VBT board passes \$17.4 million budget for 2018 on 6-1 vote

The Van Buren Township Board of Trustees passed a \$17.4 million budget for 2018 with Trustee Paul White voting no.

That 6-1 vote also covered the amended 2017 budget and the 2018 employee wage schedule, with everyone getting a 2.5% raise.

At the regular township board meeting Oct. 17, Trustee White said the public safety millage vote that approved putting 2.5 more mills designated for public safety, allowed VBT to put \$1.5 million into a longterm debt fund to pay for the Visteon bond, the pension fund, and other responsibilities.

Trustee White had referred to this as a "bait and switch," that led voters to believe the extra 2.5 mills would be spent to improve public safety, when it actually was freeing up money in the general fund for other use.

White also objected to how the proposed changes in the public services department were put in the budget before trustees knew about it.

"VBT was heading to an emergency manager, operating on less than 1 mill in taxes, with \$12 million in pension debt, mostly in public safety," responded Supervisor Kevin McNamara.

"Public Safety had 4 mills and we went to 6.5 mills," White said.

"You were using the landfill fund, which would go to zero," Supervisor McNamara said of past boards, including the time White was supervisor.

"We shouldn't use the landfill fund to pay for public safety," agreed Trustee Sherry Frazier

"We still have the second-lowest taxes in Wayne County," McNamara said.

White said the prior supervisor, Linda Combs, said in an LDFA meeting that the money would be put into a long-term debt

fund to pay the Visteon bond.

McNamara, Frazier, and Trustee Reggie Miller spoke out together, saying those were Combs' words, not theirs.

Clerk Leon Wright said the way the millage request was posted was for the public safety department to better serve itself and take the burden off the township general fund.

Treasurer Sharry Budd said they have added \$1.5 million from the general fund and \$2.5 million from the landfill fund and now the long-term debt fund is funded at almost \$5 million. She said the 6.5 mills doesn't completely fund the public safety budget and the general fund still has to add funds to cover that. Revenue for the public safety department in 2018 was estimated at \$6.69 million.

Trustee Miller praised McNamara for his work on the budget that was brought to the board for approval in October, rather than at the end of the year against a tight deadline, as in the past. She said 81% of the pensions are covered and that's not where they need to be.

In other business at the one-hour-and 45-minutes meeting, the board:

- Unanimously approved the 2017 amended and 2018 proposed Special Revenue Funds, that included the CDBG, DDA, LDFA, federal and state forfeiture funds, E-911, landfill, museum, and long-term debt fund. Treasurer Budd said the Water and Sewer fund would be presented separately at a later date;
- Approved on a 4-3 vote the new job descriptions and personal services agreements for James Taylor, Matthew Best, and Ron Akers, putting Best in charge of a new Public Services Department with a \$14,000 raise. Akers and Taylor now are below Best on the organizational chart. Voting no were Frazier, Miller, and White, who objected to the shuffling of the same

jobs to be done and paying the new director \$81,000, while the other two directors kept the same pay with fewer jobs assigned;

• Approved on a 4-3 vote, the purchase of one 2018 Ford F-150 XL Extended Cab with 8' bed from Atchison Ford for \$25,103.16. Frazier, Miller, and White voted no, having a problem with the truck being fancier than needed for the building official to go out for building permit checks. Also, Atchinson was not the low bidder, but the township's policy for local bidders brought Atchinson in as low bidder with the 5% discount. The three no voters also said at the work/study meeting the day before there was consensus to have the single cab feature, but that was changed overnight. When Frazier said it was "a sad day" in VBT, McNamara said, "I'm not putting up with that," and refused to let her continue speaking, saying he would close down the meeting if she continued;

- Unanimously approved the proposal by McKenna & Associates to prepare an update to the township's existing master plan for an amount not to exceed \$40,000, \$19,000 of which will be paid with federal Community Development Block Grant funds and \$21,000 with general fund money. The whole process will take a year;
- Approved on a 5-2 vote an offer to settle the VBT vs. Amanda Jackson civil case (15-015063) with Trustees Miller and Kevin Martin voting no. Jackson built on VBT-owned lakeside property on Lake Pointe Pass and ignored a stop-work order two years ago. McNamara said the judge wants the township to settle and VBT already has spent "a few dollars on this" with attorney fees. Jackson has offered to pay the township for the property over a period of time, while the township had wanted payment all at once. "That's not what we agreed to initially," Martin said. "We're not in the mortgage business and not in the loan business." McNamara said the settlement "firmly estabishes that line belongs to VBT"; and
- Heard Public Safety Director Greg Laurain said there was an incident at 12:29 p.m., Oct. 12, when a resident was found facedown in a bathroom without a pulse from an overdose. He said Sgt. Amy Smith and Officer Chris Hayes were on the scene quickly and gave him a dose of one ounce of Narcan and he immediately revived. Director Laurain said Supervisor McNamara is a member of the Detroit Wayne County Mental Health Authority and expedited getting the lifesaving drug for the township. Fire Chief Amy Brow provided training for police, fire, and EMS. McNamara said they weren't expecting Narcan here until next year.

School Board approves \$319,787 on lighting for 2 schools

The Van Buren Public Schools Board of Education on Monday approved spending up to \$319,787 to improve the interior lighting in Savage and Tyler elementary schools with LEDs.

The amount approved includes a \$30,000 contingency fund.

This is part of the Sinking Fund threeyear plan. Low bidder of three bids for the project was Allied Building Service of Detroit which was approved to do the project.

In other business at Monday's one-hourand-19-minute meeting, the board:

- Approved the district's share of \$25,309.24 to complete installation of wireless network access points in all elementary schools using an ERATE grant. The total project is \$106,590.20, of which \$81,280.96 will be paid with the grant. It will take from four to six weeks to complete once the equipment is delivered;
- Heard Edgemont Elementary School Principal Fred Abel give a presentation on his school's Multi-Tiered Support Strategy (MTSS) program for the school year. He explained how teachers focus on the needs of students. Also, he said there are three student teachers from Eastern Michigan University that help with the project. "We

continue to see awesome growth," Abel said:

- Officially approved the data rubric for superintendent evaluation based on student test scores, agreed to in a special board meeting on Oct. 17, and then heard Supt. Pete Kudlak give a presentation on his goals. The final evaluation will take place in December;
- Approved the resignation of teacher Chelsee Harris from Belleville High School after seven years of service as of Oct. 13 for other employment; and the hiring of Eva Simons as a GSRP teacher at Haggerty as of Oct. 10;
- Approved hiring Lanita Troupe as a paraprofessional in special services at Owen Intermediate School as of Oct. 9; and Atemia Holley and Patrick Murphy as district IT employees as of Oct. 30. There were 18 applicants for the two, new IT positions and 11 interviews;
- Approved the Sept. 29 resignation of teacher Lee Smither of Savage Elementary after seven years of service, for other employment; employer termination of Vicki Ceckiewicz of Owen for less than one year of service as of Oct. 9; and retirement of Sandra Marsh of Edgemont as of Oct. 17 after 17 years of service;
- Heard Curriculum Director Jeffrey

 Moore report that all staff members

are moving from Windows to new Chromebooks. He said they would have liked to have top-of-the-line Windows, but the Chromebooks are less expensive;

- Heard Financial Director Shareen Barker report 17 buses have been fitted with the new cameras and the district has received the brand new buses that were ordered. She said a new bill in Lansing, not yet approved, would result in \$400,000 less income for the district from the enhancement millage, since it allows sharing with charter schools;
- Heard Building and Grounds Director James Williams report that the ECDC building next to Edgemont School will be taken down after DTE shuts off the electricity, possibly the first week in November:
- Heard Human Resources Director Abdul Madyun report that the district is changing Oct. 24 to a different service for providing substitute teachers; and
- Heard Supt. Kudlak report that the British Broadcasting Company (BBC) is coming Nov. 1 to interview the "Belleville Three" at BHS. The three are known for developing Techno Music.

Sumpter committee on marijuana law to meet Nov. 1

Two weeks ago, Sumpter Township Supervisor Morgan named a committee of seven people to be fact-finders on the new Medical Marijuana Facilities Licensing Act that takes effect in December. He said they would let the public know when the meetings were -- and then nothing.

At Tuesday's meeting of the Sumpter Township Board, Andre Watkins, a township resident who supports having MMFLA dispensaries and growing operations in Sumpter, respectfully asked when the committee was going to meet. He said he talked to Trustee Barnes, a member of the new committee, after the last meeting and she said she would let him know when the committee would meet and she didn't call.

Trustee Barnes apologized and said, "The committee hasn't moved forward." She didn't know when it was going to meet. Watkins said Dec. 15 is the date the state will start issuing licenses and a community has to opt in before then if it is going to participate.

Trustee Oddy said the committee will meet the first Wednesday of every month from 6:30 to 7:45 p.m. The first meeting will be Nov. 1 at the township hall. He said the meeting time was set just before the township meeting that night when Supervisor Morgan asked when a good time would be for him. Looks like Oddy is in charge. The public is invited to participate in the meetings, but they may only be able to talk for three minutes each.

The mysterious, unmarked school bus that was reportedly trying to pick up Van Buren Public School students Oct. 19 in the West Willow subdivision in Washtenaw County was found to be legitimate.

Pam Johnson, assistant to the superintendent, posted on the school web site that "Van Buren Public Schools was notified by the Washtenaw Sheriff's Office that the unmarked bus [that] morning was a new transportation provider for another school. The authorities noted that this was not an abduction scenario."

There had been a lot of chatter on Facebook and around the community that morning about someone trying to steal local kids, but it turned out to be nothing to be concerned about. Two Channel 7 trucks also were seen in town heading to the school district offices.

We got a call from a reader who wants to alert others to the most recent scam call, this one supposedly from DTE. She said the caller said you are behind on your electric bill and if you don't pay within an hour they will shut off your power.

The caller said to buy a Green Dot gift card at the General or Dollar Tree store.

Be alert: DTE does not do this.

At its Oct. 2 session, the Carleton Village Council passed an ordinance regulating the growing and sale of medical marijuana and dispensaries in the community. A 3% regulatory tax will be put on gross sales and 25% goes to the village, 5% to the Carleton PD, 30% to Monroe County, and 40% to the Metro Area Narcotics Trafficking Induction Squad.

At its work/study meeting on Oct. 10, the Sumpter Township Board of Trustees was advised by Supevisor John Morgan of a fact-finding committee he has set up to study the new Medical Marijuana Facilities Licensing Act that goes into effect at the end of this year.

The committee will be tasked with making a recommendation to the board about opting in or out of dispensaries and other aspects of the MMFLA.

"I don't have a clue what 'E' is all about," Supervisor Morgan said, referring to item E on that night's agenda. "I don't know why it's even on here."

Item E read: "Consider holding a public informational meeting regarding the changes in the Michigan Medical Marijuana laws at the community center gym on November 2, 2017 at 6:30 p.m."

Clerk Esther Hurst said she put it on the agenda because she wanted more

"That's exactly what that committee's going to do," Supervisor Morgan said. "This is a conflict with what the board was going to do. The board didn't sanction

Clerk Hurst said people could come to the meeting and give their opinions and ask questions.

Trustee Matthew Oddy said citizens could go to the committee for presentations. He said he agrees with Clerk Hurst that the public should be able to give input.

"I don't believe it's undermining anybody on the board," said Treasurer Peggy Morgan concerning the meeting proposed. "It's to find out what the residents want ... see what our public thinks."

"Matt will allow people to come and present to the committee," Clerk Hurst said. "I didn't know that."

Trustee Don LaPorte said even the state

of Michigan doesn't know what the rules are. He asked if the committee would be hearing both sides -- those for and against.

"It's fair to the public to hear both sides," Treasurer Morgan said. "We should vote on that meeting tonight."

Oddy said the committee wouldn't have an agenda and it would be glad to have people come to its meetings.

"The state doesn't know what each hand is doing," said Mary Ban. "Don't put your cart before your horse ... Maybe people have their own little agenda ... There's a lot of people who have their own agendas."

She said people had come to the township meeting who made the marijuana business sound glamorous.

"It's not," Ban said. "It's ruining a lot of lives.'

When the regular meeting began and the board got to approval of agenda, Oddy made the motion to approve the agenda with the removal of item E and LaPorte seconded. The motion was approved without dissent.

Don Pittman asked why item E was removed and Supervisor Morgan said the board is setting up a committee to study it and help the board make a decision.

"It's open to the public," Oddy said again, noting it would be securing information.

"I thought it was good for the public to express their opinions," Pittman said.


Oddy said the state hasn't released the rules and regulations which isn't giving residents enough information.

Board attorney Rob Young said there are no rules. He said the head of LARA called him and said he heard Sumpter Township was opting into the MMFLA.

Supervisor Morgan said he didn't want to have a big debate on this right then and Oddy said it's not an agenda item any more, so the man would have to give his opinion at the end of the meeting.

Young said LARA chairman Rick





Johnson expressed to him that they have no rules and communities are looking for information and infrastructure rules. He said they will be asking for the background of the applicant and years of tax returns.

Supervisor Morgan cut off the discussion and went on with the agenda items.

During his police report, Chief Eric Luke reported on the recent 5K Heroes on Hines run. He said 10 members of his department plus 13 friends and family took part. The Sumpter department won a \$500 cash prize which will be used for a new memorial of the late Officer Roy Graham at the police department. Lt. Patrick Gannon participated in the half marathon, Chief Luke said.

"Chief Luke and the police department does a great job," said Supervisor Morgan. "Anyone who bends down to disparage you...All the people in Sumpter Township appreciate you ... We appreciate you... We all thank you. .. We all think you're doing a great job." There was a standing ovation

"My officers make my job easy," responded Chief Luke. "With that pride, when somebody attacks my department ... I'm very disppointed in last week's paper... It portrays my department as out of control ... I reached out to the Independent to let them know what I think. They threw the department under the bus with no justification."

In other business at the Oct. 10 meeting

• Heard Supervisor Morgan announce

the members of his MMFLA fact-finding committee: Supervisor Morgan, Trustee Oddy, Trustee Sheena Barnes, planning consultant Chris Akins, Police Chief Luke, Fire Chief Joe Januszyk, and Ken Bednark. They will meet and set regular meeting times which will be announced to the public. Attorney Young said if people wished to present information, they can;

- Awarded the septic bid for 26781 Sumpter Road to Artistic Landcare & Site Utilities for \$19,900, contingent upon all proper permits obtained and township attorney Young's review. This is housing rehab and will be paid with federal Community Development Block Grant funds: and
- Approved Chief Luke's recommendation to send Sgts. John Toth, Beth Egerer, and Brian Steffani to Police Staff and Command training starting February 2018 and ending in October 2018. This entails one week a month and cost is \$3,000 per student. Paid for with forfeiture money.

The balanced budget reflects a return of \$253K to the General Fund in 2017 and a projected budget of \$17.4 million in 2018 which includes dedicating 4.0 mil to long term debt. The General Fund Budget, as approved, states that A) Revenue in excess of those noted shall be dedicated to fund balance, B) Fiscal year line items, which are not expensed, shall revert to net income, C) Approval of appendices noted as part of the General Fund Budget, D) Revenue as "Tax Administrative Fee" is to continue as is past practice. The allocated millage for Township operations 7.4144, represents .9144 for Township Operations and 6.50 mills for Public Safety. E) Adoption by departmental total and F) approval of the October 17, 2017 Final 2017 General Fund Amended Budget supersedes any prior resolution. Board members praised the budget process, adherence to timelines and inclusion in the decision-making process. Trustee White, voting no, explained that he felt the recent public safety millage was a bait and switch to fund long term debt and changes made to the budget to fund the Developmental Services Department reorganization were in the planning before notice to the Board.

Budd moved, Miller seconded to approve Resolution 2017-22 the 2017 amended and 2018 proposed Special Revenue Funds. Motion Carried. The Special Revenue Budgets are: Community Development Block Grant as the projects apply to the Township's fiscal year, Downtown Development Authority, Local Development Finance Authority, Federal Forfeiture Fund, State Forfeiture Fund, E-911 Service Fund, Landfill Fund, Belleville Area Museum and Long-Term Debt Fund. Revenue in excess of those noted shall be dedicated to fund balance and items not expensed shall

Martin moved, Wright seconded to approve the job descriptions and personal services agreements for James Taylor, Matthew Best and Ron Akers. The restructuring proposal consolidates the Public Services and Planning & Economic Development Department into one Public Services Department. This would formalize the relationship between Water and Sewer, Building and Grounds and Economic Development, focuses on the strengths of Departmental Management, puts in place a transitional succession plan and provides an overall reduction to the General Fund of \$40,900. Board members opposing the restructuring proposed the implementation of a Director of Building and Grounds, graduated pay increase for a Public Services Director, highlighted the current staffing level, and the shifting of job responsibilities. Following several Board member comments Wright moved to call the question, Budd seconded. Roll Call vote. Yeas: McNamara, Budd, Wright, Frazier, Martin, Miller and White. Motion Carried. The vote on the motion was taken. Roll Call Vote. Yeas: McNamara, Budd, Wright and Martin. Nays: Frazier, Miller and White. Motion Carried.

Budd moved, Wright seconded to approve the purchase of one 2018 Ford F-150 XL Extended Cab from Atchinson Ford in the amount of \$25,103.16. Three quotes were received and Atchinson Ford was the lowest in accordance with the Township purchasing policy 5% discount for local vendors. The truck will be assigned to the Building Official in the Developmental Services Department and eventually transferred to the fleet pool. Board members opposing felt a consensus on the cab size and bed length had been reached during the Work Study Session and an "upgraded" vehicle was not necessary.
