# Belleville misstep sends council election into all write-ins

Last October, the Belleville City Council passed a resolution to change its council odd-year elections to even-year election so it doesn't have to pay for a stand-alone election.

The city was sent a sample ballot for the Nov. 4 election and was surprised to see the council election on this year's ballot.

"We did not follow the proper procedure," explained mayor Ken Voigt at the Sept. 2 council meeting. "We acted in good faith," he said, noting it was with advice from the former city attorney.

"We were supposed to have a public hearing and then a roll-call vote and then file it with the secretary of state and that didn't happen," he said.

The new city attorney, Nancy Olind, told the council that its action was void and if the council took the proper steps now, it wouldn't go into effect until 2026.

Olind said two candidates are up for reelection and they did not file because they didn't know the election would be this year.

Mayor Voigt said last October, "We passed a resolution to go with even years and we discovered the problem ourselves.

"Any that want to run have to run as write-ins," he said.

Mayor Voigt said if you want to know who is to blame, "Just do the math."

According to the Oct. 10, 2024 Independent editorial, this is what happened: "City Manager Jason Smith said at the Michigan Municipal League conference Mayor Voigt spoke to Mayor Colestock of Eaton Rapids about odd-year elections. Mayor Colestock said they had changed their election years by resolution rather than by a ballot question. She sent information to Belleville and they adapted it for our city.

"Smith said the city attorney looked it over and said Belleville could make this change in a similar fashion and the attorney general said she preferred votes of the people, but a resolution would work. The council voted unanimously to change the terms of councilpersons Beebe and Kissel from expiring in 2025 to expiring in 2026. The terms of Mayor Voigt, Mayor Pro Tem Bates, and councilman Priest, which expired in 2027, will now expire in 2028.

"City clerk/treasurer Briana Hootman said this change will save the city \$5,000 in costs for the odd-year city election which has nothing else on the ballot and brings only about a 5% turnout. Mayor Voigt said this should have been done years ago."

At the end of the Sept. 2 meeting, under council comments, councilwoman Julie Kissel said she would run as a write-in for her seat. She said the other councilperson whose term was expiring was Jeremiah Beebe and she didn't know his intentions. He was absent from the meeting.

In other business at the Sept. 2 meeting, the council:

- Presented a proclamation naming Sept. 2 as Chief Kristin Faull Day in the city of Belleville in recognition of her 25 years of police service. She was hired on July 25, 2000, served many years as a school resource officer, became a sergeant in 2022, and was named police chief in 2023;
- Heard Chief Faull explain a new, sevenpage personal-appearance policy for police officers and reserves. She said, "It used to be whatever the chief said you could do," but she reached out to Van Buren Township police to review its policy and put together a policy for the city. She said officers have been asking about beards and tattoos. She said the former chief, Dave Robinson, was anti-facial hair and tattoos. She said the attorney approved the policy;
- Approved spending of not to exceed \$7,900 to get 20 fully assembled, red, metal lockers for the fire department from Fire Store, which was not the lowest of three quotes, but was the one recommend

by Chief Faull as having a history of being exceptional to work with. The sales tax of \$720.92 will be removed so the price will actually be that much lower. The current lockers at the fire station are wooden and they have become moldy and rundown. The fire consultants advised in their findings that these lockers needed to be replaced;

- Approved accounts payable of \$900,501.10, which included \$205,075 to Davenport Brothers Construction for construction work at 330 Charles St., the location of the new city hall;
- Tabled a proposal to make current bimonthly water/trash billing a monthly billing. Mayor Voigt said the city went to bi-monthly during COVID, but he thinks monthly is better for those having tight budgets. Mayor-pro-tem Kelly Bates wanted information on how much more it would cost to send the bills monthly and that information was not available;
- Tabled a proposal to raise trash collection rates because the mayor wanted figures which were not available;

- Heard Chief Faull report that Jeff Gueli, who has served as an ordinance officer as well as a police officer, is going to retire on Sept. 23. She said he has issued multiple citations that he is working to clear out before he leaves. "We'll find someone to take up the slack," Chief Faull said;
- Heard interim city manager Steve Jones report that a fence was up and now down at Horizon Park and the geese came back. He said they have moved to the dock which has had to be cleaned up. He said the geese are more prevalent this year and it might be because someone is feeding them. He also reported that the paving of the rest of High Street is scheduled for the week of Sept. 15 and it will take two days to complete;
- Heard councilman Randy Priest say there is no safe way for walkers to get to Village Park. He also said he is not looking forward to winter because residents do not keep the ice and snow off their sidewalks. He said he has been working on the safety of sidewalks for 10 years. He gave the

addresses of several dead trees hanging over the sidewalks and some water holes that remain in the walkways long after rains pass because of poor drainage;

- Heard councilwoman Kissel say she is waiting on the budget updates and all the cabinets upstairs have been emptied in preparation for the move of city hall. She said old files with the names of residents and what they paid have been preserved as historical documents;
- Heard mayor Voigt say he and others had a meeting with EGLE (Michigan Dept. of Environment, Great Lakes and Energy) about the landfill and he urged everyone to attend the Sept. 18 public hearing with EGLE at Wayne County Community College. He also reported he will attend the Michigan Municipal League conference in Grand Rapids and that the Council of Western Wayne (CWW) will hold its Sept. 5, 2026 meeting in the new city hall; and
- Heard the mayor ask for prayers for Alex Donley, son of community activist Chris Donley. Alex was in a serious accident on Aug. 29 and is in a hospital in Detroit. He is in serious condition. He is in intensive care and another surgery was set for Sept. 4. Chris is living at the hospital, Voigt said.

## Van Buren township approved Salem Township sewer line

The Van Buren board met on Sept. 2 and approved Salem Township to construct and maintain a sewer line within the public right of way through Van Buen Township to connect to the treatment plant of the Ypsilanti Community Utilities Authority (YUCA) in Ypsilanti, Michigan.

"We are close to capacity," said supervisor Kevin Macnamara about the current sewer line. "Sooner or later we need more capacity."

The running of the Salem Township line helps with Van Buren capacity problem. Van Buren can run a parallel line along the

Salem line, or they can tap into Salem's line and make the line larger at Van Buren's expense. Van Buren is looking into both solutions and will see which one is more cost effective.

"(Salem) is willing to work with us. And they're very thankful that we're doing this." Said McNamara.

In other business at the 47-minute meeting on Sept. 2, the board:

 Approved adoption of an illicit discharge prohibition policy on township properties. Anybody who builds in the township has to have a discharge system. This adoption is just to sign-off on the discharge system the Township properties have;

- · Heard Jason Locke, director of Van Buren Parks, inform the board about the second annual Paddle in the Park. This event will take place at French Landing 11a.m.- 2.m. on Saturday, Sept. 13. Free fun for all ages. There will be kayak test drives (for those 18 and older), yard games, giveaways, and Kona Ice.;
- · Heard Matt Gilbert from Simplyfuel Solutions present a new system for tracking fuel use on township vehicles. He said the system currently in place was "ancient" and not accounting for all the fuel the township uses.

## VBPS spends \$64,416 on Teach Town for special ed

The Van Buren Public Schools Board met on Sept 8 and heard Superintendent Pete Kudlak say that the first week of school went smoothly.

"The teachers getting their class rooms ready," said Kudlak, "the administrators getting the building ready with the class lists and all the supports, the special ed team getting everything ready for those kids on day one, bus drivers getting their routes, custodial making the buildings look wonderful, everyone pulling together doing their role and doing it well, it's

amazing how it all comes together." The board agreed.

They also heard Reg Ion say that he has been waiting four years to get a signed copy of the refreshment machines contract. He said his son had some trouble over them and he only received an unsigned copy of the contract. President Amy Pierce sad that she would get it to him.

Other items on the agenda of the 40-minute meeting included:

· Hearing from Julien Frazier, director of student services, explaining what Teach Town was. Teach Town is a company with a focus on serving the needs of four distinct student groups: students with autism, students with developmental delays,

students with intellectual disabilities, and students with social and emotional disorders. Fifty-five students, K-12, qualify for this program in the district. The cost of the program for three years is \$64,416. Motion to spend the funds on Teach Town

· Deciding to put on the agenda for next meeting choosing who on the board would go to the Michigan Association of School Boards (MASB)

and she quickly took over our living space. I'm here to tell you that when you get a new cat you don't so much train it as acclimate to it.


Don't worry, she hasn't taken the place of Simba. No cat loved me as much as Simba

## Congratulations on our 'round-one' victory

To the Honorable Members of the Van Buren Charter Township Board and our fellow Plaintiffs:

Canton Charter Township, City of Romulus, City of Belleville, the Van Buren Township Fire Chief, and Wayne County,

I am writing to extend my sincerest congratulations on our decisive victory in the "round one" battle against Wayne Disposal, Inc. The preliminary injunction issued by Judge Kevin J. Cox on Aug. 5, 2025, is a testament to the hard work, dedication, and collaborative spirit that has defined our legal action.

The court's opinion validates our core arguments, acknowledging the very real and irreparable harm posed to our communities and the environment. It is particularly encouraging that the court recognized the significant risks to public health and safety, citing expert testimony that highlighted the dangers of radioactive materials and the unique vulnerability of our area due to its high population density and proximity to schools. This injunction is a direct result of our collective effort, from the expert testimony of Dr. Kimberlee J. Kearfott and Dr. Abdul El-Sayed to the tireless work of our legal team, Brandon Grysko and Stephen Brown.

Key findings from the court's order reaffirm the necessity of our fight:

- The court found that we are likely to succeed on the merits of our claims.
- The absence of adequate emergency response training and equipment for our first responders to handle a radioactive materials incident.
- It was determined that allowing radioactive waste from the Niagara Falls Storage Site (NFSS) to be accepted would cause irreparable harm to our environment and public health.
- The judge explicitly noted the unacceptable risks to the 30,000 residents and eight schools within a three-mile radius of the landfill.
- The court agreed that there are feasible and safer alternative disposal sites for this waste, and that our local waterways, including Belleville Lake and the Huron River, are at risk of contamination.

including the confirmed cancer cluster near the NFSS and the danger of cumulative radiation exposure.

• The fact that Wayne Disposal and its partners failed to consider the higher population density and proximity to schools when selecting the WDI facility.





## **Michigan State Police** investigate Monday's shooting on I-94 in VBT

The Michigan State Police is investigating a shooting that happened at about 6 p.m. Monday on I-94 near Haggerty Road in Van Buren Township.

MSP said the Detroit Regional Communication Center received a report about a shooting on the eastbound freeway in Van Buren Township. Responding troopers located a vehicle in the area with a single bullet hole.

A preliminary investigation revealed a woman was driving in the center lane of the freeway when a black car pulled up on her left side. The woman reported that the driver, a black man with curly hair and wearing a hat, pointed a gun at her and fired a shot.

MSP said the bullet hit the woman's driver's side door. Troopers were able to recover the bullet from inside the car. No injuries were reported.

The freeway was temporarily shut down at Belleville Road. MSP 1st Lieutenant Mike Shaw said troopers at the scene were investigating the motive and asked anyone who witnessed the incident to call 854-MICH
