

VBT DDA thinking about what to put on the walkway

At Tuesday's regular meeting, the Van Buren Township Downtown Development Authority looked at several artist's renditions of what the new Belleville Road pedestrian walkway over I-94 could look like from the freeway.

There was a drawing of Rosie the Riveter in the cockpit of a bomber with the words big and prominent: Van Buren Township. There was a sailboat to indicate the township was on the lake and logos, always with big Van Buren Township designation.

DDA Executive Director Susan Ireland said there has been talk about the township's identity and this would "put us on the map.'

Township Supervisor Kevin McNamara was not enthralled with the drawings. "This looks cute, but it's not going to be as cute as you think." He especially was critical of brick pillars in the drawing.

Rather than the chain link fence the Michigan Department of Transportation puts on pedestrian overpasses, the VBT DDA is more interested in something that looks like wrought iron fencing, even though it is more expensive.

"The walkway at Quirk Road is ugly," McNamara said, noting he drove over to

"It'll come down to money, I guess," Ireland said. The drawings are at the DDA office and they'll be thinking about them until the next meeting on Feb. 28. Take a look and tell them your ideas.

EXTRA THINGS I KNOW

After seeing the 2016 salaries for Van Buren Township Police Officers, one of our readers said he did some calculations. The \$208,004.01 total for Ken Floro is costing the township .22 mills, he said.

For the second year in a row, VBT Clerk Leon Wright posted the salary figures we requested under the Freedom of Information Act about the time the township sent them to us. He wanted to get them out to the public before the Independent could publish them, I guess. Maybe he thinks the shock to the public will be less if they see them on the township website first before seeing them in print.

Ronald Barrington Robinson, who unsuccessfully ran for trustee in Sumpter Township last fall, has an ongoing concern about the safety of the fire hydrants in the

Hydrants that don't work could result in people dying or losing all their possessions.

He's been told that all the hydrants were inspected and flushed and painted, but he didn't believe officials since the one in front of Jay Bardell's house, for example, hasn't been touched in years. He started looking around.

Ronald filed a FOIA with the township with nine questions about the fire hydrants and got a reply with eight answers saying "Document does not exist." The only question answered was the number of hydrants, which was typed in as 1,112 and then next to that was a handwritten and circled 1,140. Take your pick.

He asked questions about why there are

no inspections tags with dates on the fire hydrants that proves they were inspected, painted, flushed and in proper working order in 2016 according to State of Michigan fire marshal guidelines/statutes.

TINDS TO PO TINDS TO CAN'T TEN YOU CAN'T TYBERNATE

Charles Tackett and his family had a problem with the Sprint store on Belleville Road, north of the freeway, and found out it was an independently owned franchise. Employees at the store wouldn't tell who owned the store, so he called Van Buren Township Clerk Leon Wright.

He said Clerk Wright told him the township doesn't have business licenses, so he doesn't know who owns any businesses.

Tackett said VBT should license businesses so they know who's doing what in the township.

City of Belleville doesn't require business licenses, either.

Sumpter Township has had business licenses for years. Businesses pay a \$50 license fee a year and a township representative inspects each business. It helps the township keep track of who's doing what in the township.

Before last week's Belleville City Council meeting, Mayor Pro Tem Jack Loria, who works for the Van Buren Schools as a paraprofessional, was talking about how many physical attacks he has had from special needs children.

Then, he noted, that charter schools turn away special education students so they don't have to deal with them.

I told Jack that was incorrect and that Keystone Academy, the one I know about. does have special education students.

A few days later I was at the Keystone School Board meeting and I recounted what was said from the council table just before the regular meeting in Belleville. Keystone members



expressed concern and noted that incorrect information is often spread about charter

Keystone Principal Keturah Godfrey said they have a spring lottery for open seats and 34th District Court Judge Tina Brooks Green presides to make sure it is run fairly. Keturah said they do not get to pick their students and if a special education student wins a seat in the lottery, they take that student in and provide services as required

She said the policy is to accept siblings of present students, but otherwise new students come through the lottery.

Keystone's representative from National Heritage Academies, which provides the school and teachers, said he often hears reports of untrue statements about NHA charter schools and it is saddening.



Belleville Civil Service Commission selects seven cop candidates

After a day-long series of interviews of 11 candidates for police positions, the Belleville Civil Service Commission selected seven it approved for hire.

The names were listed by the commission in no particular order of preference.

- Alan Benson currently a Reserve Officer with Grosse Ile Police Department and new graduate from police academy at Schoolcraft. Bachelor's degree in hotel management and associate's degree in culinary arts.
- Tyler Bielecki December graduate of Mott Community College Police Academy, third in class. Lives in Brownstown, unemployed. Earned four-year Criminal Justice degree in two years at University of Michigan. Had six-month internship with U.S. Marshalls in Detroit. Father is a police officer in Brownstown; mother is investigator for the Department of Justice. Was part of Wyandotte Explorer's Cadet Program ages 14-21. Earned three President's Volunteer Awards.

Great Lakes Water Authority issues statement on water

The following is a Jan. 18, statement from Great Lakes Water Authority CEO Sue McCormick regarding the principle cause of taste and odor concerns in the water in several Downriver communities

"After a thorough review, GLWA has identified the principle cause of the taste and odor issue that several Downriver communities have been experiencing since Jan. 12. The Authority has also established protocols that will prevent the issue from occurring again.

"At no time were there any health or safety

"It should be noted that throughout the entire taste and odor situation, the GLWA Water Quality Team has been conducting not only standard bacteriological testing, but also additional testing for toxicity and volatile organic chemicals. All test results have met the EPA's Safe Drinking Water Act regulatory standards.

"The Authority's Southwest Water Treatment Facility (SW Facility) is the primary location from which Downriver communities are served, and therefore our investigation began at that facility.

"GLWA has concluded that the SW Facility experienced a temporary spike in turbidity levels (water with a significant amount of particulates) in the water at the beginning of the treatment process and associated with the normal cleaning of its settling basins

"Once staff determined that the cleaning of the settling basins could be a contributing factor to the taste and odor issues, the cleaning of the basins was immediately stopped (approximately noon on Thursday, Jan. 12). However, some of the water treated during this timeframe left the plant and entered the distribution system with sulfurous tastes and odors.

"Facility staff then began feeding powdered activated carbon into the system to help mitigate the issue and begin to bring relief to our customer communities. Staff also instituted an enhanced schedule of water quality testing to ensure that there is not a reoccurrence of the taste and odor issue.

"These actions have resulted in a significant decrease in the number of complaints being received by GLWA.

"In order to assure complete mitigation of the

issue, on Monday, GLWA began implementation of a systematic flushing plan to clear the remainder of the water treated during the cleaning of the settling basins from its system. Staff will continue flushing until the situation is resolved.

"The Authority is also reaching out to affected customer communities to offer assistance in flushing out their local systems. GLWA will cover the cost of any volume increases associated with flushing activities in the impacted communities.

"GLWA remains committed to providing our customer communities with water of unquestionable quality."

Father shoots son in Willow Road altercation in Sumpter Township

On Sunday at about 9:10 p.m., Sumpter Township Police were at a residence in the 47000 block of Willow Road responding to a call for service.

While officers were outside speaking with that homeowner, a volley of gunfire erupted at the residence next door.

When they got to that location, officers found a 28-year-old male lying in the driveway next to a vehicle riddled with bullet holes. The male suffered a gunshot wound to the right thigh. The injured male was taken to a safe position, but was uncooperative with investigators before being transported by ambulance to a hospital.

The homeowner and victim's father, Tony Standifer, 58, admitted to firing the shots, but gave several conflicting stories as to why, said Sumpter Police Chief Eric Luke.

Standifer was subsequently taken into custody and has since been charged by

the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office and arraigned on two counts: Weapons -- Firearms -- Possession by Felon; and Weapons - Felony Firearm. He was also given a habitual offender - second offense

Several firearms were recovered from the residence. Alcohol is believed to have played a part in the incident, Chief Luke

Sumpter Township Police was assisted on the scene by Huron Township Police, Van Buren Township Police, Huron-Clinton Metropark Police, and Michigan State





It is easy to sit in our living room and construct some diatribe on Facebook. It is more difficult to thoughtfully create a campaign, garner support, suggest solutions, and activate your community on an issue that can make change.

Wouldn't an elective social studies course at Belleville High School that focused on learning about forms of protest, historical events, and then had the students activate the community in a rally be interesting? Our society is built upon a collective power and our next generation will need to understand how to maneuver within this system.

It isn't easy keeping our free society moving forward. We need to prepare our youth to be productive members in our republic. This upcoming generation has a lot to do.
