## School Board honors Cooper Mears as National Merit finalist

At Monday's meeting of the Van Buren Public Schools Board of Education, Belleville High School senior Cooper Mears was honored for his recently announced National Merit Scholarship finalist designation.

Mears is the son of Angela and Todd Mears of Van Buren Township.

Cooper is ranked first out of 392 BHS seniors with a cumulative grade point average of 4.764 as of the end of the first semester of the 2025-26 school year. In addition to his courses at BHS, he also completed Calculus 3 at Washtenaw Community in the fall semester and is currently enrolled in Linear Algebra for the winter semester.

He has completed nine Advanced Placement (AP) courses through the 11th grade and achieved two 4s and seven 5s on the AP examinations, with 5 being the max score.

He has been recognized by the College Board with an AP Scholarship with Honors Award, an AP Scholar with Distinction Award and a School Recognition Award for Outstanding Academic Achievement.

Cooper participates in Euchre and Chess Clubs at BHS, is the vice president of National Honor Society, is the treasurer for Science Olympiad, is the secretary for the Ecology Club, is a squad leader in Marching Band, and is first chair flute and piccolo in Symphony Band. He is also a past member of the award-winning Robotics team.

Outside of school, Cooper is a member of the Civic Philharmonic Orchestra, which is one of the Civic Youth Ensembles through the Detroit Symphony Orchestra organization for the 2025-26 season.

In his free time, he enjoys baking for his friends, family and teachers, volunteering and tutoring.

Cooper will be attending the University of Michigan College of Literature, Science and the Arts, and expects to major in Math.

He qualified to be a semi-finalist with a perfect score on the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT).





## Audience scolds school board for anti-ICE antics

A bag of trash picked up from the yard of St. Anthony Catholic Church was left on the floor before the Van Buren Public Schools Board of Education at Monday's regular meeting.

When public comment time came around, the bag with 22 water bottles and a cell phone was put before the board to show them what the Belleville High School demonstrators against ICE on Feb. 13 left on church property. Members of the school board were reminded they had supported the demonstration, which was put in place with the help of the BHS principal.

It was pointed out that only two students, who attend by internet, were on the church property with a truck and a big Trump sign, to give their opinion on the demonstration. The BHS students were flinging full water bottles at the students and could have caused concussions, one speaker said.

Language on the BHS signs carried outside included "F--- Trump" and similar language was on signs in the school's restrooms, they said. Teachers saw the signs, they told the board.

Other complaints were about Mamma K, a security guard, who was accused of grabbing a student's bra to see if she had a wire and being responsible for students being withheld from lunch. They begged the board to intercede "before somebody gets hurt."

Board vice-president Dionne Falconer told the speakers that School Supt. Kudlak would be in touch with them and take care of all their complaints.

 Because of this, I wanted to send over/offer my opinion and insight on the matter. Especially regarding the article published, as previously mentioned, and how I support the points acknowledged.



# SEMCOG to present check to Belleville at new city hall March 2

The Southeastern Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG) will present a check for \$552,890 for pedestrian safety to the city of Belleville at the city council's first official meeting at its new city hall at 330 Charles St.

The meeting, which is open to the public, starts at 6:30 p.m., Monday, March 2. Entry into the meeting room is through a location at the rear of the building.

The Transportation Alternatives Program

(TAP) grant of federal funds is for Main Street traffic calming and pedestrian improvements.

The special presentation during the meeting will include remarks from city leadership and SEMCOG, as well as state and federal elected leaders and staff.

The Belleville project includes installing a single-lane roundabout at Third Street, curb bump-outs, and raised crosswalks on Main Street at Fourth to slow traffic, improve pedestrian access, and meet ADA standards.

The project has a goal of reducing traffic-related crashes and serious injuries; implementing equity-driven

solutions to ensure transportation safety and accessibility; promoting active transportation modes such as walking and biking by creating safer pathways and crossings; enhancing safety and accessibility along Main Street; and supporting the local businesses and economic vitality that rely on this key community corridor.

The TAP grant is funded through the federal government and recipients selected by local elected leaders through the SEMCOG Regional Review process.

## Trial group being set up to teach young people to talk to peers on suicide

At the Feb. 18 meeting of the Belleville Downtown Development Authority, DDA member Valerie Kelley-Bonner said her 13-year-old cousin Ry'Ann had shot and killed herself the day before.

It was in the woods behind Haggerty subdivision near the strip mall.

She said she is setting up a trial group to teach young adults to talk with their friends – to teach them what you say to someone who feels like that.

Kelley-Bonner is executive director of SOOAR (Strategies to Overcome Obstacles and Avoid Recidivism) with an office on South Street.

In the past, Kelley-Bonner said her program works with those suffering from HIV, Hep C, thoughts of suicide, and COVID, along with those on drugs.

She said they meet with people and are connected to the Wayne/Oakland Integrated Health program, with faith and prayers a part of the program. Bonner said they give Narcan out and toiletries.


