BHS, beats Saline, wins district title for 4th year in a row

On Friday, before a standing-roomonly crowd, the Belleville High School Tigers varsity football team beat the Saline Hornets, 42-7, in the 2024 Michigan High School Athletic Association District 1

The Tigers, now 10-1, will play Detroit Catholic Central (9-0), in the Region 3 final next weekend. The Tigers are hoping to win their third state title in four years, after missing out last year.

The crowd at the BHS field on Friday lined the fence around the entire field and packed both stands after a busload of Michigan State University football fans arrived.

They joined the two schools' fanbases in the stadium and wore specially printed shirts to try to encourage the nation's No.

1 quarterback prospect Bryce Underwood and four-star defensive back Elijah Dotson to back off their commitments to other universities and stay "home" in Michigan after their 2025 graduation from BHS.

Underwood has committed to Louisiana State University and Dotson has committed to Pittsburgh.

Belleville athletic director Joe Brodie confirmed to the Detroit Free Press that former Michigan football assistant Connor Stalions is "around" but did not officially hire him as a member of the coaching staff. Stalions was in the Belleville coaching box with a headset on. The Free Press reported Stalions was vocal over the headset when Belleville had the ball. The Free Press was told earlier that he is not on staff.

Stalions, who resigned from Michigan

after he became the subject of the Wolverines' NCAA investigation for sign-stealing, was the unpaid defensive coordinator for Mumford High School (who finished 1-8) and also served as head coach for one game.

Stalions was not available for an interview postgame, but the Free Press reported it was told that he is helping with the offense and "observing Bryce (Underwood)."

On Monday, Channel 4 announced it


had confirmed that Stalions is coaching Underwood and has been hired to call plays during the BHS playoffs.



the fourth proposal, which was to eliminate the Civil Service Commission.

They approved allowing the council to set its meeting times and dates, approved eliminating roll-call votes on every matter acted on by the council, and approved changes to purchase procedures.

Proposal 4, to delete the Chapter on the Civil Service Commission, was turned down in a 815 yes to 962 no vote.

Proposal 1 got 1,381 yes votes and 437 no votes; Proposal 2 got 1,254 yes votes and 546 no votes; and Proposal 3 got 936 yes votes and 859 no votes.

City voters were 57.05% for Harris/Walz for president and 41.40% for Trump/Vance.

They voted 58.19% for U.S. Senate candidate Elissa Slotkin and 38.70% for Mike Rogers.

The vote for Debbie Dingell for Congress was 59.99% and for Heather Smiley it was 37.10%

State Rep. Reggie Miller got 61.11% of the vote and Dale Biniecki got 38.44%. State Board of Education, top two,

were Theodore Jones, 28.61%, and Adam Frederick Zemke, 27.28%.

Regent of the University of Michigan, top two, were Denise Illitch, 30.04%, and Shauna Ryder Diggs, 29.17%.

Trustee of Michigan State University, top two, Rebecca Bahar-Cook, 29.44%, and Thomas Stallworth III, 27.90%.

In the Nov. 5 General Election in Van Buren Township, 4,329 were early voters, 5,505 turned out on election day and there were 8,010 absentee voters.

17,844 total voters turned out of the 25,658 total registered voters for a 69.55% turnout.

All of the VBT board members listed on the ballot won election. The writein candidate for township trustee was unsuccessful.

VBT voters were 61.02% for Harris/Walz for president and 36.68% for Trump/Vance.

They voted 61.75% for U.S. Senate candidate Elissa Slotkin and 34.71% for Mike Rogers.

The vote for Debbie Dingell for Congress was 63.86% and for Heather Smiley it was 33.17%

State Rep. Reggie Miller got 65.36% of

the vote and Dale Biniecki got 34.19%.

In the Nov. 5 General Election Sumpter Township voters reelected Republican Tim Bowman as township supervisor over challenger Nelson Po, who ran as a Democrat.

Bowman earned 3,348 (59%) votes and Po got 2,236 (39.81%).

Other township officials were running unopposed on the Republican ticket.

There were 5,987 votes cast of the 9,326 registered voters in Sumpter, making a turnout of 64.2%.

Crowd honors military veterans at Monday ceremony in Belleville

It was a sunny day with a cold wind off the lake on Monday, when a crowd gathered at the Veterans Memorial in Belleville to honor military veterans retired and in

It was disappointing, however, when it came time to watch them lay the wreaths at the memorial. There were only two wreaths, one from the Veterans of Foreign Wars and one from the Polish Legion of American Veterans, with four empty spaces left.

That's what happened last Veterans Day, as well. Before that, in past years, representatives from the city of Belleville and Van Buren and Sumpter townships would each place a wreath. Five places were filled with colorful displays. And then the representatives, usually veterans themselves, would say a few words explaining the importance of the young men and women who serve to keep our country safe.

George Kennedy, commander of the PLAV, told those gathered that the VFW and PLAV had members that were getting old and ailing and they needed new members. He asked the younger veterans to step forward and join the groups. The present veterans were able to do the gun salute. The crowd joined in on the "National Athem" led by Lori Day and Geof Bush. Last year Clerk Leon Wright from Van Buren Township (a veteran) and State Rep. Reggie Miller were in the audience, but didn't speak. This year, not an official in sight.

After they learned that his handwriting had deteriorated because of the Parkinson's, they were satisfied and his ballot was accepted.

Another reader said something similar happened to her family a few years ago when her husband was fighting muscular dystrophy. She took him to the VBT hall with paperwork to show them and they were satisfied his handwriting was different because of the circumstances.

Thanks to Clerk Leon Wright and his team for being so careful with our ballots. We appreciate that a lot.

Martha Hanoian is no longer executive director of the Belleville Area Chamber of Commerce. She assures us everything is in place for Winter Fest, which begins in

a few weeks.

The Belleville City Council was scheduled to meet on Veterans Day, Monday, Nov. 11, but then moved its meeting to Tuesday, Nov. 12. That was the same day as the Belleville Area District Library. Both meetings will have reports for next week's edition.

The courts and the city and townships were closed on Veterans Day, but the school district wasn't. That meeting went on as scheduled and a report is in this week's paper.

We've been told that the reason the

schools close when they are used for a voting precinct is to protect the voters who are sex offenders, who have a right to vote. The law is that those labeled as sex offenders cannot be near children, so if the kids were in school the sex offenders couldn't vote. Who knew?

Van Buren Township is considering ways to relocate its voting precincts to other locations than schools. Good idea.

On Haggerty Road, just north of the Savage Road that runs into Belleville, on Monday there were two dead deer besides the roadway. One was a mature deer, on the east side of the road that had been there for five days. On Monday there was a new dead deer. A very young deer. A driver told me the way it was facing, it looked like it saw its mother lying along the roadway and tried to get to its mother and also got hit by a vehicle. It was heart breaking, he said.

It takes quite a while for dead deer to be removed by the county.

Millie Baker, who with her husband started the all-school reunion at BHS, is recovering from a heart attack. She is 98 years old and celebrated her 80th BHS reunion this year. Get well, soon, Millie.

Van Buren School Supt. Pete Kudlak is having problems with the selection of his coaches, it seems. At Monday's school board meeting, a group of parents and students waited patiently until the end of the meeting to get up and speak about the problems with the bowling coach. They said they had followed the chain of command and talked to Supt. Kudlak and he didn't do anything about it. So, they came to the school board.

Also on Monday, Channel 4 News led off its 6 o'clock news with interviews about the new football coach hired to help push the BHS Tigers back to the state championship. Because the new coach's reputation is that of a cheater, many school employees have

been unhappy with the selection.

At Monday's meeting, Kudlak said having football provisional coaches is not unusual and a former head coach came back to

help before. And, Coach Rogers will be able to help out, as well as the other coach.

"If you see something that might help us ... we can't be scared to try," he said.

Kudlak said bringing the provisional coaches onboard has been, "bumpy along the way."

He referred to Conner Stalions who was no longer with the University of Michigan because of accusations of stealing signs from opposing teams.

To the editor:

In today's world, I have noticed there are many that only want to share negative comments and/or posts about their experiences either with stores, schools, other individuals and this includes police.

I know there are good and bad people out there, but it seems like no one ever takes the time to acknowledge when a person does something good.

Please let me explain. After my divorce my ex moved to a different state and conned my son into making him his payee for his Social Security disability even though my son did not and does not live with him and only saw him about one weekend (at the most) a month, even maybe every two

You see, when someone is on SSI, that money is supposed to be spent on that individual's living expenses, doctor bills, food, phone, etc., just like everyone else. My ex was using my son's SS money for rent for himself, his girlfriend, and her three children.

I went twice to the SS building in Inkster on Cherry Hill to explain this to them, showing his state ID for Michigan, his school records and their final words were, "There is nothing we can do since your son is over 18." Basically, they were of no

I was lost on what to do. Thinking maybe I could file a police report for theft of my son's SS monthly check, I called the Van Buren police department one night crying and ended up talking to Sergeant Mark Abdilla. He just sat there and listened to me get it all out and then told me what I could do to help my son's situation.

The next day, I followed his instructions and about a couple of months later, my son started receiving his SS again. Not only did he take the time out of his busy day to just sit there and listen to a complete stranger cry, he helped my son.

So, this letter is to the Township Supervisor, Chief of Police, and the many wonderful people of Van Buren Twp./Belleville. I would like the whole community to know what a great guy Sergeant Mark Abdilla is.





PASTOR WILLIAM ELLERBEE HILL

(December 11, 1933 – October 6, 2024)

Pastor William E. Hill was born on December 11, 1933 to the union of Mr. Tobe E. Hill and his wife Mattie Lucy (Cole) Hill in Lauderdale, Mississippi.

Willie, as he was lovingly known, moved to Detroit, MI, at the age of 11 with his parents. Willie enjoyed playing sports, especially baseball which he excelled in. establish a church in Sumpter Township named The Body of Christ Church of God.





- Teresa Patton got 21,086 total votes (63.72%) and Robert Coutts 11,336 total votes (34.26%) for 34th District Court Judge.
- Reggie Miller got 25,734 total votes

(51.9%) and Dale Biniecki got 23,869 total votes (48.1%) for state representative in the 31st District.

• Van Buren Public Schools Board of Education seats had voters in both Wayne and Washtenaw counties participating. Totals are for the top four are: Dionne Falconer, 11,023; Wade Fields, 9,505; Victor DeLibera, 9,015; and David W. Shall, 8,561. Billie Jo Harsch earned 8,028

votes and there were 1,437 write-ins.

- Belleville District Library board candidates were unopposed. Vote totals were: Maria Jackson-Smith, 10,715 (34.26%); Joy Cichiewicz, 10,316 (32.98%), and Alma Hughes-Grubbs, 9,653 (30.86%).




