Michael Lee accepts plea deal for armed robbery of pharmacy

Confessed armed robber Michael Earl-Chavis Lee, 28, of Lincoln Park, has accepted a plea deal that includes 8-10 years in prison plus a 2-year mandatory gun charge.

On Jan. 21 in Wayne County Circuit Court Judge Megan Brennan's courtroom, Lee accepted the plea deal that his attorney Ronald McDuffie and Assistant Wayne Prosecutor Frank Simone had worked out.

For pleading guilty to count 1, armed robbery, and count 5, felony firearm, two additional counts of armed robbery and one count of felonious assault with a dangerous weapon were dismissed.

A reference to Lee being named a Habitual Offender-4 was withdrawn. Lee's accomplice, 15-year-old Jessie James Hawkins from Inkster, accepted a guilty plea in December.

Judge Brennan asked Prosecutor Simone to establish a factual basis for the guilty

Through Simone's questioning, Lee admitted that on Oct. 24 he entered Health Smart Pharmacy in Van Buren Township at 10824 Belleville Road with his accomplice and pointed a gun at a person.

He said he stole "a bag of pharmaceutical pills" and then left the store and threw a gun in a retention pond.

Lee's sentencing is scheduled for Feb. 5.





'It's so cold the dogs are sticking to the sidewalks'

"It's so cold the dogs are sticking to the sidewalks."

That was a line from Thornton Wilder's Pulitzer Prize-winning play "The Skin of Our Teeth" presented by the students at Belleville High School in 1958. That line is hard to forget. And, now, it has come close to reality.

When driving into downtown Belleville at 9:30 a.m. Monday and Tuesday, Main Street was empty. Some drivers said it looked like a ghost town. Too cold.

The schools were closed again on Monday and Tuesday and maybe Wednesday (it was past our deadline to find out about Wednesday). No school buses rolling or teachers driving into classes. No students trudging to school. Too cold.

It appears the school district is past the six snow days on the schedule, so now it either has to be longer school days or more school days added.

The township halls were closed on Tuesday, but City Hall remained open. City Hall is always open, even if there are just a few workers on the job.

And, the dogs are sticking to the sidewalks – almost. They sure don't stay out long.

Isn't it sad that we all are bundled up and hunkered down waiting for Groundhog Day on Feb. 2 to give us hope that spring could actually be coming?

About seven weeks of winter left on the calendar. Hang in there, everyone.

EXTRA THINGS I KNOW

VBT Officer Fred Yono came to see me last Thursday afternoon after our paper was on the streets with my comments about his retirement. He will finish off his 35-year career with VBT PD tomorrow, Jan. 31.

He told me he will then be working part time for Huron Township, working traffic. I had said I heard he was going to be a reserve. No. He'll be working as a paid officer and we'll probably see him over at 34th District Court in the future in a Huron uniform tending to traffic tickets.

Fred said he is expected to be officially hired at a February meeting of the Huron Township Board of Trustees.

He said someone from the Huron PD came to him to ask about the rumor that he was retiring. Fred responded that he was retiring and Huron PD asked him to come work for them, about three days a week.

I will say in the last eight years since Fred put together VBT's traffic unit, we have heard nothing but compliments about Officer Yono's method of handling a traffic stop. Polite, professional, quick. He said he believes he wrote 200 tickets a month. I believe it.

Sorry to see him go. Huron will benefit big-time. Lt. Ernie Thornsbury is leaving tomorrow, too. He's a longtime good officer, as well. And, they tell me, Lt. Dennis Brooks is retiring in September.

I received the following email about the district library story in last week' paper: "It infuriates me that \$65,000 has been spent SO FAR on a new library building project and \$40,640 approved for architectural services! Wouldn't it make more sense to spend whatever it takes to immediately

repair our EXISTING library's roof since leaks have swamped the offices and caused ceilings to fall in? We need to appreciate and be responsible for what we already have. Guess whose millage vote has been decided?"

A few weeks ago, I was delighted to see that the sidewalk along the east side of Belleville Road, just north of the bridge, had been cleared of snow and people were walking into town on the cleared sidewalk. That sidewalk usually is not cleared in the winter.

Later, I saw a Wayne County grader scraping Belleville Road and throwing all the salty slush onto the sidewalk, making it impassable again.

I'm sure that problem will be worked out before any library with planned wider sidewalks along the roadway is built there. There's a space problem, so they really can't use up any of the proposed parking spaces to push the sidewalk farther into the site. Time will tell.

On Monday, the Sumpter Township Board of Trustees meeting for Tuesday was cancelled because there was only one item on the agenda and it could wait until a February meeting. Then, later in the day it was announced the township hall would be closed entirely on Tuesday because of the forecast severe cold weather.

Van Buren Township also closed its

township hall on Tuesday because of the really frigid weather that was forecast: Below-zero temperatures and windchills of -30 degrees or so.

The Belleville City Hall, however, was open and functioning on Tuesday. Belleville

City Hall also was open the last time VBT and Sumpter closed their offices for the weather. Tough in the city.

Van Buren Township has set an all-day work/

study session for Saturday, Feb. 8, to begin at 8:30 a.m. The single topic for discussion is "Strategic Planning" and it's going to be facilitated by representatives from SEMCOG (Southeastern Michigan Council of Governments).

This should be interesting. What have they got in mind? A police chief from outside? A millage proposal? Hmm.

It's open to the public except for the closed door session on the agenda at the end.

Al Ostrowski of Van Buren Township has been pretty busy with his animal control business. Al says raccoons give birth in January and that is why so many are trying to get into houses and other warm places these days, to make it comfortable for the little family. He recently retrieved a sleeping raccoon from a kitchen counter in

a house along Belleville Road.

Kevin McNamara announces for Wayne County Executive

On Thursday, Wayne County Commissioner Kevin M. McNamara, D-Belleville, announced his candidacy for Wayne County Executive in front of a crowd of elected officials, members of labor, business leaders, community leaders, and county residents.

And, McNamara's son Cullan read an

endorsement by former Michigan Governor Jennifer Granholm: "Kevin McNamara has Wayne County in his very DNA. But more importantly, Kevin has a gut for real people, and knows that the best government is one that fights for their

needs. That, too, is in Kevin's DNA. He's a decent and honest man, a compassionate soul and a champion for the little guy – a tremendous blend of qualities for the next Wayne County Executive."

Present County Executive Robert Ficano has yet to announce whether he is running for reelection. Also recently announcing as a candidate for County Executive was William Wild, mayor of Westland. State Rep. Phil Cavanagh, D-Redford Township, also is a possible candidate.

The primary election is Aug. 5.

"The possibilities for our county are greater than our challenges," said McNamara in a news release on Friday. "Wayne County residents are seeking real, sustainable change. "I plan to form a task force that represents communities across this county so that they have a voice in reinventing Wayne County. Together, we will prioritize services and I project significant cost savings during that process."

McNamara is son of the late Wayne County Executive Edward H. McNamara who served from 1987 to 2002. Edward McNamara is probably best known for overseeing the \$1.6 billion expansion of Detroit Metropolitan Wayne County Airport, including two new runways and the new Edward H. McNamara Terminal.

"There needs to be a reinvention of county government like there was in the 1960s and 1980s," said McNamara. "Together, we can reinvent Wayne County government through a new model that will be strong for at least the next 20 years."

Michael Leak bound over to circuit court on stolen truck charges

After listening to the testimony of three police officers on the details of a truck theft

and wild chase, 34th District Court Judge David Parrott bound defendant Michael Leak over to circuit court.

Following Leak's preliminary hearing on Jan. 23, Judge Parrott found there was enough

evidence that a felony had been committed and Leak had been involved.

Leak, 49, will be arraigned on the information on Jan. 29 at 3rd Circuit Court at the Frank Murphy Hall of Justice in Detroit. He remained in the Wayne County Jail under \$50,000 bond.

Leak's court-appointed attorney is David Lankford.

During the preliminary exam Wayne County Assistant Prosecutor Kristen Capling presented the sworn testimony of three police officers to show probable cause.

The first witness called by the prosecution was Van Buren Township Police Officer Scott Griggs. Officer Griggs testified that while on patrol at 4:41 p.m., Jan. 10, he received a phone call with a description

of a stolen vehicle heading northbound on Rawsonville Road.

Griggs said he was nearby driving a fully marked VBT police SUV, and immediately proceeded to the area. He said he spotted the suspect stolen vehicle, a white F-350 dually, proceeding north on Rawsonville. Griggs said he followed directly behind it with his lights and siren on. He said the vehicle made a U-turn just past the I-94 entrance ramp.

He pursued the truck, which went southbound through traffic lights with speeds up to 80 mph. Griggs said the truck collided with a U-Haul truck and ran several other vehicles off the road.

Griggs said his sergeant terminated the chase at the VBT border. Griggs said he made a U-turn at Bemis Road, going back to look for the damaged U-Haul.

Under cross examination by Leak's attorney Lankford, Griggs said he was alone in the patrol car and identified the truck by description and license plate.

The next witness called by Capling was Sumpter Police Sergeant James Cayce. Sgt. Cayce testified he responded to a dispatch call on a stolen vehicle that had last been seen backing out of the owner's drive at 4:30 p.m. in the 11000 block of Rawsonville Road.

Cayce said the keys had not been in the vehicle and it had not been running (as previously reported).

While on the scene, Cayce said he heard on his police radio that VBT was pursuing the vehicle southbound on Rawsonville Road and the chase had been terminated. Being six miles south of where the pursuit was stopped, Cayce said he left the scene of the theft, heading north. He said he drove into Augusta Woods trailer park and turned off his overhead lights.

Michigan State Police Trooper Raymond Matthews testified that he had been listening to the be-on-the-lookout police calls while in the area of I-94 and M-23. He said he quickly headed east on I-94.

Along the way, Matthews said he heard VBT had been in pursuit and had terminated. He said he also heard the vehicle had been found by Sumpter PD in Augusta Woods.

Matthews said he drove to Augusta Woods and met up with Cayce, parking in an opposite direction so both drivers could easily speak to each other through the drivers' windows, with Matthews facing into the park.

Across Rawsonville Road from Augusta Woods is a business, A2Mac1.

Matthews said Cayce gave him some information and after speaking for about a minute they noticed the suspect vehicle, occupied by one, driving north on Rawsonville. They said they saw the vehicle turn into the parking lot at A2Mac1 and back into a parking space.

Testimony said Cayce drove across Rawsonville Road into the parking lot with Matthews following. As they drove across the parking lot, the truck came towards them and kept accelerating. To avoid being hit, Cayce first, followed by Matthews, made quick right turns. The truck came within five feet of hitting the Sumpter patrol car, according to testimony.

The truck exited the parking lot making a sharp left turn into a snow bank. Matthews used the push bumper on the front of his patrol car to force the vehicle deeper into the snow bank preventing its escape. The suspect was subsequently taken into custody, according to testimony.

Leak's attorney asked that the videos from the pursuit and apprehension, including Sgt. Cayce's patrol car videos and the A2Mac1 security cameras be preserved.

Leak was charged with: unlawful driving away of a motor vehicle, receiving and concealing stolen motor vehicle, third-degree fleeing a police officer, assault with a dangerous weapon (times 2) and fourth-degree fleeing a police officer.

If he is convicted and given the maximum

sentences, he would get 25 years in prison.

Leak has been charged as a habitual offender. This is his fifth arrest for unlawful driveaway. He has also been convicted of escaping from prison, fleeing from a police officer, several B&Es and receiving and concealing stolen property.
