George Craven plays 'Taps' at World War II memorial in Washington

George Craven of Van Buren Township was able to fulfill a longtime dream and play "Taps" with his trumpet on the deck of the World War II and the Vietnam War monuments in Washington, D.C.

Craven, 90, said he was honored to be accepted by the Kalamazoo Talons Out Honor Flight to Washington, D.C., on Saturday, Sept. 30, joining 70 other World War II and Korean War veterans.

"It was a great honor," Craven said, of getting the special permission to play "Taps" at the World War II monument in front of the whole group.

He said each of the 70 veterans was accompanied by a caregiver, which brought their group to 140 in number. He was accompanied by his son David Craven who lives in Ypsilanti Township.

One World War II veteran on the flight was 99 years old and his wife was his caregiver. They had been married for 72 years, Craven marveled.

Craven said he asked for permission to play at the World War II memorial before they flew out of Kalamazoo, but he didn't get an answer. He brought his trumpet, just in case.


He said he was thrilled to be able to play "Taps" at the World War II memorial and he played five other service songs, as well, something he does for the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the American Legion, where he has memberships.

He is proud to relate that while playing, he was able to hit that high note near the end of "Taps," a note that many miss.

After leaving the World War II memorial, the group drove around the city to see the sights from their four-bus caravan escorted by police and motorcyclists. Then they went to the Vietnam memorial.

"I felt the urge and played "Taps" again," Craven said.

He said they visited the Tomb of the Unknown Solider, but he didn't dare to

play his trumpet there, since the three guards give their tight protection to the soldier inside the tomb. He said he was surprised to learn that now one of the three guards is always a woman. He said she was dressed just like the men.

Craven said they also visited a private Air

Memorial put in place by Ross Perot, who had run for president.

Craven said the veterans then were taken back to Ronald Reagan Airport and flew back to Kalamazoo.

Once back in Kalamazoo, where they were welcomed by the fire department and

a motorcycle club, the veterans were taken from the airport to a hall called "Wings." He said they were all made to sit in wheelchairs while they were pushed down a line of about 1,000 people who wanted to shake their hands and thank them for their service.

He said his daughter-in-law and two daughters wanted to welcome them home, but they had to wait until Craven got through the long line of well-wishers.

Craven said he enlisted in the Navy after graduation from Cass Tech high school in Detroit. He said Cass Tech had a music program but he wasn't good enough to play in it. Instead, he played with a group of young men who organized a band.

When he enlisted to fight in World War II, the hostilities suddenly ended and he got on a ship and went to China and brought the ship back. He was in World War II for nine months.

Later, after he had married Doreen, he was drafted into the army during the Korean War. They had no children at the time, so he was eligible. He spent his almost two years in the army in Newport News, VA, playing in the army band. As soon as he was eligible to get out, he did.

Then he gave up his trumpet for 30 years. He had a career as an architect and he is still registered as an architect. He and Doreen moved to Van Buren Township in 1962 and he spent two years as township supervisor. Doreen was clerk for many years.

When he and Doreen became snow birds, going to Brandenton, FL each year, he picked up his horn again and joined the Suncoat Mummers Band for fun. That band was made up of 1 trumpet, 15 banjos, 4-5 accordians, 4-5 saxophones, and 1 tuba.

Doreen died Oct. 31, 2015.

Craven said at the dinner given for the veterans after the flight, veterans were able to give statements.

"I told them I was just a musician and I would like to play 'Taps' and I did," he said. "There was a nice ovation."

Belleville Council approves Puerto Rico relief event on Nov. 4

Belleville resident Carlos Velez got permission from the Belleville City Council for his church to hold a special event from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m., Saturday, Nov. 4, at the Fourth Street Square to gather donations to send for relief efforts in Puerto Rico.

At Monday's regular meeting, Velez said they will put up a tent and have prayers and singing and gather non-perishable foods to send to Puerto Rico, where the need is great in the weeks following the hurricane.

Velez said they already have a donation of 40

cases of corn muffin mixes.

The event, "Belleville Cares/Relief for Puerto Rico," is sponsored by Merriman Road Baptist Church. Velez said they are reaching out to other churches to help.

Another church may be able to assist in the transport of the items donated to the island in the Carribean, he said.

Velez was told by City Manager Diana Kollmeyer that she thought it would be all right for volunteers to pass out flyers during the Oct. 28 Zombie 5K Run-Walk to publicize the Puerto Rico relief event.

In other business at the 10-minute meeting

on Monday, the council:

- Approved accounts payable of \$88,200.02 and the following expenditures in excess of \$500: to Town Web, \$5,058 for new website; to Digital Ally, \$2,615 for an in-car video camera for police; to McDowell & Assoc., \$1,500 for seawall repair design; to Lonnie's Auto Repair, \$845.58 for repairs on police vehicle; to Fidlar Technologies, Inc., \$692.49 for police citation ticket books; and to JW2 Fire Consultants, \$750 for half payment for grant writing, with fire auxiliary paying the other half;
- Heard Councilman Tom Fielder report on
- the Substance Abuse Task Force meeting he attended. He said hospitalization for opioid drug overdoses is going down in Southeastern Michigan because more overdose victims are dying at the scene; and
- Heard Kollmeyer thank the police reserve unit for being at the Harvest Fest on Saturday to help people cross safely at the crosswalk. There was a farmers' market on the Fourth Street Square and more events across busy Main Street at the museum and library and on Fourth Street, which was blocked off.

Absent from the meeting were Mayor Kerreen Conley and Councilman Jesse Marcotte.

VBT Board splits 4-3 on two votes

When the Van Buren Township Board of Trustees approved the \$17.4 million budget for 2018 on Tuesday, it paved the way for a shuffling of jobs in the building, planning, water and sewer departments.

The structure of those departments was reconfigured, promoting Matthew Best, who had been deputy director of planning and economic development, into director of them all, with a raise of \$14,000, boosting his pay to \$81,000.

According to reports, Best was going to look elsewhere for a better-paying job and Supervisor McNamara wanted him to stay. At Monday's work/study session, McNamara said Best showed him a spreadsheet of his personal expenses and that's how the \$14,000 figure was decided. McNamara said Water and Sewer Director Taylor and Building and Economic Development Director Akers came to him with the suggested reallocation of duties.

Trustee Sherry Frazier pointed out Akers and Taylor will have jobs taken away from them and given to Best, but their pays will remain the same. Best will oversee both of them and make more money. That didn't

The vote was 4-3 to pass the new personal services agreements for Best, Taylor, and Akers, with Trustees Frazier, White, and Miller voting no and Trustee Martin, Treasurer Budd, Clerk Wright, and McNamara voting yes. The same split came on a vote to buy a \$25,103.16 truck for Judy Fields to drive to do building inspections. McNamara has his four votes.

At Monday's city council meeting, I asked about the marijuana brownies I heard a student brought to Belleville High School, a drug-free zone. I was told that earlier that day the brownies had been sent to the Michigan State Police crime lab.

Also before Monday's meeting, I asked about whether the Belleville Downtown Development Authority had submitted its budget yet, since in an earlier meeting it was expected at that meeting.

City Manager Diana Kollmeyer said the DDA's maintenance agreement with the city was due to go to the DDA on Oct. 18 and then to the city council at its next meeting, which isn't until Nov. 6. Diana said after the maintenance agreement is in place, THEN the DDA can do its budget.

For the last two fiscal years the DDA has not submitted a budget to the city during budget preparations and approval and the city has approved the previous year's budget as the new budget.

The problem is that the DDA is capturing less money than expected with rising costs of its bond payments and it wants to cut expenditures so it's paying the city less than agreed upon in the past.

Under state law the DDA budget needs to be approved by July 1 each year.

At the beginning of Monday's work/ study session of the Van Buren Township

Board of Trustees, Wayne County Commissioner Al Haidous was there to talk about Supervisor Kevin McNamara's lobbying of the county for use of the money another township didn't use from the Road Initiative Fund. There is \$350,000 worth

of internally approved VBT subdivision roads that could use that McNamara money, said.

When Trustee Reggie Miller asked about paving the rest of Bemis Road, Haidous

said the undone section should be on next year's list to do and if it isn't he'll get it on the list. He said the county also promised they would take care of the other half of Haggerty next year.

You'll recall that the span of Haggerty in front of Garden Fantasy was done a few years back when McNamara was commissioner and Walter Rochowiak worked for him. Well, Garden Fantasy moved and McNamara moved on. Now, there are complaints about the crumbling road that wasn't paved. Haidous said they plan to mill it and gap it, so it will last another three to four years. In the future the roadway has to be completely done from the bottom up, he said.

McNamara stressed to Haidous that the township needs concrete at the intersections where the heavy trucks come to stops.



He and Dr. Caroline Addison-Peace have three sons, all of whom hate opera. Mrs. Peace has been her husband's strongest advocate.






