Council allocates \$2,500 to start work on deteriorating seawall

After a discussion on the precarious condition of the 200' of city seawall at Doane's Landing, the Belleville City Council allocated up to \$2,500 to get topographic work done to take the first steps towards a solution.

DPW Director Rick Rutherford said his crew has been checking on the deteriorating seawall daily. He said this topographic study by Hennessey Engineers and McDowell Associates is the first step for him in getting engineering specifications

He said they need elevations shot and surveying completed to find how far the seawall has separated.

Rutherford said this 19-year-old seawall should have had a 50-year life.

"It is deteriorating almost daily," said City Manager Diana Kollmeyer.

Mayor Kerreen Conley asked for a timeline and Rutherford said the time involved is for him to go back and forth between the engineers and the council. He is following the spending guidelines laid out by the city, he said.

"The longer we wait, the more expensive it gets," Mayor Conley said.

City Manager Kollmeyer said she hopes to bring back information for the first meeting in May.

"We're looking at it as an emergency," Kollmeyer said. "We're concerned for the city's seawall, as well as the condo next

Rutherford said the condo association has had its engineer look at it. He said the 200' of seawall on the city side is not all in

"We might be able to save it without doing the entire 200'," Rutherford said, adding they have to figure out how much it's pulling apart, but it is progressing daily or weekly.

Kollmeyer said they have already checked and federal Community Development Block Grant funds can't be used for a seawall, but it's possible some CDBG funds could be used for the parts of the park that are ADA-accessible.

"Soon, that seawall will be floating down Belleville Lake," Kollmeyer said.

The seawall had been added to the agenda at the beginning of the meeting and further discussion was delayed until Rutherford could go into his office and review information that had come in after he had left for the day.

Rutherford returned to the meeting room and distributed copies of the email he received from the engineers that discussed shooting the benchmark and the seawall, with one or two people monitoring. He said he thought the city could do some monitoring in-house.

"We have to start documenting how fast this thing is going and start getting bids to do the work," Rutherford said.

He said a representative from the condo association has been coming in daily to see him and now is the time for them to sign on and get real figures.

The engineers gave a cost of \$2,450 for a couple of site visits.

"It is important to get the work done," Mayor Conley said.

"I could suggest bi-weekly monitoring by them, since my crew is down there daily," Rutherford said.

"Once the survey is done we'll get an estimate," Conley said.

"The last thing we want is to do repairs that won't be permanent," he said.

"This is the very first step we had to take," Rutherford said, noting he has soil borings that were done a year ago. He said after the topographic work is done, the engineers can estimate the cost.

After the motion passed to allocate up to (continued on page 8)



Distinguished graduates to be honored

Myra MacPherson **BHS Class of 1952**

Myra MacPherson, Class of 1952, is a journalist known for her books and articles about politics, the Vietnam War, feminism, and death and dying.


Myra's passion for research and writing began at Belleville High School. While working on the school's student newspaper, in the summer between her sophomore and junior year, she received a scholarship to a two-week journalism workshop at Michigan State University. That experience gave her the courage to pursue a career that, at the time, was dominated by men. In her senior year at BHS Myra was the Tiger Tribune's Editor-in-Chief and she wrote a column for the local newspaper.

While attending Michigan State, Myra was on the daily newspaper staff and the yearbook. Following graduation, Myra started her career in journalism at the Detroit Free Press and Detroit Times, and then moved to Washington, D.C. to work for the Washington Star and the New York Times newspapers. While at the Star, she covered the funeral of President John F Kennedy and the rising of the Berlin Wall. In 1969, she moved to the Washington Post and remained there until 1991.

While working at the Washington Post, Myra was significantly involved with nationally noted Washington Post reporters Carl Bernstein and Bob Woodward in reporting President Nixon's Watergate

scandal. Myra's contribution was in depth profiling and writing of the Watergate criminals by fleshing

out the "who they were" behind the main story.

books. In 1975, Myra was a Rutgers Fellow while researching her first book, "The Power Lovers", and later was a recipient of a Fulbright Grant. She was nominated for the Pulitzer Award for her 1984 book "Long Time Passing: Vietnam and the Haunted Generation", now considered a classic on Vietnam. Her other books are "She Came to Live Out Loud" (1999); "All Governments Lie" (2006); and her most recent "The Scarlet Sisters: Sex Suffrage and Scandal in the Gilded Age" (2014) which has just been optioned for a mini-

Myra's career as a reporter has encompassed a number of "firsts." Starting in 1969, she was assigned to cover the Mets when they won the World Series, even though she could not get in the press box because of her gender. In 1972, while at the Washington Post, Myra was one of the first women to cover presidential campaigns, continuing to cover them through 1988. During her tenure as a reporter, Myra profiled many famous politicians and world leaders including Cuba's Castro, and every president from John F. Kennedy through George W. Bush.

Myra has been on the Board of the Hospice Foundation of America and is a member of Veterans for Peace. Myra's professional and personal contributions clearly make her a Distinguished Graduate of Belleville High School.

She was nominated by Vitold E. Dewicki, Class of 1952.

Bernard Hovey BHS Class of 1965

Bernard Hovey graduated from Belleville High School in 1965. He was president of the National Honor Society, vice-president of his class, vice-president of the student council, a member of the German Club, JETS Club, and United Nations Club. He performed in both the junior class play and senior class play. Academically, Bernie finished in the top ten in his class.

Bernie graduated from the University of Michigan where he majored in economics and minored in math and history. He received a M.Ed. from Cleveland State University. He earned his teaching certificate from Cleveland State in 1969. He also took graduate courses at Ohio State University, Ohio University, Kent State University, and Ashland University.

Bernie was a speaker at Ohio Teachers of Math conventions, gave content lectures to teachers from many schools, and was a motivational speaker at high school student leadership conferences.

Bernie served as a teacher for 45 years (6 in Cleveland, 32 in Kent, 7 at Archbishop Hoban High School) including two as an assistant athletic director. He also coached football and hockey. His 1982 hockey team won the state championship. He continues to be involved in administration of district hockey tournaments.

Bernie has long been a community leader. He was councilman in Silver Lake, Ohio, for six years and since 2006 has served as mayor. He has served on many boards (Crystal Lake Development Park, Summit County Juvenile Court, Akron Touchdown Club, the Mayors Association, and others). He was instrumental in setting up a scholarship for hockey players at Roosevelt High School in Kent.

Bernie has been married to Kathleen for 37 years; they have three children and five grandchildren.

Jill Devers **BHS Class of 1982**

Jill Devers is the youngest child of Wendell and Hattie Mae Devers to graduate from Belleville High School. Devers' brother Darnell and sister Wondella both graduated in 1969. Jill really enjoyed high school. It was a great time to develop life-long friendships. Throughout high school, Jill participated in a number of activities. She was co-captain of the cheerleading squad (junior year), president of the Chocolate Sensations of '82 (African-American Senior Club), coordinated a Black History Month fashion show, participated (briefly) in Junior Achievement (looked good on her college application) and traveled to Paris, France with the French class.

Jill continued her education at Michigan State University where she received her bachelor of arts degree in International Relations in 1986. After MSU Jill returned back home to Chicago, IL. It wasn't until her mother's death in 1998 that she started to focus on philanthropic activities. Devers volunteered with a number of not-for-profit organizations, including Make-A-Wish and Jobs for Youth. While pursuing her Master of Arts degree in Sports Marketing and Public Relations at Northwestern University, Jill completed her graduate Community Relations internship with the Chicago Bulls.

From 2004-2014 Jill served on the National Board of Michigan State University's Black Alumni. When she re-activated the local Chicago Chapter, she launched a voter registration drive and toy/clothing drives for underprivileged children. In 2015, she launched a "Spartans Will" campaign with Covenant house of Michigan.

After several career paths, Jill finally landed her dream job at Michigan State University. She is the Assistant Director of Alumni and Donor Relations. It is her mantra of "To whom much is given, much is expected" that keeps her grounded and

Posthumous Recognition William (Bill) James Budd **BHS Class of 1960**

William (Bill) James Budd was born on Oct. 17, 1942 to Jack and Gladys Budd of Belleville. He was second of three children,

all of whom graduated from Belleville High School. Bill graduated from BHS in 1960 and went on to graduate from Michigan State University in 1962. He married Sharry Hawkes of New Boston in 1964. They were married for



52 years and raised three sons, all graduates of BHS: Jim, '84; Jeff, '87; and Jay, '94.

Growing up, Bill worked alongside his family raising registered Holstein cows. The Budd dairy herd set numerous milking records, including four world records. The Budd Holsteins appeared on the cover of the prestigious World magazine, which highlights the milking industry, a total of seven time. Bill and his family, through its herd, were instrumental in improving not only the Michigan Dairy industry, but the national dairy industry, as well.

As the Detroit area population grew, the I-94 expressway was expanded, which split the family farm in two. Although the Budds did not want to leave the family farm, they sold off their dairy business in 1972 and formed JR Budd, Inc., a construction company. The company concentrated on site excavation, but also built roads, houses, and performed various other construction activities.

Even while running the excavation company, the Budd family continued to farm, raising field crops and their signature white sweet corn. They also began raising Standardbred harness racing horses. Over the years, they achieved various degrees of success with breeding and training the horses on the family farm. Bill received his horse trainer's license and also trained as a blacksmith.

Eventually, the family reinvented itself again and started Budd's Produce. Together with his brother Tom (BHS 1964), sons, grandchildren, and many friends, they built a thriving fruit and vegetable stand that continues to this day, specializing in their

McBride Road to be paved in VBT

At last, parents of McBride Middle School students won't have to drive over a muddy, rutted road to get to their students' school.

At Tuesday's meeting of the Van Buren Township Board of Trustees a unanimous vote set the McBride Road paving project on its way.

The Van Buren Public Schools district had already approved paying \$90,000 as its part of the project and a petition drive got 63% of those owning frontage to sign up for a special assessment district. This will cost property owners an estimated \$578.22 a year each for five years.

The Wayne County Local Township Roads Initiative will pick up the biggest share of the cost: \$750,000. But, the project has to be under way this construction season – so the township is on a very tight scheduled to set up the SAD, get updated specifications, go out for bids, and get to digging.

The actual work probably can't be started before September, but there's a back entrance to the school that can be used by buses and cars until the new road is ready.

Special thanks for this project goes to McBride residents Daniel and Ashley Clay and Bonnie Coughlin who went door to door with SAD petitions to get them signed. And, to Supervisor McNamara's assistant Dan Selman who went back out to knock on those doors needed for more signers. McBride should be beautiful by Thanksgiving! Now we'll have to deal with speeders on a smooth straightaway.

EXTRA THINGS I KNOW

Van Buren Township police were searching for someone in the Metropark at about 1:50 a.m. on Sunday, April 9. The person had fled into the woods. They got him in custody, but on the police/fire scanner, the officer said, "I don't know how we'll get him over the fence at Haggerty Road."

They were trying to get someone from HCMA to open the gate, but said they kept getting an answering machine. I think they got him out because there's a shiny, newlooking lock on the gate.

Lt. Charles Bazzy said the Huron River Drive / Haggerty Road incident concerned LSPDA/OWI (leaving the scene of a property damage accident and operating while intoxicated).

Robin Luce Hermann, an attorney at Butzel Long and consultant to the Michigan Press Association, often presents programs on Open Government and recently she did one at the *Petoskey News Review*. In the March edition of the MPA newsletter, Hermann shared some of the pointers for governmental units she presented in Petoskey. We found especially interesting this one on public comment at public meetings.

"Provide Ample Time for Public Comment at Public Meetings: If necessary, extend meetings to allow public comment, rather than imposing very short times for people to comment. Encourage and provide mechanisms for persons to speak on behalf of a group. Don't 'stack' the agenda so that public comments come after the public body has already voted (another big area of frustration for citizens)."

This "stacking" of the agenda is what has been a problem for the public in Van Buren Township meetings and although several citizens regularly call out the board on this procedure, they turn their heads away. It really doesn't make sense for people to have to comment on agenda items *before* the items are discussed by the board. How would one know what to ask about before the information is presented? Doesn't make sense and it sure doesn't give a feeling of transparency.

The Van Buren Public Schools Board of Education also stacks their agenda to require comments on the agenda items *before* they are discussed by the board. But, lately, the board president has been quite lenient about comments from the audience whenever they feel like it.

Also, the VBT and VBPS boards are using electronic tablets at public meetings. Hermann said use of these devices at the meetings can create the misimpression that the officials are improperly communicating during open meetings.

She said the governmental body should make it clear that officials are only accessing materials and/or taking notes and that there is a policy that forbids electronic communications (except for personal emergencies) during an open meeting. She said if there is a violation of the policy, the public body should take appropriate action and let the public know it did so.

At last week's Belleville Planning Commission meeting, Councilman Tom Fielder also cautioned the commissioners about use of electronic communications among themselves concerning decisions to be made. He said their communications

could be the subject of a Freedom of

Information Act request.

At the Belleville Planning Commission meeting last week, chairman Steve Jones saidthe number of people who live in Harbour Club Apartments in Van Buren Township is more

than the total number of people who live in the City of Belleville.

A reader sent us an email saying Van Buren Township was trying to change or did change the way of stopping at red lights at the Ecorse Road exit from southbound I-275 to make it legal to turn on red.

"But people will do a quick roll stop and the cops are going to write them up and the prosecutor is going to scare them out of 200-plus dollars. It's wrong -- they even changed the lights for it. That being crooked, I was the first to beat the court with the honesty of Judge Green...That sucks for them to get away with this."

Van Buren Township doesn't have jurisdiction over any roads, so it didn't do anything there. I believe MDOT has jurisdiction over the interstates.

These figures reflect TOTAL compensation for the year of 2016.

Something in the letter made me laugh out loud. It states the Sumpter Township board members only work four hours a month?

Where do you get your information? Some board meeting nights, the officials are in the township hall longer than that. The four hours a month may be all YOU see (while dropping off or picking up your F.O.I.A. requests) but for your information, Sumpter Township Supervisor John W. Morgan is in his office every workday, Monday-Friday, the same goes for Clerk Clarence Hoffman and Treasurer Peggy Morgan.

Besides their office time, all board members are liaison to one or more departments or commissions, such as Police Department, Fire Department, Water & Sewer Department, Building Department, Ordinance, Planning Commission, Senior Citizen Center, Library Commission. Zoning Board of Appeals, and Parks and Recreation Commission. \$2,500 for the preliminary work, Kollmeyer said she would bring a budget amendment for this cost.

The council also will be looking into where the money would come for the expensive repairs.

At the end of the discussion, Councilman Jesse Marcotte said he'd like the city to be known as Downtown on the Lake, instead of Downtown *in* the Lake.

The park at Doane's Landing, at the corner of North Liberty and Main Street, has been closed off with yellow caution tape for more than a year, with no work done thus far to remedy the situation.

There is a loss of soil threatening the rear porch of the condo next door to the park. The condo association reportedly has offered a sum of money to the city to help with the repairs.

At a city meeting in March, Rutherford said proper engineering was not done on the present seawall and it would not be good to repair what is there because it isn't engineered right.

In other business at Monday's meeting, the council:

- Approved a street closing for the annual Memorial Day ceremony on High Street at 2 p.m. May 29. Cornell Anton, of the local VFW, said since Kathy Steigerwald left Brown Funeral Home, sponsor of the event, the VFW is now planning the speakers. Anton and Councilman Tom Fielder will be giving biographies of two fallen soldiers named on the Veterans Memorial. Also, there will be no motorcyclists this year, he said:
- Approved the four-year appointment of Nathaniel Oregon to the Parks and Recreation Committee. Oregon is the pastor for the Seventh Day Adventist Church in Belleville:
- Approved a schedule of budget meetings, beginning with 6 p.m. Monday, May 8,

and ending with adoption of the 2017-18 budget on Monday, June 5;

- Was introduced to new city employees: Karen Tyler, who replaced Marilyn in the front office; full-time Police Officer Sarah Dzagulones; and part-time Police Officer Ahmed Kassem;
- Applauded the Life Saving Award presented to Officer Dzagulones by Police Chief Hal Berriman. She is credited with saving the life of a Harbour Pointe subdivision man around midnight on March 10. The man was in full cardiac arrest with skin a blueish-grey color when she began cardio-pulmonary resuscitation and brought him back to life;
- Approved accounts payable of \$104,734.64 and the following departmental expenditures in excess of \$500: To Northline Twp. FD, \$2,866.50 for turnout gear replacement (10% grant match); to West Shore Fire, \$1,645 for fire turnout gear add-ons; to Washtenaw Area Mutual Aid Assn., \$1,000 for annual dues; and to Wise Technologies, \$698.74 for computer/network support, General Fund/Police;
- Heard Councilman Fielder announce a report he has just received said there are 300 marijuana dispensaries in Wayne

County, including five in Canton and three in Van Buren Township. Mayor Conley said, "This is not one of those items we're asking you to shop local on";

• Heard Jeff Vernon complain that he saw city workers out that day cleaning up after the Central Business Community's Flop E Bunny event on Saturday and the CBC sign was still up. 

Officer Dzagulones began cardio-pulmonary resuscitation immediately and Cpl. Todd Schrecengost helped her remove the large man to the floor for her continued CPR. Huron Valley Ambulance and fire fighters arrived and they agreed due to Officer Dzagulones' actions, she brought the man back to life and kept him breathing. Fire Chief Brian Loranger also praised the officer's work.


Devon Fischer inducted into The Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi
