 14, 2007 in Van Buren Township.

He was free on a \$10,000 personal recognizance bond, but that bond is now cancelled. His courtappointed attorney is Luther Glenn.

VBT Sgt. Marc Abdilla is the officer in charge

Frye's preliminary exam had been set for Dec. 21, but at that time Assistant Wayne County Prosecutor Nadine Hammoud said the People could not proceed on the case because Sgt. Abdilla was on vacation and wouldn't be back until January and they can't find the file on the case, but will find it soon.

Judge Tina Brooks Green said this was a drunk driving charge from 2007 and she was not inclined to dismiss the charge.

Judge Green questioned VBT Detective Donovan McCarthy about the whereabouts of the file and he said they would have to go into the archives to find it.

Hammoud said Frye had three prior drunk driving convictions and he was unable to post his \$5,000/10% bond. She said he had been in the Jackson County Jail since Sept. 5 on another charge and then was brought over to Wayne County Jail where he'd been since Dec. 5 on these charges.

Frye's court-appointed attorney Glenn made a motion to dismiss the charge and have the warrant reissued when the officer is back and the file is found.

Prosecutor Hammoud said she would have no opposition to a personal bond with an electronic tether. Judge Green put him on personal bond which included alcohol testing and reset his preliminary exam for Jan. 4 before Judge

But, on Jan. 4, Frye failed to appear.

Matthew Christopher Farrow Matthew Christopher Farrow, 21, had his

probable cause conference reset for Jan. 11, instead of the scheduled Jan. 4 date, on charges of breaking and entering of a building with intent; malicious destruction of personal property more than \$1,000 but less than \$20,000; and malicious destruction of personal property worth more than \$200, but less than \$1,000. This is alleged to have happened on Dec. 24 in Van Buren Township. He is free after posting \$3,500/10% bond. VBT Sgt. Jeff Gueli is the officer in charge of the case.

Anthony Smith

Anthony Smith, 47, waived his upcoming preliminary exam and Judge Oakley bound him over to circuit court for a Jan. 11 arraignment on the information. He is charged with a felony count of retail fraud first-degree in VBT on Dec.

He was lodged in Wayne County Jail Division III on bond of \$10,000/10% and was brought to the court lockup to be present for his probable cause conference.

The Assistant Wayne County Prosecutor said he objected to personal bond for Smith, as requested by his court-appointed attorney, since Smith had a number of prior convictions. Judge Oakley reduced Smith's bond to \$1,000/10% and told Smith he cannot return to Walmart as part of his bond.

Officer in charge of the case is Detective Donovan McCarthy.


