## Chris Zweng asks questions of city council before resigning

At the end of Monday’s meeting in the new city hall on Charles Street, Assistant Fire Chief Chris Zweng had questions for the council. His questions were cut short. When he was done he resigned from the fire department.

Members of the City Council, I am requesting clarification and accountability regarding public access to council meetings, as well as transparency about the costs associated with the new city hall project.

First, regarding meeting access:

Approximately one month ago, when I was unable to attend a council meeting in person, obtaining the livestream was extremely difficult. I ultimately received a link only after the director of public safety contacted the city

manager, who then sent her the link. This is not an appropriate or accessible process for the public.

Unlike neighboring municipalities such as Sumpter, the city’s “Meetings and Agendas” webpage contains no links to livestreams or recordings. This raises several questions:

1. What is the official method for the public to view live city council meetings?
2. Where can residents access recorded meetings if they are unable to attend?
3. Why are livestream or video links not posted directly on the city website alongside agendas and materials, as is standard practice in many communities?
4. What steps will the council take to ensure that public access and transparency are not hindered by unnecessary barriers?

Additionally, regarding the new city hall: Over the past several months, the Independent newspaper has repeatedly

## District Library to ask city to help share cost of maintaining parking lot

Shortly after John Juriga was sworn into being a temporary member of the Belleville Area District Library Board, he broached the subject of maintenance of the library-city 90 space parking lot between the library and the new city hall.

This was at the March 10 meeting of the board, which had just approved a very detailed landscape service proposal with low-bidder DC Lawn and Snow of Carleton. The first year of the agreement is \$5,600 and the second year is \$5,920. DC

is the library’s current snow removal and lawn care contractor.

The other bidder was DJ’s Landscape Management of Romulus which bid \$8,283 for the first year and \$8,531.49 for the second year of the agreement.

Library director Mary Jo Suchy said the library has been in place for six years now and the trees are growing. The new service proposal was prepared after the boxwoods were removed because they weren’t doing well.

Juriga, who served on the library board

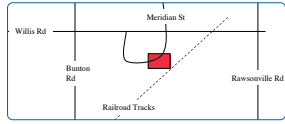

asked for the total amount spent on the new city hall project. The only response provided by the city manager has been, "I will look into it," with no further information.

5. Exactly how much money has been spent to date on the new city hall project, including construction, furnishings, equipment, architectural services, and any additional related expenses?

6. Why has this information not been provided despite multiple public requests?

7. When will the city publish a complete, itemized accounting of all city hall expenses?

Public information should not require repeated inquiries, delays, or evasive answers. These are straightforward transparency issues.

Statement and questions for council member Kissel:

Council member Kissel, I am bringing forward a series of questions that require clear and direct answers for the public record. These concerns involve your conduct at the fire hall on March 10, as well as your ongoing involvement in fire-department-related matters.

On Tuesday, March 10, at approximately 6:30 p.m., you were observed going through my personal locker at the fire hall. This is not an area open to the public, the fire auxiliary, or elected officials without authorization.

(At this point in the questioning, mayor Ken Voigt stopped Zweng from talking, saying he could make statements, but this is not a question-and-answer session. So Zweng read his resignation letter instead. Below, however, are the questions he wished to ask.)

I am requesting clear answers to the following:

1. Why did you access my locker?
2. What specifically were you attempting to locate?
3. If there was a legitimate reason to access my equipment or belongings, why was I not contacted or notified?
4. Were you acting under the authority of your role as a city council member?
5. If so, which other council members were aware of or approved this action?
6. If you were acting in connection with the fire auxiliary, please explain why you believed it was appropriate to enter a restricted area and access staff property, given that the auxiliary is permitted only to meet in the building and is not authorized to handle staff equipment or lockers.

I also need to address a broader concern regarding conflicts of interest.

You have a family member who serves

on the fire department and resides in your household, and you also participate in the fire auxiliary. These relationships create an appearance of bias when you engage in discussions, reviews, or votes concerning the fire department.

Accordingly:

7. Do you believe you should be recusing yourself from all fire-department-related matters, including budget discussions, operational decisions, and personnel votes?

8. Have you sought guidance from the city attorney or reviewed the city's ethics policies regarding whether your participation is appropriate?

9. If not, will you commit to doing so immediately so this issue can be formally evaluated?

Councilwoman Kissel insisted on being able to answer why she was going through his personal locker.

The mayor relented and let her speak. She said on March 10 the auxiliary met and they walked around the fire hall. She said she looked and saw keys hanging in front of a locker and found there was a radio inside. She said she asked if this radio shouldn't be plugged in for recharging.

Kissel said she does not like to be put in this kind of position of needing to explain.

The meeting then adjourned.

## Fire fighter resigns after 17 years of service

(Editor's Note: The following letter was read and then presented to the Belleville City Council at Monday's regular meeting.)

Good evening, citizens of Belleville,

After 17 years of service with the Belleville Fire Department, it is with deep sadness that I submit my resignation, effective immediately. This decision has not come easily. My wife, children, and I have made countless sacrifices for this department and this community, and it is difficult to accept that it has come to this point.

Now that my resignation is official, I feel I can finally speak openly without fear of repercussions.

For the past year and a half, I have carried out every responsibility asked of me by the director and city council -- performing the full duties of fire chief without the title or the pay. When the police chief resigned, an interim was appointed within three days. When the city manager was let go, an interim was appointed within hours. Yet when it came to the Fire Department -- referred to by the director as the "red-headed stepchild" -- I was never asked to fill the role, despite already doing the work.

As a union member who was never formally appointed interim chief, I was

restricted in what I could and could not do. The city took something that was functioning well and broke it.

Over the years, I have personally contributed thousands of dollars and countless hours to improve our station -- at no cost to the city. I epoxied the bay floor, provided and installed a \$6,000 furnace, donated furniture, built the benches and podium, and painted the entire common area. I installed a new kitchen and report room with flooring, saving the city more than \$30,000. Despite all of this, the city treated these contributions as though they meant nothing.

The staff believed in my ability to lead them. They made that clear. Yet I was never given the opportunity -- something I believe stems from personal feelings held by the mayor, who recently told me to "shut up" during a public meeting.

Even in the new city hall, the fire department remains excluded. The city manager and clerk sit at one table, the director of public safety and DPW at another, and no space was allocated for the fire chief. Once again, the fire department was pushed aside rather than included in leadership discussions.

Another concern is the hiring of consultant Gregg Flynn. The city paid \$15,000 -- \$10,000 for a report and \$5,000 for time as an embedded advisor beginning in December 2025. In March, the city extended this arrangement month-to-month. To date, Mr. Flynn has met with the fire staff only once, on Dec. 16, 2025. He has not contacted any firefighters or command staff since. The director claims he is reviewing our Standard Operating Procedures, yet those were updated in 2023, and no one in the department has been asked for input or shown any revisions.

The amount paid to Mr. Flynn in just three months exceeds what many of our firefighters earn in an entire year. Our firefighters receive no health insurance, no pension, and no paid time off -- yet they continue to serve with pride.

It has become clear that the city's leadership does not value loyalty, commitment, sacrifice, or respect for its employees. I served when we made less than minimum wage, and even now our staff averages under \$9,000 a year. Recently, the city let a police officer go after 25 years of service over a \$2-per-hour raise.

Most of us do not live in this community, yet we take tremendous pride in protecting it. The question becomes: for what, if this is how we are treated?

I was willing to take on the chief's position for the same pay as past chiefs -- around \$16,000 a year. Instead, the city now intends to pay nearly double for someone who may only push paperwork and may not be able to respond to calls in a reasonable time due to distance.

Another point worth noting is the

Director's recent statement that there were nine applicants for the fire chief position. If that is true, then -- excluding myself -- that leaves eight individuals who were supposedly eager to lead this department. Yet not one of those eight applied to join the department as a firefighter. That tells me everything I need to know: they wanted the title and the pay, not the responsibility, not the service, and not the community. Leadership should be earned through commitment and sacrifice, not pursued only when a higher-paying position becomes available.

The department is now down to seven fully trained staff members, one with only fire certification, and one with no licenses. I also want to clarify several points. My lieutenant and I wrote the 2025-2026 budget -- not the director, who made only minor adjustments. The staff fought to reinstate duty crews -- not the director. One of our fire fighters secured the turnout gear grant -- not Mr. Flynn or the director. I pushed for the new lockers, requested the new code books, and asked for the floor mats.

Regarding the grant equipment: during the initial fitting, I was asked whether we needed safety vests. I said no -- every staff member already has one, and we have eight more in storage. These vests cost about \$95 each. Last week, I was told that 15 had already been ordered. When I asked why we were spending money on items we do not need, the response was, "Why not?"

For more than a decade as an officer, our department has taken pride in staying within budget and avoiding unnecessary spending.

To the firefighters I have had the honor of serving beside for the past 17 years: thank you for your dedication, sacrifice, and commitment to this community. I am proud of the work we have done together and the department we built. My hope is that the citizens of Belleville continue to support the men and women who respond when you call for help. They deserve leadership that supports them just as strongly.

Van Buren Township said it is happy to have Google. Some say the details released are concerning. Once this edition goes to press, we will have time to read the details.

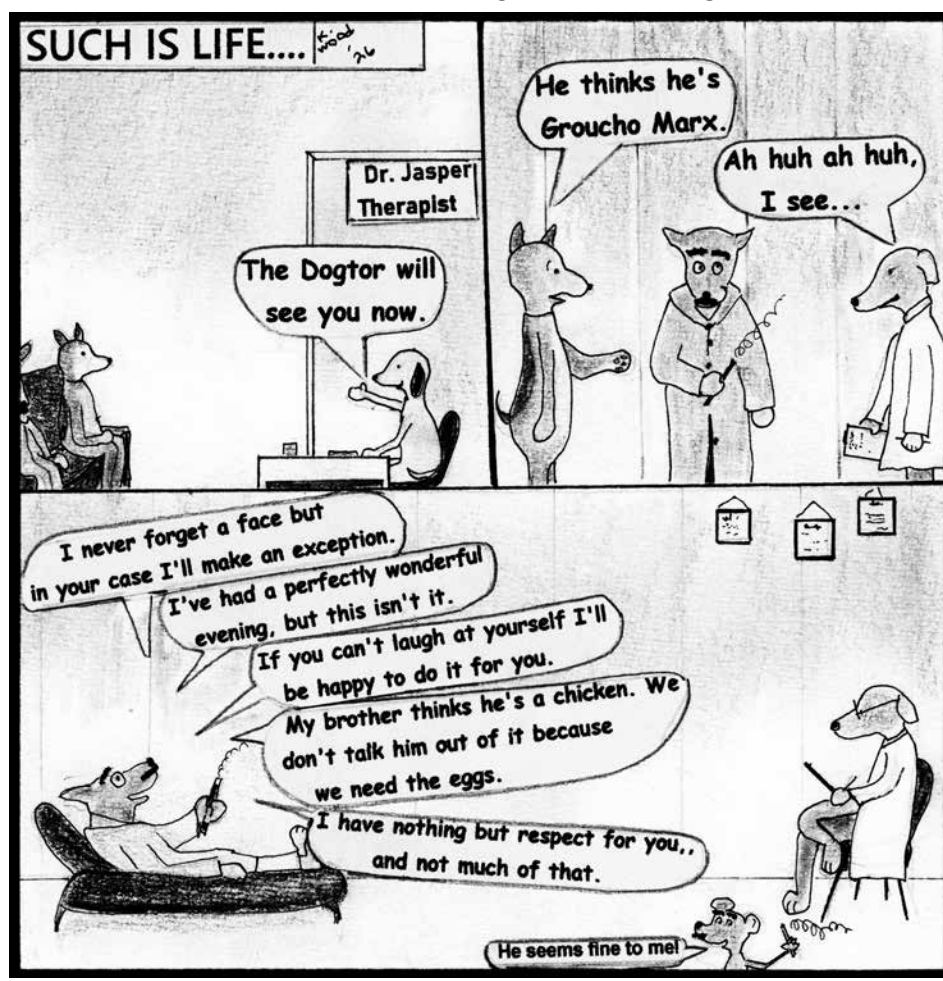

**Time for VBT to step out of Belleville's shadow**


To the Editor:  
 Isn't it time for Van Buren Township to step out from Belleville's shadow?  
 Belleville Road runs entirely through Van Buren Township and doesn't actually pass through the City of Belleville at all. Yet it continues to carry a name that doesn't reflect the community it serves. I believe it's time for the township to consider renaming it to Van Buren Parkway.  
 A name like Van Buren Parkway would better represent our identity, support future development, and give our community the recognition it deserves. It's a small change that could have a big positive impact on how residents and visitors alike view the township.

I hope township leadership will give this idea serious consideration.

# City to consider raising water rates to facilitate fixing the old system

At Monday's regular meeting of the Belleville City Council, a representative of Waterworth gave a lengthy zoom presentation on how his company could assist the city in getting the funds it needs to replace the aging water infrastructure.

He was invited by the city to give a proposal on what his company could do.

His eight-year study would have the system details plugged into a software program to determine when the money is needed so the council will know when to raise the rates.

He presented graphs that showed to replace \$5 million of water mains would take about 24% raise in water rates, but that would be a shock all at once. He said the chart shows the city would be in trouble in 2029. Rates could be raised in small amounts, such as 2% and 2%, then 7% and 5% and 5% and 3% over the years.

A representative of Plante Moran was scheduled to give a presentation in person, but did not come to the meeting, so discussion was postponed on the ten-year study.

Interim city manager Steve Jones said Plante Moran would propose a flat fee for a one-year study, while the Waterworth proposal calls for yearly fees.

In other business at the one-hour-and-20-minute meeting, the council:

- Heard Public Safety Director Kris Faull read a Letter of Commendation for Hazel Worden, who could not be present at the meeting. The nine-year-old resident was commended for bravery during a medical emergency involving her father, Jason Worden. She unlocked her father's cell phone and called 911 for help and carefully followed instructions and provided assistance until emergency personnel arrived on scene. Director Faull said the girl basically saved her father's life. The letter will be framed and presented to Hazel at her home;

- Approved a 2-3 p.m. March 21 wedding at the Victory Park pavilion for Kevin and Loni Holmes, with about ten people expected to attend;

- Approved changing the official election day polling location and early voting site from the former St. Anthony Catholic Church building to the new city hall location at 330 Charles St.;

- Held the first reading of an adoption of the updated fire code to make sure the city is current;

- Set up a timeline for approval of the new 2026-27 city budget. The council members were divided up to meet with administrators of the three areas: DPW, fire/police, and administration. The presentation of the budget will be May 4, a public hearing June 1, and a special meeting June 26 at 6:30 p.m. This will get the budget all wrapped up by the end of June and it will take effect July 1, Mayor Ken Voigt said;

- Approved a five-year contract with HydroCorp for commercial cross-connections, required by the state;

- Approved a BORA DORA social district permit for Krasniai R. Co. LLC doing business as Belleville Bait Shop.

for many years, chose not to run for reelection last fall and was replaced. When one of the board members died, Juriga was brought back on the board to temporarily serve until the end of the year.

When approving the accounts payable, Juriga also commented on the \$6,375 cost and snow removal by DC, the library vendor. He was reminded that this was an unusual winter.

During discussion of the lawn care

agreement, board president Sharon Peters said they did not expect city hall to be where it is now when the parking lot was being built. Now, she thinks the city should at least take responsibility for sealing cracks in the parking lot because part of the parking lot belongs to them.

Director Suchy said a piece of the grass at the end of the lot may belong to the city.

Peters said she would sit down and talk with them about it.

She recalled when the former library was being replaced, the site chosen was a city-owned parking lot. She said there were

negotiations and the city and the library agreed to have joint responsibility for the new parking lot.

“It’s appropriate and worth discussion with the city,” she said.

Juriga said the EV charging stations at the end of the parking lot by the new city hall have been hooked up for a long time. He said the interim city manager told him that DTE has been dragging its feet by not powering them up. He said the city got them installed and will be getting some income from them.

In other business at the one-hour-22-

minute meeting, the board:

- Heard a report from Michele Montour, the non-board member chairwoman of the Art Committee. She also is curator of the library’s gallery. She said she invited herself to be on the Belleville/Van Buren art sculpture committee and they met earlier that day to choose the art which will be installed in May. She gave board members a printout of the planned exhibits for 2026, 2027, and 2028, with four exhibits per year for three months each;

- Heard Suchy report that Standard and Poors Global Ratings conducted a review of the library regarding general obligation debt. S&P upgraded the library’s rating from A+ to AA- based upon its surpluses, reserves, and stable outlook. The board applauded. Suchy said if they ever decide to go out to borrow this would be helpful;

- Heard Peters report that it has been at least 20 years since the Friends of the Library have raised the prices of the used books they sell and they are planning to implement a new price schedule soon;

- Heard Suchy report on upcoming events at the library and showed pictures of the recent stuffy sleepover and pajama storytime. She said the children came in their pajamas and brought along a stuffed toy that they left at the library overnight and the children went home. The toys were in brown bags, which were their sleeping bags. In the morning they were able to pick up their toys and see the pictures of the toys having fun overnight;

- Learned Suchy has notified Otis Elevator to terminate its maintenance contract effective June 1. She said she is securing maintenance quotes from two other elevator companies;

- Heard Suchy explain the three-month budget report in the absence of treasurer Tanya Stoudemire. Peters said, “We are good stewards of the dollar.” Then she went on, “Our treasurer is doing heavy lifting for the city of Detroit.” Later she explained that Stoudemire is CFO of Detroit, which is a big job. In her experience, she said, that position is often filled by people who are “all puffed up.” But Stoudemire brings a calming influence. She said she saw Stoudemire on television the night before this meeting and she was standing next to the mayor for a budget story. “We want everyone to know she is very special not only to Belleville, but to Detroit and the state, as well,” Peters said; and

- Heard board secretary Joy Cichewicz say she was mistaken when she previously said she lost all her bees to the harsh winter. She said she has bees that make it through the winter. She said it got warm and one of the hives came out. She said the hives are dependant on the queens and one of the hives didn’t survive.

The meeting started with a bare quorum with Dan Fleming, Tanya Stoudemire, and Joy Cichewicz absent. Cichewicz arrived 25 minutes late.

Mayor Voigt said the business changed ownership and will be seeking its liquor license through the Liquor Control Commission. The local approval of the social district permit is a part of the LCC license approval;

• Heard interim city manager Jones announce that the current city hall at Five Points will be closed April 9, 10, and 13 and reopen at its new location at 330 Charles St. on April 14. All the online services will stay in place. While the current city hall is closed, they will be moving from the current building to the new building and setting up. A sign will be put on the front door so people will know what is happening;

• Approved accounts payable including amounts in excess of \$500: \$8,127 to ETNA and \$3,614.03 to Core & Main, both for DPW for parts for the water system;

• Heard Jones report there were two water main breaks that day, both due to the North

Liberty Street construction. A third, that just happened, was not due to construction. Leaf pickup will continue from last fall's leaf pickup which was interrupted, he said;

• Heard mayor Voigt say compost in bags will be picked up beginning April 1;

• Heard councilman Randy Priest say he is frustrated that the county hasn't done anything about the flooded sidewalks at 123 E. Columbia Ave. and 259 E. Huron River Dr. The sidewalks are lower than the county drain causing draining problems. He has been trying to get this fixed for ten years, he said;

### City of Belleville PUBLIC NOTICE SPRING LEAF PICKUP SCHEDULE



The City of Belleville Department of Public Works will conduct a special citywide leaf pickup beginning March 30, 2026, and continuing through April 10, 2026.

Due to equipment failure during the fall season, some leaf pickup was unable to be completed at that time.

To address this, crews will make one final pass through the entire city over this two-week period. Once this collection period concludes, the city will consider the 2025 fall leaf pickup program complete.

Residents are asked to follow the same placement guidelines as in previous seasons. Leaves should be placed as close to the curb as possible, but not in the gutter line. Keeping leaves out of the gutter allows proper drainage and helps our equipment collect materials more efficiently.

Because leaves remained on some lawns over the winter, there may be areas where grass has been affected. If damage occurs, city staff will return at a later date to apply topsoil and grass seed as needed to help restore affected lawns.

The City of Belleville appreciates residents' patience and cooperation as we complete this final collection effort.

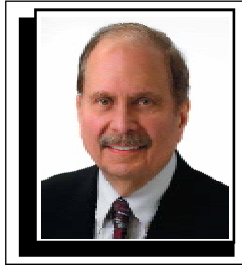

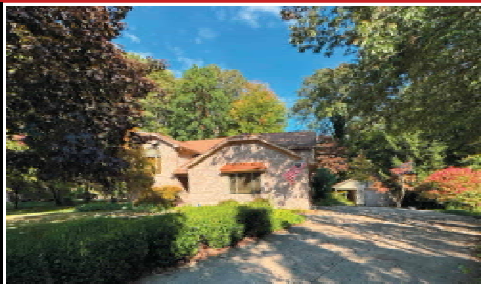
